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
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# 1 Basics

# 1.1 Device overview





#### **Back button**

• Touch to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, options menu, the notification panel, etc.

### **Home button**

- From any application or screen, touch to return to the Home screen.
- Touch and hold to turn on Google Assistant. You can get help such as getting directions and restaurant information based on the content detected on the screen.

#### Recent apps

Touch to view applications you've recently accessed

#### Power key

- Press: Lock the screen/Light up the screen.
- Press and hold: Show the popup menu to select from Power off/Restart/Aeroplane mode/Cast.
- Press and hold the Power key and Volume down key to take a screenshot.
- Press and hold the **Power** key for at least 10 seconds to force reboot.
- Double-press the Power key to open the camera.

### **Volume Keys**


- Adjusts the earpiece or headset volume during a phone call.
- Adjusts the media volume for streaming, listening, and viewing on media apps.
- Mutes the ringtone of an incoming call.
- While using the camera, press the **Volume up** or **Down** key to take a photo or press and hold to take burst shots.

# 1.2 Getting started

# **Setting up**

## Inserting or removing the SIM/microSD card

- Insert the provided SIM pin into the hole.
- Pull out the SIM tray.
- Objective SIM card or microSD card into the tray slot and carefully close the SIM tray.




You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. You do not need to power off your phone before inserting or removing the SIM card as this phone supports hot swap.



Your phone only supports nano-SIM cards. Do not attempt to insert other SIM types; otherwise this may cause damage to your phone.

#### Charging the battery



You are advised to fully charge the battery ( ). Charging status is indicated by a percentage displayed on screen while the phone is powered off. The percentage increases as the phone is charged.



To reduce power consumption and energy waste when the battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

# Powering on your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the phone powers on, unlock your phone (Swipe, PIN, Password, Pattern, etc. if necessary and confirm. The Home screen is displayed.

If you do not know your PIN code or forget it, contact your network operator. Be sure to keep your PIN code secure.

# Powering off your phone

Press and hold the **Power** key until options appear, then select **Power** off.

### 1.3 Home screen

You can bring all the items (applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets) you love or use most frequently to your Home screen for quick access. Touch the **Home** button to switch to the Home screen.



#### Status bar

- Status/Notification indicators
- Touch and drag down to open the notification panel

#### Search bar

- Touch to enter text search screen
- Touch 2 to enter voice search screen

Touch an icon to open an application, folder, etc.

#### **Favourite tray applications**

- Touch to enter the application.
- Touch and hold to move or remove applications.

The Home screen is provided in an extended format to allow more space for adding applications, shortcuts etc. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view.

# Using the touchscreen



To access an application, touch it with your finger.

# Touch and hold 🦎



To enter the available options for an item, touch and hold the item. For example. Select a contact in Contacts and touch and hold it. An options list will then appear.



Place your finger on the screen to drag an object to another location.

# Slide/Swipe



Slide the screen to scroll up and down the applications, images, and web pages. You can slide the screen horizontally too.



Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it move quicker.

# Pinch/Spread



Place two fingers on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.

#### **Rotate**



Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways to have a better screen view.

#### Status bar

From the status bar, you can view both phone status and notification information.

Drag down the status bar to view notifications and drag again to enter the quick settings panel.

Touch and drag up to close it. When there are notifications, they can be accessed by touching them.

# **Notification panel**

When there are notifications, touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel to read more detailed information.




Touch to clear all event-based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain).

#### **Quick settings panel**

Touch and drag down from the top of the screen to open the Quick settings panel.

You can enable or disable functions or change modes by touching the icons.

Touch the **Edit** icon to customise your Quick settings panel.



# Lock/Unlock your screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock the screen with a pattern, PIN, password, fingerprint or face.


To create a screen unlock pattern, touch **Settings > Security & biometrics >** Screen lock, Fingerprint or Face unlock.

# To lock the phone screen

- If your phone remains inactive for a period of time, it will automatically lock the screen and enter sleep mode to save power. Go to Settings > Display > Sleep and select a screen timeout period.
- You can also manually lock the screen by pressing the **Power** key once.

#### To unlock the phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to light up the screen, swipe up and unlock the screen with the method you have set.



#### Enter a password to unlock the screen

Once the screen is turned on, swipe up from any position on the screen to display the password input panel. Then enter your lock screen password.

# Use pattern unlock

Draw the same pattern you have set to unlock the screen.

#### Use Face unlock

- From the app list, touch **Settings > Security & biometrics > Face unlock**. Before using the face key, you need to set a pattern/PIN/password.
- Hold your phone 20-50 cm from your face. Position your face in the square shown on the screen. For best results, we suggest that the face key is enrolled indoors and away from direct sunlight.
- Enable Face unlock when your screen turns on, otherwise you will have to swipe up on the screen first of all.

#### **Use Fingerprint unlock**

Touch the fingerprint sensor (Settings > Security & biometrics > Fingerprint) with an enrolled finger to unlock the screen.

# Personalising your Home screen

#### Add

You can touch and hold a folder, an application or a widget and drag the item to your preferred Home screen.

#### Reposition

Touch and hold an item and drag it to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favourite tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

#### Remove

Touch and hold the item and drag it up to the top of the  $\odot$  remove icon, and release after it turns red.

#### Create folders

To improve the organisation of shortcuts or applications on the Home screen and the Favourite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it and touch the folder's title bar to input the new name.

#### Wallpaper customisation

Touch and hold an empty area on the Home screen, then touch **Wallpaper & style** to customise wallpaper.

# Widgets and recently used applications

# **Consult widgets**

Touch and hold the empty area in the Home screen, then touch **Widgets** to display all widgets.

Touch the selected widget and slide it to move to your preferred screen.

#### Consult recently used applications

To consult recently used applications, touch the **Recent apps** button. Touch a thumbnail in the window to open the application.



Touch one thumbnail and slide it up to close the application, slide it right/left to switch between the applications.

Touch **CLEAR ALL** at the bottom of the screen to close all the running applications.

# Volume adjustment



Press the Volume key to adjust the Media volume.

Touch the 💙 icon to adjust Media, Ring, Alarm and Notification volume.

# 1.4 Text input

# **Using the Onscreen Keyboard**

#### **Onscreen Keyboard settings**

Touch **Settings > System > Language & input**, touch the Virtual keyboard you want to set up and a series of settings will become available.

#### Adjust the Onscreen Keyboard orientation

Turn the phone sideways or upright to adjust the onscreen keyboard orientation. You can adjust it by changing the settings (Touch on/off Settings > Display > Auto-rotate screen).

## Android keyboard

Enter numbers or select from contacts.

# **Text editing**

#### You can edit text which you have entered.

- Touch and hold or double touch within the text you want to edit.
- Drag the tabs to change the amount of text to edit.

# You can also insert new texts if preferred

- Touch where you want to type, or touch and hold a blank area. The cursor will blink and the tab will appear. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have cut or copied any text, touch the tab to show the **Paste** and **Select all** option which allows you to complete pasting immediately.

# 2 Multimedia applications

#### 2.1 Camera .....



Before using the camera, make sure that you remove the protective lens cover to avoid it affecting your picture quality.

#### **Launch Camera**

There are multiple ways to open the Camera app.

#### From the Home Screen

From the home screen, touch **Camera .** 




#### From the Lock Screen

When the screen is locked, press the Power key once to light up the screen, then swipe left on the camera icon in the lower right corner to open the camera.

### Using a shortcut key

Simply double-press the **Power** key to open the camera.

# To take a photo

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First, position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch the screen to focus if necessary. Touch to capture. The photo will be automatically saved. You can also touch and hold to take burst shots.

#### To take a video

Touch **VIDEO** to change the camera mode to video. Touch • to start video recording. Touch the left part of this icon • • • to take a picture during video recording.

Touch the right part of this icon to pause video recording and touch to continue. Touch to stop recording. The video will be automatically saved.

#### Further operations when viewing a photo/video you have taken

- Slide left or right to view the photos or videos you have taken.
- Touch , then Gmail/Bluetooth/MMS/etc. to share the photo or video.
- Touch **Back button <** to return to **Camera**.

<sup>(1)</sup> Your phone must also be connected to a network.

# Modes and settings

#### **Modes**

Slide left or right to switch between modes.

• AUTO: Auto is the default mode for Camera.

• VIDEO: Touch to access video mode.

• ONE SHOT: Touch to access one shot mode.

- **PORTRAIT:** Touch to create a depth of field effect. You can compose an image that highlights your subject while producing a gorgeously blurred background.
- **PRO:** Pro camera mode lets you fine-tune parameters and gives you full control over ISO, WB exposure time, aperture, shutter speed and so on.
- PANO: Touch to turn on the panorama function. Touch the shutter button to start taking a panoramic photo and move the phone steadily along in the direction indicated by the onscreen line. Once the slots are filled, the photo will be automatically saved. If the slots are not fully filled, touch the shutter button again to save the photo.
- MORE: By selecting , you can access more modes. These modes can be moved to the main screen by touching .

# **Settings**

Touch to set more options, some options may not be available depending on the shooting mode:

- **Photo size:** Touch to select photo size. Using a higher resolution will result in higher quality photos, but they will take up more memory.
- Video quality: Touch to select video progressive scan output and definition.
- Dark shot: This feature resolves the limitations of low light to give your photos sharper details and brighter colors.

- Quick snap: Set the device to take a photo by pressing the volume down key twice quickly when screen is off.
- Volume button function: Touch to customise the Volume button to either Shutter, Zoom or Volume when using camera.
- **Gesture to capture:** Touch to turn on/off. Once the palm gesture feature is activated, show your palm to the front camera and the device will automatically take a photo or video after few seconds.
- **Storage:** Touch to choose between phone and SD card storage when an SD card is inserted. The default is phone storage.
- Save location information: Turn on to tag photos and videos with your location. This option is available when the GPS location service is enabled.
- Shutter sound: Touch to turn on/off shutter sound when capturing.
- Watermark: Touch to turn on/off Watermark.
- Reset settings: Touch to reset the camera to its factory default settings.




3.1 Phone.....



# Making a call

To make a call, touch ( in the Favourites tray.





Enter the desired number from the dial pad and touch to place the call or select a contact from **Contacts** or **Call logs** by sliding or touching tabs, then make the call.

The number you entered can be saved to **Contacts** by touching **Create new contact** or **Add to a contact**.

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching X.

To hang up a call, touch ...

#### International call

To dial an international call, touch and hold of to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and touch of touch of touch of the full phone number and the full phone number and touch of the full phone number and to

#### **Emergency call**

If your phone has network coverage, dial the emergency number and touch to make an emergency call. Depending on your network and country this could even work without a SIM card and without typing in the SIM PIN code.

# Answering or rejecting a call





#### When you receive a call:

- Touch **ANSWER**, or swipe up the icon ( to answer;
- Touch **DECLINE**, or swipe down the icon ( to reject;
- Touch (Reply ) to reject the call by sending a preset message.


# Calling your voicemail

To access your voicemail, touch and hold  $\frac{1}{\infty}$ .

If you receive a voicemail, **o** appears on the Status bar. Open the Notification panel and touch **New voicemail**.

# **During a call**


To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume up/down key.



- End the current call.
- Touch to mute the current call. Touch this icon again to unmute the call.
- Display the dial pad.
- Touch to activate the speaker during the current call. Touch this icon again to deactivate the speaker.
- Make another call.
- Switch to video call.
- Put a call on hold.
- To avoid accidental operation of the touchscreen during a call, the screen will be locked automatically when you put the cellphone close to your ear; and it will be unlocked when the cellphone is taken away from your ear.

# Managing multiple calls

With this phone you can handle multiple calls at the same time.



### Swap calls

When you accept two calls, touch the  $\mathfrak{N}$  icon to switch between two lines. The current call will be put on hold and you are able to join the other call.

#### Conference calls(1)

You can set up a conference call as follows.

- Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Touch **C**<sup>+</sup> to add another call.
- Enter the phone number of the person you want to add to the conference and touch . You can also add participants from Call logs or Contacts.
- Touch  $\uparrow$  to start the conference.
- Touch \_\_\_ to end the conference call and disconnect all callers.

<sup>(1)</sup> Depending on your network operator.

# **Call settings**

Touch from the **Phone** screen, then touch **Settings** to set phone and contact settings.

# Call log

You can access your call logs by touching \( \bar{\cup} \) from the **Phone** screen to view missed calls, outgoing calls and incoming calls.

Touch one call to view information or further operations. You can launch a new call, send a message to the contact or number, or view detailed information of the call.

To delete the call history of a selected contact or number, touch and hold the contact and choose **Delete**.

# 3.2 Contacts.....




**Contacts** enables quick and easy access to the contact you want to reach.

You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronise these with your Gmail contacts or other applications on the web or on your phone.

# **Consult your Contacts**

To see your contacts, touch ( ) from the App drawer.





Deleted contacts will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronise your phone.

# Adding a contact

Touch + in the contact list to create a new contact.

You are required to enter the contact's name and other contact information. By scrolling up and down the screen, you can move from one field to another.



#### Add to/remove from Favourites (1)

To add a contact to favourites, you can enter **Phone** app > **Favourites** screen > **Add a favourite**.

To remove a contact from favourites, touch  $\bigstar$  on the contact details screen.


<sup>(1)</sup> Phone and Gmail contacts can be added to favourites.

# **Editing your contacts**

To edit contact information, touch // in the contact details screen. When finished, touch Save.

# Using the Quick contact panel

Touch a contact to open the Quick contact panel.



The icons available on the Quick contact panel depend on the information you have for the contact and the applications and accounts on your phone.

# **Sharing contacts**

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

- ullet From the Contacts screen, touch and hold a contact and touch  $<\!\!<$ .
- Select the application to perform this action.

#### **Accounts**

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronised from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your phone.

To add an account, touch from the contacts list and touch Add another account, or from the home screen, touch Settings > Accounts > Add account.

You are required to select the kind of account you are adding, like Google, etc.

As with any other account setup, you need to enter detailed information, like username, password, etc.

You can remove an account and all associated information from the phone. Touch the account you want to delete, touch **Remove account**, then confirm.

#### **Auto-sync**

On the **Accounts** screen, turn on **Automatically sync data** . When activated, all changes to information on the phone or online will be automatically synchronised with each other.

# 3.3 Messages ......



# Writing a new message

You can create, edit, send and receive SMS and MMS with this phone.

To access Messages, touch ( ) from the App drawer.

On the message list screen, touch started to write text/multimedia messages.



#### Sending a text message

- To add recipients, enter a mobile phone number or select a contact in the **To** bar.
- Touch the **Text message** bar to enter the text of the message.
- When finished, touch to send the text message.
- **\$**

Specific letters (accented) will also increase the size of the SMS. This may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

### Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations, slides and sounds to other compatible mobiles and e-mail addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, slides, etc.) are attached or subject or email addresses are added.

- To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number in the **To** bar.
- Write the text of the message in the **Text message** bar.
- Touch  $\oplus$  to give access to your location, share a contact or attach files.

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
- Touch to take a photo/video or attach a photo/video you have taken.
- When finished, touch be to send the multimedia message.

# Manage messages

When receiving a message, will appear on the Status bar as a notification. Drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel. Touch the new message to open and read it. You can also access the **Messages** application and touch the message to open it.

Messages are displayed as a conversation.

Touch a message to enter the message composing screen:



- Touch for more options
- Touch to search within a conversation
- Touch to call the number
- Touch to save the number to Contacts or view the contact details if the number has been saved

To adjust message settings, touch and select **Settings** on the message list screen.

# 3.4 Calendar.....



Use Calendar to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

To view the calendar and create events, open the Google apps folder from the Home screen, then touch **Calendar**.



### Multimode view

You can display the Calendar by **Schedule**, **Day**, **3 days**, **Week**, or **Month**, touch **to** select.

### To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.

- Touch +.
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can turn on **All-day** ...
- When finished, touch **Save** at the top of the screen.

To quickly create an event from the **Week** view screens, touch an empty spot to select a target area which will then turn into \_\_\_, then touch the icon to create the new event.

### To delete or edit an event

To delete or edit an event, touch the event to enter its details screen. Touch // to edit the event, or touch > **Delete** to delete.

### **Event reminder**

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon i will appear on the Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Touch and drag down the Status bar to open the notification panel, touch an event name to view the Calendar notification list. Touch the **Back** button to close and exit.

# 3.5 Clock



Your mobile phone has a built-in clock.

To view the current time, swipe up the Home screen, then touch Clock.



### **Alarm**

From the Clock screen, touch **Alarm** to enter.

- Turn on to enable the alarm.
- Touch + to add a new alarm, touch **OK** to save.
- Touch a currently existing alarm to enter the alarm editing screen.
- Touch iii to delete the selected alarm.

The previous applications in this section are preinstalled on your phone. To download and install more 3rd party applications, use the Google Play Store application.

# 3.8 Google applications

Google apps are preinstalled on your phone to improve work efficiency and help you enjoy life.

This manual briefly introduces the apps. For detailed features and user guides, refer to the related websites or the introduction provided in the apps.

You are recommended to register with a Google account to enjoy all the functions.

### **Chrome**

A web browser with which you can surf the internet.

Your bookmarks, browsing history, and settings across all devices with the browser installed can be synchronised with your Google account.

### **Gmail**

As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. With this application you can send and receive emails, manage emails by labels, archive emails, etc. Emails can be automatically synchronised with your Gmail account.

# **Maps**

Google Maps offers satellite imagery, street maps, 360° panoramic views of streets, real-time traffic conditions, and route planning for travelling by foot, car, or public transportation. By using this application, you can find your own location, search for a place, and get suggested route planning for your trips.

### YouTube

YouTube is an online video-sharing application where users can upload, view, and share videos. Available content includes video clips, TV clips, music videos, and other content such as video blogging, short original videos, and educational videos. It supports a streaming function that allows you to start watching videos almost as soon as they begin downloading from the internet.

### **Keep Notes**

Keep Notes allows you to create, manage, and access your notes effortlessly. Capture your ideas, to-do lists, and important reminders with ease.

### **Photos**

Google Photos stores and backs up your photos and videos. It also automatically analyses photos and organises them into groups, so that you can quickly find the photos you need.

## **Play Store**

Serves as the official app store for the Android operating system, allowing users to browse and download applications and games. Applications are either free of charge or at a cost.

In Play Store, search for the app you need, download it and then follow the installation guide to install the app. You can also uninstall, update an app, and manage your downloads.

### **Assistant**

Touch and hold the **Home** button to quickly ask for help, check the news, make a phone call, and more.

### **Files**

Files displays all data stored on the phone, including both external microSDTM card and internal storage, such as applications, media files downloaded from Google Play Store, YouTube or other locations; Videos, pictures or audios you have captured; other data transferred via Bluetooth, USB cable, etc.

### **Find Device**

Find Device helps you to find your lost device, wipe lost device data remotely, and perform a host of other security functions.

### Meet

Stay connected and collaborate effortlessly with the Meet menu on your smartphone. Join or schedule video meetings and group calls with ease.

### 4 Settings.....



To go to **Settings**, touch **O** from the Home screen or swipe up from the Home screen and then touch .

You can also swipe down from the notification panel and touch ...



#### Wi-Fi 4.1

You can connect to the internet when your phone is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your phone even without a SIM card inserted.

#### To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Touch **Settings** > **Wi-Fi**.
- Turn on ——.
- Once Wi-Fi is turned on, detected Wi-Fi networks are listed.
- Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (you should contact the network operator for details). When finished, touch CONNECT.

#### To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you can add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- Touch Settings > Wi-Fi > Add network.
- Enter the name of the network and any required network information.
- Touch CONNECT.

### To forget a Wi-Fi network

The following steps prevent automatic connection to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- On the Wi-Fi screen, touch the name of the saved network.
- Touch **FORGET** in the dialog that opens.

### 4.2 Bluetooth (1)

### **Bluetooth**

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

#### To turn on Bluetooth

- Touch **Settings** > **Bluetooth**.
- Turn on \_\_\_\_\_.

Your device name will appear on screen.

### To rename your device

- Touch **Settings** > **Bluetooth**.
- Touch **Device name**.
- Enter a name, and touch **RENAME** to confirm.

### To pair/connect your phone with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your phone with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- Touch Settings > Bluetooth > + Pair new device.
- Touch a Bluetooth device you want to pair your phone with in the list.
- In the dialog that pops up, touch PAIR to confirm.
- You are recommended to use TCL Bluetooth headsets, which have been tested and proved compatible with your phone. You can go to https://www.tcl.com for more information about the TCL Bluetooth headset.

• If the pairing is successful, your phone will be connected to the device.

### To unpair from a Bluetooth device

- Touch 🏚 beside the device you want to unpair from.
- Touch **FORGET** to confirm.

### 4.3 SIM card & cellular network

Go to To Settings > SIM card & cellular network > SIM 1 > Roaming Mode to enable data roaming, set your preferred network type, check the network connection you are using or create a new access point, etc.

### To rename or secure your mobile hotspot

When your mobile hotspot is activated, you can rename your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure its Wi-Fi network.

VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

#### To add a VPN

- Touch **Settings** > **Connections** > **VPN** and then touch +.
- On the screen that opens, follow your network administrator's instructions to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- Touch SAVE.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a screen lock for your phone.

### To connect to/disconnect from VPN

To connect to a VPN:

- Touch Settings > Connections > VPN.
- The VPNs you have added are listed. Touch the VPN you want to connect with.

• In the dialog that opens, enter any requested credentials and touch **CONNECT**.

To disconnect from a VPN:

#### To edit/delete a VPN

To edit a VPN:

To delete a VPN:

### **Private DNS**

### **NFC**

The function allows data exchange when the phone touches another device.

### **Cast**

### **USB** connection

With a USB cable, you can charge your device, transfer files or photos (MTP/PTP) between your phone and a computer.

### To connect your phone to the computer

- Use the USB cable that came with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.

### **Adaptive brightness**

Adjust screen brightness automatically.

# Dark display mode

Turn on to lower screen brightless in dark light environment.

### Dark theme

Empty screen space will become black in this mode, making it easier to look at your screen or read in dim light.

### Eye comfort mode

**Eye comfort mode** can effectively reduce blue light radiation and adjust the colour temperature to relieve eye fatigue. You can also create a custom schedule to turn it on.

### Sleep

Set screen timeout.

### Colour mode & temperature

Change the display gamut to vivid, natural or advanced based on content.

### Refresh rate

Live Caption provides real-time captions for audio and video content on your device. For detailed instructions on how to use Live Caption, please refer to the guidance on your device.

### Do Not Disturb

If you do not want to be disturbed by your phone or information ringtones during work or rest, you can set the **Do Not Disturb** mode.

Swipe down the Status bar twice to access the Quick Settings panel and touch  $\bigcirc$  to turn on Do Not Disturb.

### Screen lock

Select one method such as **Swipe**, **Pattern**, **PIN**, or **Password** to unlock the screen.

### **Fingerprint**

Use your Fingerprint to unlock the screen.

Access **Settings > Security & biometrics > Fingerprint** to activate these functions.

### **Face unlock**

**Face unlock** allows you to unlock your device with your facial data. Set it according to the on-screen steps.

Touch **Add account** to add an account for the selected app.

In this menu you can find how much time you have spent on the phone and even on each app. You can customise the time limit for using the phone to ensure a healthy and balanced life.

In addition, parents are able to restrict their children's usage time to manage their browsing habits.

Use Date & time settings to customise your preferences for how date and time are displayed.

Turn on to back up your phone's settings and other application data to Google servers. If you replace your phone, the settings and data you've backed up will be restored onto the new phone when you sign in with your Google account.

## **Developer options**

To enable this function, go to **Settings > System > About phone**, then touch **Build number** 7 times. Now **Developer options** is available. The developer options contain settings that are useful for developing Android applications.

### Reset

Touch to reset all network settings and app preferences, you won't lose your data with these settings.

If **Factory data reset** is selected, all data in your phone's internal storage will be erased, please back up your data before reset.

Touch to join the User Experience Improvement Programme so we can continue to improve our product design and overall user experience.

# 5 Making the most of your phone

# **FOTA** upgrade

Use the FOTA (Firmware Over The Air) upgrade to update your phone's software.

To access updates, from the app list, touch **Settings > System > System Update**. Turn on data connection or Wi-Fi before searching for updates.

With Wi-Fi turned on, the system is able to discover if a new firmware version is available and if so, begin to download it automatically. Once finished, a pop up dialog will give you the option of updating your phone now or later.

If Settings > System > System Update > > Update settings > Automatically update is turned off, you will only receive a notification which will appear in the Status bar.

During FOTA downloading or updating, to avoid errors in locating the correct update packages, do not change your default storage location.

After FOTA update compeletly, it need restart device, it will prompt tips to restart device

# **6** Troubleshooting

Before contacting the service centre, here are some instructions to help you troubleshoot your device:

- For optimal operation, fully charge the battery.
- To improve the phone's performance, remove unnecessary files or apps on your phone.
- Update your phone's software via **Settings > System > System Update**.
- Reset your phone via Settings > System > Reset > Factory data reset.
   Another method is to hold down the Power key and the Volume up key at the same time when your phone is powered off. Release the power button and then the volume button after the vibration, then select Wipe data / factory reset > Factory data reset to reset. All your phone data will be lost permanently. It is strongly advised to fully back up your phone data before resetting.

and carry out the following checks:

### My phone can't be switched on or is frozen

- When the phone can't be switched on, charge for at least 20 minutes to ensure the minimum battery power needed. Then switch it on again.
- When the phone falls into a loop during power on animation and the user interface can't be accessed, press and hold the **Power** key to reset. This eliminates any abnormal OS booting issues caused by third party applications.
- If neither method is effective, reset the phone by pressing the **Power** key and the **Volume up** key at the same time. Release the power key when the device vibrates, then select **Wipe data / factory reset > Factory data reset** to reset.

### My phone has not responded for several minutes

• If your phone doesn't respond, turn off your phone by pressing and holding the **Power** key until it turns off and then restart it again.

• If it still doesn't work, reset the phone.

### My phone turns off by itself

- Check that your screen is locked when you are not using your phone, and make sure that the **Power** key is not accidentally pressed while the screen is unlocked.
- Check the battery charge level.
- If it still doesn't work, reset the phone or update software.

### My phone can't charge properly

- Make sure that you are using the TCL charger that comes with the phone.
- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; if the battery power has been empty for a long time, it may take around 20 minutes to display the battery charging indicator on the screen.
- Make sure that charging is carried out under normal conditions 0°C (32°F) to 45°C (113°F).
- When abroad, check that the voltage input is compatible.

### My phone can't connect to a network or "No service" is displayed

- Try connecting to the network by moving to another physical location.
- Verify the network coverage with your operator.
- Check with your operator that your SIM card is valid.
- Try connecting at a later time if the network is overloaded.

### My phone can't connect to the internet

- Make sure that the internet access service of your SIM card is available.
- Check your phone's internet connection settings.
- Make sure that you are in a place with network coverage.
- Try connecting at a later time or another location.

#### Invalid SIM card

- Make sure that the SIM card has been correctly inserted.
- Make sure that the chip on your SIM card is not damaged.
- Make sure that the service of your SIM card is available.

### My phone can't make outgoing calls

- Make sure that you have dialled a valid number and have touched <a></a>.
- For international calls, check the country and area codes.
- Make sure that your phone is connected to a network, and the network is not overloaded or unavailable.
- Check your subscription status with your operator (credit, SIM card valid, etc.).
- Make sure that you have not barred outgoing calls.
- Make sure that your phone is not in aeroplane mode.

### My phone can't receive incoming calls

- Make sure that your phone is switched on and connected to a network (check for overloaded or unavailable network).
- Check your subscription status with your operator (credit, SIM card valid, etc.).
- Make sure that you have not forwarded incoming calls.
- Make sure that you have not barred certain calls.
- Make sure that your phone is not in aeroplane mode.

# The caller's name/number doesn't appear when a call is received

- Check that you have subscribed to this service with your operator.
- Your caller may have concealed his name or number.

### The sound quality of the calls is poor

- Adjust the volume during a call by pressing the **Volume** key.
- Check the network strength. Move to a location with stronger signal strength.
- Make sure that the receiver, connector and speaker on your phone are clean.

#### I can't use the features described in the manual

- Check with your operator to make sure that your subscription includes this service.
- Make sure that this feature doesn't require a TCL accessory.

### When I select a number from my contacts, the number can't be dialled

- Make sure that you have correctly recorded the number in your contacts.
- Make sure that you have selected the country code when calling an international number.

#### I can't add a contact

Make sure that your phone storage is not full.

### My callers can't leave messages on my voicemail

• Contact your network operator to check service availability.

### I can't access my voicemail

- Make sure that your operator's voicemail number is correctly entered in "Voicemail number".
- Try later if the network is busy.

#### I can't send and receive MMS

• Check your phone storage as it might be full.

- Contact your network operator to check service availability and MMS parameters.
- Verify the server centre number or your MMS profile with your operator.
- The server centre may be swamped. Try again later.

#### SIM card PIN locked

 Contact your network operator to obtain the PUK (Personal Unblocking Key) code.

### I can't connect my phone to my computer

- Check to make sure the USB port is not broken. If it's not working, try another USB port on your computer.
- Make sure USB drivers are properly installed.
- If you are using a Windows computer, make sure it supports MTP mode. If you are using a Mac, make sure to install Android File Transfer from www.android.com/filetransfer/.

#### I can't download new files

- Make sure that there is sufficient phone storage space for your download.
- Select the microSD card as the location to store downloaded files.
- Check your subscription status with your operator.

### The phone can't be detected by others via Bluetooth

- Make sure that Bluetooth is turned on and your phone is visible to other users.
- Make sure that the two phones are within Bluetooth's detection range.

### The battery drains too fast

Make sure that you follow the complete charge time (minimum 120 minutes).

- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 20 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication.
- Adjust the brightness of screen as appropriate.
- Extend the email auto-check interval for as long as possible.
- Update news and weather information on manual demand, or increase their auto-check interval.
- Exit background-running applications if they are not being used for extended periods of time.
- Turn off Bluetooth, Wi-Fi, or GPS when not in use.

# The phone becomes warm following prolonged calls, game playing, internet surfing or running other complex applications

 This heating is a normal consequence of the CPU handling excessive data. Ending the above actions will make your phone return to normal temperature.

# After a factory data reset is performed, I can't use my phone without entering Google account credentials

- After a reset is performed, you must enter the original Google account credentials that were used on this phone.
- If you don't remember your Google account credentials, complete Google account recovery procedures.
- If you still cannot access your phone, apply to the authorised repair centre, but remember that it will not be regarded as a warranty case.

### I forgot some passwords/codes/keys on my phone

- Perform a factory data reset.
- If you still cannot access your phone, apply to the authorised repair centre, but remember that it will not be regarded as a warranty case.

### No action after touching the touch screen

- Check whether there is any damage to the screen. If yes, please back up your data and take your device and proof of purchase to our repair centre to get more professional technical assistance.
- If the issue occurs while using a third-party app, make sure the app is compatible with your device and Android version. Try uninstalling the third-party app.
- Check if the issue occurs during charging. If yes, we recommend trying the official charger and data cable.
  - (Note: The voltage instability of non-standard chargers and data cables may cause the touchscreen to become unresponsive).
- Make sure the temperature where the device is being used is neither too hot nor too cold. The standard working temperature of the capacitive touchscreen is -10°C~60°C. Excessively high or low temperatures will cause the touchscreen to become unresponsive.
- If there is a screen protector on the screen, see if the touchscreen works after removing it.
- Make sure there are no stains such as water or sweat on the touchscreen. If there are, wipe the screen and try again.
- If it still doesn't work, reset the phone or update software

#### Cannot turn on camera flash mode

- Charge your device until the battery level is at least 30%. Camera flash cannot be used when the battery is running low.
- Clear the cache of the **Camera** app.
- To clear an app's cache: go to the main menu, select Settings > Apps > View all apps > Camera > Storage & cache > CLEAR DATA and CLEAR CACHE.
- Drag down the quick settings bar in any interface, touch the flashlight icon to check whether the flash on your device works.

• Check whether the camera is set to the special shooting mode. In order to achieve a certain effect, the program will prohibit the use of the flash. Please revert to normal camera shooting mode.

### How to back up my device data

- Go to **Settings > System > Backup** (refer to "4.24 System > Backup")
- You can also back up your data to another phone via the Switch Phone app. Swipe up the home screen to find the search bar and enter Switch Phone, transfer data by following the instructions.
