
The following illustration outlines your phone's primary external features.




Set Up Your Phone

You must first install and charge the battery to begin setting up your phone.


- 1. Install the battery.
 - Hook your thumb- or fingernail into the slot on the side of the battery compartment cover (①) and lift the cover off gently (②).



Insert the battery, contacts end first, and gently press into place (③).



Replace the cover, making sure all tabs have seated and there are no gaps (④).



- 2. Charge your battery.
 - Plug the USB connector into the charger/accessory jack on the lower left side of your phone.




Plug the AC adapter into an electrical outlet.

Note: Your phone's battery should have enough charge for the phone to turn on and find a signal, set up voicemail, and make a call. You should fully charge your battery as soon as possible.

- 3. Press and hold the **Power** button to turn your phone on.
 - If your phone is activated, it will turn on and search for Sprint service.
 - If your phone is not yet activated, see Activate Your Phone for more information.

To remove the battery, after removing the battery compartment cover (see **Install the battery**), grasp the tab extending from the battery pack and pull the battery out of its compartment.

Warning: Do not handle a damaged or leaking Li-Ion battery as you can be burned.



Activate Your Phone

Follow the instructions below to activate your phone if it has not already been activated. Depending on your account or how and where you purchased your phone, it may be ready to use or you may need to activate it on your Sprint account.

- If you purchased your phone at a Sprint Store, it is probably activated and ready to use.
- If you received your phone in the mail and it is for a new Sprint account or a new line of service, it is designed to activate automatically.
 - When you turn the phone on for the first time, you should see a Hands Free Activation screen. Follow the onscreen instructions to continue.
- If you received your phone in the mail and you are activating a new phone for an existing number on your account (you're swapping phones), you can activate on your computer online or directly on your phone.
 - Activate on your computer:
 - Go to sprint.com/activate and complete the online instructions to activate your phone.
 - Activate on your phone:
 - Turn on your new phone. (Make sure the old one is turned off.) Your phone will automatically attempt Hands-Free Activation.
 - Touch **Activate** to override auto-activation and start the manual activation wizard.
 - Follow the on-screen prompts to complete the activation process.
- To confirm activation, make a phone call. If your phone is still not activated or you do not have access to the Internet, contact Sprint Customer Service at **1-888-211-4727** for assistance.
- **Tip:** Do not press the **Power** button while the phone is being activated. Pressing the **Power** button cancels the activation process.
- **Note:** If you are having any difficulty with activation, contact Sprint Customer Service by calling **1-888-211-4727** from any other phone.

Set Up Voicemail

You should set up your Voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your phone is activated. Always use a password to protect against unauthorized access. Your phone automatically transfers all unanswered calls to your voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off. See Visual Voicemail and Voicemail (Traditional) for details.

To set up visual voicemail:

- Touch Home > :::> Voicemail. (If your screen is locked, press the Power button to turn on the display and then flick () to unlock the screen.)
- 2. Touch **Personalize now** and follow the system prompts to:
 - Create a password (part of standard voicemail).
 - Record your name announcement.
 - Record your greeting.
- 3. When prompted to enter information, touch **Dialpad** to bring up the onscreen dialpad to enter your numeric responses.
- 4. Once you have completed the setup process, return to the voicemail page (see step 1).
- 5. Touch the **Welcome to Voicemail** message on the screen to play a brief explanation of the voicemail services.
- **Note:** Voicemail Password Sprint strongly recommends that you create a password when setting up your voicemail to protect against unauthorized access. Without a password, anyone who has access to your phone is able to access your voicemail messages.

To set up traditional voicemail:

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \checkmark . (If your screen is locked, press the **Power** button to turn on the display and then flick () to unlock the screen.)
- 2. Touch and hold 1 to dial your voicemail number.
- 3. Follow the system prompts to:
 - Create your password.
 - Record your name announcement.
 - Record your greeting.

Note: Voicemail Password – Sprint strongly recommends that you create a password when setting up your voicemail to protect against unauthorized access. Without a password, anyone who has access to your phone is able to access your voicemail messages.

Sprint ID

Once your phone is activated, you will be prompted to install an initial ID Pack. ID Packs are bundles of applications, ringtones, wallpapers, settings, and more. ID Packs are installed using an application called Sprint ID.

You can install as many as five ID Packs at any one time in addition to the default My ID Pack. You can easily switch from one ID Pack to another without losing any applications already installed. For example, when you install the Sprint pack, Sprint applications such as Sprint TV & Movies, TeleNav GPS Navigator, and NASCAR Sprint Cup Mobile will remain in your applications.

A variety of ID Packs are available. Select your favorite pack and install it.

- **Note:** Your phone must be activated, your battery should be fully charged, and you should be in a network coverage area before you install an ID Pack.
 - Touch Home >
 If your screen is locked, press the Power button to turn on the display and then flick () to unlock the screen.)
 - 2. Touch Get New ID Packs on the Choose your ID screen.
 - 3. Touch an ID Pack on the Get New ID Packs screen.
 - 4. Read the information screen for a description of the ID Pack and touch **Install**.
 - 5. Read the Terms & Conditions and touch **Agree** to begin the download.
 - 6. Wait for the download to finish and the ID Pack will then begin installation automatically.

Touch **Continue** to continue using your phone. When the notification icon appears, slide the status bar down, and touch ID ready to install to complete the installation.

Data Services Password

With your Sprint phone, you may elect to set up an optional data services password to control access and authorize Premium Service purchases.

Sprint 411

Sprint 411 gives you access to a variety of services and information, including residential, business, and government listings; movie listings or showtimes; driving directions, restaurant reservations, and major local event information. You can get up to three pieces of information per call, and the operator can automatically connect your call at no additional charge.

There is a per-call charge to use Sprint 411, and you will be billed for airtime.

Your Phone's Layout

The illustrations and descriptions below outline your phone's basic layout.



Key Functions

- **Power Button** lets you turn the phone on or off, or turn the screen backlight on or off. This button can be configured to end a call.
- **LED Indicator** shows your phone's battery status. It also flashes for incoming calls or pending notifications.
- **Proximity Sensor/Light Sensor** automatically deactivates the touchscreen when you hold the phone near your face. This prevents you from unintentionally activating phone functions during a call. It also automatically turns off the keyboard backlight and brightens the display when you are in sunlight or a bright room, and turns on the keyboard backlight and dims the display in darker places.
- Volume Button allows you to adjust the ringer and media volumes when you are not on a call, or the voice volume during a call.
- **Charger/Accessory Jack** allows you to connect the micro-USB cable (included) to charge the battery or to transfer files to and from a computer.

CAUTION! Inserting an accessory into the incorrect jack may damage the phone.

- Back Key (()) returns you to the previous screen or closes the dialog box.
- Home Key (()) returns you to the Home screen.
- **Recent Apps Key** () allows you to show the Recent Apps screen.
- Menu Key ()) lets you open the menus of the current screen or application.
- **Camera Button** lets you activate the camera and camcorder and take pictures and videos.
- Battery Cover Slot lets you open the battery cover to replace the battery.
- **Display Screen** displays all the information needed to operate your phone. Use finger gestures to navigate and interact with items on the screen.
- **Earpiece** lets you hear the caller and automated prompts.
- **Headset Jack** allows you to plug in an optional headset for convenient, hands-free conversations.

CAUTION! Inserting an accessory into the incorrect jack may damage the phone.

- **QWERTY Keyboard** slides out from the left side of the phone.
- **Camera Flash** allows you to take pictures in low light conditions.
- Self Portrait Mirror allows you to see your reflection when you take pictures and videos.
- Microphone allows other callers to hear you clearly when you are speaking to them.
- Internal Antennas facilitate reception and transmission. To maximize performance, do not obstruct while using the phone.
- **Speaker** lets you hear the different ringers and sounds. It also lets you hear the caller's voice in speakerphone mode.
- **Camera Lens**, as part of the built-in camera, lets you take pictures and videos.
- microSD Card Slot (Internal) allows you to insert a microSD card to support external memory.


Note: Your phone comes with the microSD card preinstalled.

Turn Your Phone On and Off

The instructions below explain how to turn your phone on and off.

Turn Your Phone On

▶ Press and hold the **Power** button.



Turn Your Phone Off

Press and hold the Power button to open the phone options menu. Touch Power off > OK to turn the phone off.

Your screen remains blank while your phone is off.

Turn Your Screen On and Off

Your phone allows you to quickly turn the screen off when not in use and to turn it back on and unlock it when you need it.

Turn the Screen Off When Not in Use

► To quickly turn the screen off, press the **Power** button. Pressing the **Power** button again will turn on your phone screen and show the lock screen.

To save battery power, the phone automatically turns off the screen after a certain period of time when you leave it idle. You will still be able to receive messages and calls while the phone's screen is off.

Note: For information on how to adjust the time before the screen turns off, see Sleep.

Turn the Screen On and Unlock It

- 1. To turn the screen on, press the **Power** button.
- 2. Flick (a) to unlock the screen.
 - or –

Open the slide-out QWERTY keyboard.

 You can disable the screen lock or enable a more secure one from the Settings menu. See Screen Lock.

Touchscreen Navigation

Your phone's touchscreen lets you control actions through a variety of touch gestures.

Phone Basics

Touch

Touch once with your finger to select or launch a menu, option, or application. A light touch works best.

Touch and Hold

To open the available options for an item (for example, options for a contact), touch and hold the item.

Drag

Touch and hold your finger before you start to move it. Do not release your finger until you have reached the target position.

Slide or Flick

To slide, quickly move your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen. To flick, move your finger in lighter, quicker strokes than sliding.

Pinch and Spread

Pinch the screen using your thumb and forefinger to zoom out or spread the screen to zoom in when viewing a picture or a Web page. (Move fingers inward to zoom out and outward to zoom in.)

Rotate

For most screens, you can automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways. When entering text, you can turn the phone sideways to bring up a bigger keyboard. See Touchscreen Keyboard for more details.

Note: The Auto-rotate screen check box in Home ) > Menu ) > System settings > Display needs to be selected for the screen orientation to automatically change.

Your Home Screen

The Home screen is the starting point for your phone's applications, functions, and menus. You can customize your Home screen by adding application icons, shortcuts, folders, widgets, and more. Your Home screen extends beyond the initial screen. Swipe the screen left or right to display additional screens.

Home Screen Overview

The below explains some examples you see on the Home screen.



Application Launcher

- **Status Bar:** Displays the time, notification, and phone status icons. Slide down to display the Notifications panel.
- Shortcut: Allows users to quickly launch applications.
- **Application Launcher:** Touch to display available applications and widgets on the phone.
- **Favorites Tray:** Contains up to five icons and appears on every Home screen. You can customize these icons except the application launcher icon in the middle.
- Screen Position Indicator: Indicates where you are among the five Home screens.
- **Folder:** Allows users to organize screen items. You can store multiple application icons as a group.
- **Google Search Bar:** Allows users to enter text or spoken keywords for a quick search on the phone or on the Internet. Touch to enter text or touch $\oint_{\mathcal{V}}$ to speak your keyword.

Extended Screens

In addition to the main Home screen, your phone has four extended Home screens to provide more space for adding icons, widgets, and more. Touch **Home** and then drag across the screen to move from the main screen to an extended screen.



- You cannot add more screens.
- While on an extended screen, touch () to return to the main Home screen.

Customize the Home Screen

Learn how to add, move, or remove items from the Home screen.

Add App Icons or Widgets to the Home Screen

- 1. Touch (iii) on the favorites tray.
- 2. Slide the **APPS** or **WIDGETS** screens to find the item you want to add to the Home screen.
- 3. Touch and hold an app icon or a widget.
- 4. Touching the item, move your finger to find the place to add it to. The blue frames which appear on the screens indicate where you might place the item.
- 5. Release your finger.

Move or Remove Items on the Home Screen

- ▶ Touch and hold the item you want to move or remove on the Home screen:
 - To move the item, drag it to a new area and release it.
 - To remove the item, drag it over "**X Remove**" at the top of the screen and release it when it turns red.

Change Wallpaper

1. Touch and hold the empty area on the Home screen.

- 2. Select one of the following options:
 - **Gallery:** Select to use saved or captured pictures on your phone. Touch to select a picture and crop it before setting it as wallpaper.
 - **ID wallpapers:** Select to use ID wallpapers. Select the wallpaper and touch **Set wallpaper**.
 - Live Wallpapers: Select to use Live wallpapers. Select the wallpaper and touch Set wallpaper.
 - Wallpapers: Select to use preset wallpapers. Select the wallpaper and touch Set wallpaper.

Favorites Tray

The favorites tray takes up to five icons and those icons in the tray remain visible on every Home screen. You can change icons except the application launcher icon located in the center of the tray.

To add a new icon to the favorites tray:

- 1. Remove the current icon on the tray. See Move or Remove Items on the Home Screen.
- 2. Touch and hold an app icon and drag it to the favorites tray.
- 3. Release your finger.

Use Folders

You can place several app icons in a folder. Drop an app icon over another on the Home screen, and the two icons will be in the same folder.

- 1. Touch and hold an app icon and drag it over another icon on the Home screen.
- 2. Release your finger. You can see two icons piled within a folder (a black circle).
- 3. Touch a circle. You can see the app icons within the folder.
- 4. Touch **Unnamed Folder**. The keyboard opens and you can name the folder. To rename it, touch the name.

Status Bar

The status bar at the top of the screen provides phone and service status information on the right side and notification alerts on the left. To view notification alerts, touch the status bar and drag it down.

Slide-Out QWERTY Keyboard

Open the slide-out QWERTY keyboard to type faster and more conveniently. The slide-out keyboard also comes with special keys that let you quickly access menus and search your phone.

- 1. Hold the phone sideways, with the front panel buttons to your right.
- 2. Push the screen panel up with your thumbs to reveal the slide-out keyboard.
- **Note:** When the slide-out keyboard is opened, the display stays in landscape mode and you will not be able to use the onscreen keyboard.



- 3. Start an app or select a field that requires text or number entry.
- 4. Press the letter keys to enter text. Press the following keys to enter uppercase letters, numbers, special characters, or symbols:
 - Shift key ()
 - Press once to capitalize the next letter you select.
 - Press twice to lock the key and type a series of uppercase letters (this works just like the Caps Lock key on your computer keyboard).
 - To unlock, press the shift key once again.
 - Function key (fn)
 - Press to enter the number or symbol located at the upper right corner of the key (for example, #, *, &, +, !). Press this key first and then any corresponding key.
 - Press twice to lock the function key.
 - To unlock, press the function key once again.

Note: Do not confuse with the four keys at the bottom of your phone when closed and in portrait orientation. These keys can also be referred to as "function keys."

- Symbol key (sym))
 - Press to open the Symbols window. Touch the symbol you want to insert into your text.
- 5. Press these keys to perform other actions:
 - Navigation keys (

- Press to scroll through the phone's menu options. On the text input screen, press to move the cursor.
- Enter key (←)
 - Press to insert a line feed in text input mode, or access the phone's menus and select the highlighted choice when navigating through a menu.
- Backspace key (
 - Press to delete characters from the display in text input mode.

Physical Keyboard Settings

You can customize the slide-out QWERTY keyboard settings.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Language & input.
- 2. Set the following options:
 - Auto-replace: Check to automatically correct mistyped words.
 - Auto-capitalization: Check to automatically capitalize the first letter of sentences.
 - Auto-punctuate: Check to automatically insert "." when the space key is pressed twice.
 - Vibrate on keypress: Check to activate vibration when a key is pressed.

Touchscreen Keyboard

The touchscreen keyboards let you enter text directly onscreen without opening the phone.

Your phone provides convenient ways to enter letters, numbers, and symbols whenever you are prompted to enter text. To manually display the touchscreen keyboard, simply touch a text field where you want to enter text. There are two ways of entering text on your phone: **Swype** and **Android keyboard**.

Note: Swype is selected as a default keyboard.


To switch the touchscreen keyboard:

- 1. Touch **Home** > **Menu**.
- 2. Touch **System settings > Language & input > Default**.
- 3. Touch **Swype** or **Android keyboard**.


Enter Text Using Swype

Swype[®] allows you to enter text by sliding your finger from letter to letter rather than touching each key individually. To enter text, slide your finger from one letter to the next.

Swype Keyboard Overview



Note: Key appearance may vary depending on the selected application.





Example: You To capitalize the letter, slide up over the keyboard.

Tip: For tips on using Swype, touch and hold the Swype key \checkmark and then touch **How to Swype**.

You can do the following with the Swype keyboard:

Key	Description
123 +!= Edit ABC	Text mode: Touch to toggle between the Alphabet keyboard and Number & Symbol keyboard.
~	Swype: Touch and hold to access the tips or the settings of Swype.
Ŷ	Voice input mode: Touch to enter text using your voice.
$\langle \times \rangle$	Backspace: Touch to delete a character. Touch and hold to delete multiple characters.
:-)	Smiley: Touch to insert a smiley. Touch and hold to view and select other smileys.
]	Space: Touch to insert a space.
ب	Enter: Touch to confirm your entry.
	Shift: Touch to toggle between the uppercase, lowercase and caps lock text input.

ABC Mode

In ABC mode, you can enter letters from the touchscreen keyboard by sliding your finger. While in this mode, the text mode key displays $\begin{bmatrix} 123\\ +1 \end{bmatrix}$.

- 1. Select the ABC mode by touching ABC
 - Capitalization in ABC mode can be altered by touching

(Unshifted) to make all letters in a word lowercase.



(One-character-shifted) to capitalize only the first letter of a word.



(Caps Lock) to make all letters in a word uppercase.

- 2. Enter text using the keyboard.
 - If you make a mistake, touch
 to erase a single character. Touch and hold
 to erase an entire word.
- **Tip:** Some keys have alternate characters. In any mode, touch and hold a key to enter a number or symbol on the top right of a key. Touch and long-hold a key to bring up a list of all the characters available on that key. Touch the character you want to enter from the list.

Number & Symbol Mode

In Number & Symbol mode, you can enter numbers and symbols from the touchscreen

keyboard. While in this mode, the text mode key displays

To enter numbers and symbols in Swype mode:

- 1. Select the Number & Symbol mode by touching
- 2. Touch the key for the number or symbol you want to enter. To select from additional symbol characters, touch **1**.
- **Tip:** Some keys have alternate characters. In any mode, touch and hold a key to enter a number or symbol on the top right of a key. Touch and long-hold a key to bring up a list of all the characters available on that key. Touch the character you want to enter from the list.

Enter Text by Speaking

You can use voice input to enter text by speaking anywhere that you can enter text with the touchscreen keyboard.

- 1. Touch $\mathbf{\Psi}$ on the keyboard.
- 2. Say the text you wish to enter into the microphone.

Add a Word to the User Dictionary

You can use the user dictionary option to add new words to the dictionary.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Language & input.
- 2. Touch -- next to **Swype**.
- 3. Touch **Personal dictionary**.
- 4. Touch + , type the word you want to add and touch . (A list of words you have added to the dictionary is displayed.)
 - To edit a word, touch a word to edit.
 - To delete a word, touch _____, touch a word to check it and then touch ______
 > OK.
 - Touch words in the dictionary.
 - Touch X to cancel deleting and go back to the previous screen.

Swype Settings

You can customize the Swype settings as you like.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Language & input.
- 2. Touch -- next to **Swype**.
- **Tip:** You can open the Swype settings from the Swype keyboard. Touch and hold *I* on the keyboard.
 - 3. Choose from the following options:
 - Select Input Method: Touch to select Swype or Android keyboard.
 - How to Swype: Touch to learn Swype in quick steps.
 - **Personal dictionary:** Touch to make your personal dictionary for Swype.
 - **Preferences:** Touch to show the following settings menus for Swype.
 - Audio feedback: Check to turn on sounds from Swype.
 - Vibrate on keypress: Check to activate vibration when a key is touched.
 - Show tips: Check to turn on a flashing indicator for quick help.
 - Auto-spacing: Check to automatically insert spaces between words.

- **Auto-capitalization:** Check to automatically capitalize the first letter of sentenceinitial words where available.
- Show complete trace: Check to display the complete Swype path.
- Word suggestion: Touch to activate word prediction when typing in Swype.
- **Speed vs. accuracy:** Touch to set how quickly Swype responds to input.



ABC Mode

In ABC mode, you can enter letters from the touchscreen keyboard. While in this mode, the text mode key displays ?123

- 1. Select the ABC mode by touching ABC
 - You can switch the capitalization style in ABC mode by touching the shift key Δ



↔ (Unshifted) to make all letters in a word lowercase.



(One-character-shifted) to capitalize only the first letter of a word.

You can select the caps lock by double-touching $oldsymbol{\Phi}$ or $oldsymbol{\Phi}$ to make all letters in a • word uppercase.



(Caps Lock) to make all letters in a word uppercase.

2. Touch corresponding alphabet keys to enter text.

Tip: Some keys have alternate characters. In any mode, touch and hold a key to enter a number or symbol on the top right of a key. Touch and long-hold a key to bring up a list of all the characters available on that key. Touch the character you want to enter from the list.

Number & Symbol Mode

In Number & Symbol mode, you can enter numbers and symbols only from the onscreen keyboard. While in this mode, the text mode key displays **ABC**.

To enter numbers:

- 1. Select the Number & Symbol mode by touching 2123.
- 2. Touch appropriate numeric keys.

To enter symbols:

- 1. Select the Number & Symbol mode by touching 2123.
- 2. Touch appropriate symbol keys.

– or –

Touch = \< to select from additional symbol characters.

Tip: Some keys have alternate characters. In any mode, touch and hold a key to enter a number or symbol on the top right of a key. Touch and long-hold a key to bring up a list of all the characters available on that key. Touch the character you want to enter from the list.

Enter Text by Speaking

Voice input is an experimental feature that uses Google's speech-recognition service and you must have a data or Wi-Fi connection to use it.

If the touchscreen keyboard does not display 🖳, voice input is not turned on.

To turn on voice input:

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Language & input.
- 2. Touch **Google voice typing** if it is not checked.
- 3. Touch -- next to **Android keyboard**.
- 4. Touch Voice input key and select On main keyboard or On symbols keyboard.

To enter text by speaking:

- 1. Touch U on the keyboard.
- 2. Say the text you wish to enter into the microphone and touch **Done**.

Add a Word to the User Dictionary

You can use the user dictionary option to add new words to the dictionary.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Language & input.
- 2. Touch **Personal dictionaries**.
- 3. Select a language.
- 4. Touch + .
- 5. Type the word you want to add and touch **OK**. (A list of words you have added to the dictionary is displayed.)
 - Touch a word to edit it.
 - Touch X to delete it.

Android Keyboard Settings

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Language & input.
- 2. Touch -- next to **Android keyboard**.
- **Tip:** When **Show settings key** is enabled in the Android keyboard settings, touch **I** on the Android keyboard and touch **Android keyboard settings**. When the setting is disabled, touch and hold the key to the immediate left of the space key on the Android keyboard and touch **Android keyboard settings**.
 - 3. Choose from the following options.
 - **Input languages:** Touch to select the input language. The dictionary for the selected language will be enabled.
 - Auto-capitalization: Check to automatically set the first letter of a sentence to upper case.
 - Vibrate on keypress: Check to activate vibration when a key is touched.
 - **Sound on keypress:** Check to activate a clicking sound when a key is touched.
 - **Popup on keypress:** Check to display a larger image of the key above it when you touch it.


- Show settings key: Check to display the keyboard settings key on the keyboard.
- Voice input key: Touch to select where the Voice Input key is displayed from On main keyboard, On symbols keyboard, or Off.
- Add-on dictionaries: Touch to select the dictionary you want to use.
- Auto correction: Touch to allow the space bar and punctuation to automatically correct mistyped words.
- Show correction suggestions: Touch to select when correction suggestions are displayed.
- Advanced settings: Touch to open the settings for expert users.

Copy and Paste Text

In applications that require text entry, such as Messaging, use the copy and paste functions to copy and paste text from one application to another.

To copy and paste the text:

- 1. Open the application or received message that you want to copy text from.
- Touch and hold the text body. Selection tabs appear and the currently selected words or characters are highlighted. Drag the tabs to expand or reduce the range of the selected text.



Tip: Touch **III** or **SELECT ALL** to select all the text on the Web page.

- 3. Touch 📄.
- 4. Open the application that you want to paste the text to.
- 5. Touch and hold the text box where you want to paste the text to, and touch **PASTE**.
 - If you want to add the selected text to the current text, place a cursor to the position where you want to insert the selected words or characters. Touch and hold the text box, and touch **PASTE**.

To copy text from a Web page:

- 1. Scroll to the area of the Web page containing the text you want to select.
- 2. Touch and hold the text you want to copy. Drag tabs to expand or reduce the range of the selected text. Any selected text will appear highlighted.

Tip: Touch **SELECT ALL** to select all the text on the Web page.

- 3. Touch > Copy.
- 4. Open the application that you want to paste into.
- 5. Touch and hold the text box where you want to paste the text to, and touch **PASTE**.

To copy a URL:

- 1. To copy a URL, touch and hold the URL to display the options menu.
- 2. Touch **Copy link URL** or <u>E</u>.
- 3. Open the application that you want to paste into.
- 4. Touch and hold the text box where you want to paste the URL to, and touch **PASTE**.



Call Using the Phone Dialpad

The most "traditional" way to place a call is by using the phone's dialpad.

1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > **\bigcirc** to display the phone screen.

2. Touch the number keys on the dialpad to enter the phone number.



- 3. Touch 📞 to call the number.
- 4. To end the call, touch 📻

Call From Recent Calls

The Recent Calls list lets you quickly place calls to recent incoming, outgoing, or missed numbers.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc to display the phone screen.
- 2. Touch () to display the Call log list.
- 3. Touch the phone icon 📞 next to a number or contact to place a call.
- 4. For additional options, touch the name or number.

Call From People

You can place phone calls directly from entries in your contacts list.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc to display the phone screen.
- 2. Touch 👤 to display the contacts list. Your frequent contacts are displayed at the top of the list.

- 3. Touch the contact you want to call.
 - Touch Q to search your contact.
 - Touch Menu > Contacts to display to customize the display of contacts.

Call a Number in a Text Message

While viewing a message, you can place a call to a number that is in the body of the message.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Messaging.
- 2. Touch the message with the phone number.
- 3. The Phone screen then opens, with the phone number automatically filled in and ready to be dialed. To place the call, touch **C**.

Call Emergency Numbers

You can place calls to 911 even if the phone's screen is locked or your account is restricted.

To call the 911 emergency number:

- 1. Flick () to unlock the screen, if the slide screen lock is on.
- 2. Touch $\langle \cdot \rangle$ on the screen.
- 3. Touch 9<u>™</u> 1<u>∞</u> 1<u>∞</u> **€**.

To call the 911 emergency number when the pattern screen lock, the PIN screen lock or the password screen lock is on:

- 1. Touch **Emergency call** on the screen.
- 2. Touch 9 🚾 1_ 1_ 📞.

Enhanced 911 (E911 Information)

This phone features an embedded Global Positioning System (GPS) chip necessary for utilizing E911 emergency location services where available.

When you place an emergency 911 call, the GPS feature of your phone seeks information to calculate your approximate location. Depending on several variables, including availability and access to satellite signals, it may take up to 30 seconds or more to determine and report your approximate location.

Important: Always report your location to the 911 operator when placing an emergency call. Some designated emergency call takers, known as Public Safety

Answering Points (PSAPs), may not be equipped to receive GPS location information from your phone.

Call Numbers With Pauses

You can dial phone numbers with pauses for use with automated systems, such as voicemail or credit card billing numbers.

There are two types of pauses available on your phone:

- Add 2-sec pause: Automatically sends the next set of numbers after two seconds.
- Add wait: Sends the next set of numbers when you touch Yes in the pop-up window.
- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc , and enter all or part of a number.
- 2. Touch **Menu** > Add 2-sec pause or Add wait.
- 3. Enter additional numbers.
- 4. Touch 📞 to dial the number.

Call Using the Plus (+) Code

When placing international calls, Plus Code Dialing automatically enters the international access code for your location (for example, 011 for international calls made from the U.S.).

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc to display the phone screen.
- 2. Touch and hold 0 until you see a "+" on the display screen.
- 3. Enter the country code and phone number, and then touch **S**. The phone automatically prepends the access code for international dialing, followed by the country code and phone number.

Call Using Internet Calling

When Wi-Fi network is available, you can make and receive calls through an Internet calling account.

Important: Calling a phone number using Internet calling may incur additional charges.

Add an Internet Calling Account

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc to display the phone screen.
- 2. Touch Menu > Settings > Accounts > ADD ACCOUNT.
- 3. Enter your account details and touch **SAVE**.

Phone Calls

- 4. To set your phone to receive Internet calls on your added account, touch the **Receive** incoming calls check box.
- **Note:** This requires the phone to maintain a connection with a Wi-Fi data network, which reduces the life of your phone's battery.

Make an Internet Call

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > People.
- 2. Touch a contact and then touch **Internet call**.

Internet Calling Setting

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \checkmark to display the phone screen.
- 2. Touch **Menu** > Settings > Use Internet calling.
- 3. Select an option from the following:
 - For all calls when data network is available to use Internet calling for all calls when Wi-Fi network is available.
 - Only for Internet calls to use Internet calling only for calls to Internet calling addresses.
 - Ask for each call to ask each time you make a call.

Receive Phone Calls

The following information lets you know how to answer incoming calls, mute the ringer on incoming calls, reject incoming calls, and more.

When you receive a phone call from a contact, the Incoming call screen appears and displays the caller ID icon, name, and phone number of the calling party. When you receive a phone call from someone who is not stored in People, only the default caller ID icon and phone number appear on the Incoming call screen.

Note: If your phone is turned off, all calls automatically go to voicemail.

Answer an Incoming Call

On the Incoming call screen, flick the Answer icon (



Mute the Ringer

To mute the ringer without rejecting the call:

Press the volume button up or down.

Send an Incoming Call to Voicemail

▶ Flick the Ignore icon **(** to send the call to your voicemail inbox.

Reject a Call and Send a Text Message

You can automatically send a default text message to a caller and reject the incoming voice call.

Flick the Ignore & Text icon () to ignore the call and send a message to the caller.

Visual Voicemail

Visual Voicemail gives you a quick and easy way to access your voicemail. Now you can find exactly the message you are looking for without having to listen to every voicemail message first. This new feature periodically goes out to your voicemail, and gathers the caller information from all of the current voicemails. It then populates a list with the caller name and number, along with the length of time and priority level of the voicemail message.

Set Up Visual Voicemail

Setting up Visual Voicemail follows many of the same procedures as setting up traditional Sprint voicemail. You should set up your Sprint voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your phone is activated. Your phone automatically transfers all unanswered calls to your voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off.

Note: To set up your traditional voicemail box, see Set Up Voicemail.



- Important: Voicemail Password Sprint strongly recommends that you create a password when setting up your voicemail to protect against unauthorized access. Without a password, anyone who has access to your phone is able to access your voicemail messages.
 - 4. Once you have completed the setup process, return to the voicemail page (see step 1).
 - 5. Touch the **Welcome to Voicemail** message on the screen to play a brief explanation of the voicemail services.

Review Visual Voicemail

Visual Voicemail lets you easily access and select which messages you want to review.

1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Voicemail.



- Note: Touch Inbox at the top left on the screen to move to other folders, such as Trash or SD card.
 - 2. Touch \equiv to play all the new messages.

- provides a visual timeline for the current message. Touch and drag this bar to scrub through the message to different points.
- Touch II to pause the playback. Touch b to resume.
- Touch Ø or 1 to turn the speakerphone on or off during playback.
- Touch it to delete the current voicemail message. The message will be moved to the trash folder.
- Touch to call the person who left the voicemail message.
- Touch to share the message. Select an available method and follow the onscreen instructions.
- Touch <->

 to reply to the message.
- Touch at to move the message to the SD card.
- Touch Late to move the message to Inbox.
- Tip: More options may be available by touching and holding a message, such as or or or to mark the message as read or unread, or to empty the trash folder.

Listen to Multiple Voicemail Messages

When you are done listening to a voicemail message you can easily access other voicemail messages without returning to the main voicemail screen.

- 1. Listen to the current voicemail message.
- 2. Swipe your finger left or right to display the next or previous message. (It will begin playing automatically.)

You can navigate through voicemail messages as frequently as you'd like. You can even move to the next or previous message before you're finished listening to the current one.

Compose a Message

Record a voice message and share it.

- 2. Touch 👤 to start recording.
- 3. Touch (\mathbf{I}) to stop recording.
- 4. Touch () to review the recorded message.
 - Touch 🧶 > **Re-record** to discard the current message and start a new recording.
- 5. Touch <<p>to select a method to share the recorded message and follow the onscreen instructions.
 - You will be asked to set a Display name if it is not set.

Configure Visual Voicemail Settings

The Visual Voicemail settings menu lets you access settings for notifications, pictures, greetings, and more.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > **Voicemail**.
- 2. Touch **Menu** > **Settings**. From this menu, you can:
 - Touch **Manage subscription** to verify the Voicemail-to-Text account information.
 - Touch Auto forward to email to send a copy of new messages to an email address of your choice.
 - Touch Personalize voicemail to change your voicemail greeting for incoming calls and update password. See Change Your Main Greeting via the Voicemail Menu.
 - Touch **Notifications** to determine how you are notified of new voicemails.
 - Touch **Delete messages** to set the timing to permanently delete the messages in the trash folder.

- Touch **Display name** to enter a name that is attached to your outgoing voicemails as part of an identification string. See Edit the Display Name via the Voicemail Menu.
- Touch View quick tips tutorial to display some quick tips for using visual voicemail.
- Touch Help to go to the help page of Visual Voicemail.
- Touch Send feedback to send your feedback on the visual voicemail.
- Touch **Check for update** to search for an update to your Visual message software.
- Touch About Voicemail to view build information about the current visual voicemail application.

Change Your Main Greeting via the Voicemail Menu

Your main greeting can be changed directly via the Visual Voicemail system. This direct access saves you from having to navigate within the voicemail menu.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > **Voicemail**.
- 2. Touch Menu > Settings > Personalize voicemail.
- 3. Touch **OK** to connect to the voicemail system. Follow the prompts to change your current greeting.

Edit the Display Name via the Voicemail Menu

From your Visual Voicemail menu, you can quickly change the name or number attached to your voice messages.

- 1. Touch Home (> :::) > Voicemail.
- 2. Touch Menu > Settings > Display name.
- 3. Touch the field and enter an identifying name or number (used to identify you to recipients of your voice messages).
- 4. Touch **OK** to save your information.

- 2. Touch and hold 1 to dial your voicemail number.
- 3. Follow the system prompts to:
 - Create your password.
 - Record your name announcement.
 - Record your greeting.
- Important: Voicemail Password Sprint strongly recommends that you create a password when setting up your voicemail to protect against unauthorized access. Without a password, anyone who has access to your phone is able to access your voicemail messages.

Voicemail Notification

There are several ways your phone alerts you to a new voicemail message.

- By sounding the assigned ringer type.
- By displaying **within the notifications area of the status bar when new unheard** voicemail message(s) is received. The figure is the number of new messages. This icon means you have ten unheard new messages.
- Note: When you are roaming off the Nationwide Sprint Network, you may not receive notification of new voicemail messages. Sprint recommends that you periodically check your voicemail by dialing 1 + area code + your wireless phone number. When your voicemail answers, touch 📩 and enter your password. Roaming rates apply when you access voicemail while roaming off the Nationwide Sprint Network.
- **Note:** Your phone accepts messages even when it is turned off. However, your phone notifies you of new messages only when it is turned on and you are in a Sprint service area.

Retrieve Your Voicemail Messages

You can review your messages directly from your wireless phone (using either traditional voicemail or Visual Voicemail) or from any other touch-tone phone.

Use Traditional Voicemail to Access Your Messages

- 1. Touch **Home** () > **(**.
- 2. Touch and hold 1. If prompted, enter your voicemail password.
- 3. Follow the voice prompts to listen to and manage your voicemail messages.

Use Visual Voicemail to Access Your Messages

- 1. Touch Home (> :::) > Voicemail.
- 2. Touch an entry to listen to the message.
- **Note:** Depending on your plan, you may be charged for airtime minutes when you are accessing your voicemail from your wireless phone.

Use Another Phone to Access Messages

- 1. Dial your wireless phone number.
- 2. When your voicemail answers, press the asterisk key (*) on the phone.
- 3. Enter your password.

Caller ID

Caller ID identifies a caller before you answer the phone by displaying the number of the incoming call. If you do not want your number displayed when you make a call, follow these steps.

1. Touch **Home** () > ****.

- 3. Enter a phone number.
- 4. Touch 📞.

To permanently block your number, call Sprint Customer Service.

Call Waiting

When you're on a call, Call Waiting alerts you to incoming calls by sounding beeps. Your phone's screen informs you that another call is coming in and displays the caller's phone number (if available).

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:



To switch back to the first caller:

- ► Touch Switch calls.
- **Note:** For those calls where you don't want to be interrupted, you can temporarily disable Call Waiting by touching * 7 ··· 0 ··· before placing your call. Call Waiting is automatically reactivated once you end the call.

3-Way Calling

With 3-Way Calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

- 1. On the Phone screen, enter a number and touch 📞.
- 2. Once you have established the connection, touch **Add call**, and dial the second number. (This puts the first caller on hold and dials the second number.)
- 3. When you're connected to the second party, touch Merge calls.

If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all callers are disconnected.

▶ To end the 3-way call, touch 🚮.

Call Forwarding

Call Forwarding lets you forward all your incoming calls to another phone number—even when your phone is turned off. You can continue to make calls from your phone when you have activated Call Forwarding.

Note: You are charged a higher rate for calls you have forwarded.

Phone Calls

To activate Call Forwarding:

- 1. Touch Home 🗀 > 📞
- 2. Touch ★ 7[™] 2[™].
- 3. Enter the area code and phone number to which you want your calls forwarded.
- 4. Touch **C**. (You will hear a tone to confirm the activation of Call Forwarding.)

To deactivate Call Forwarding:

- 1. Touch **Home** (>).
- 2. Touch ★ 7[™] 2[™] 0⁺.
- 3. Touch **C**. (You will see a message and hear a tone to confirm the deactivation.)

Other Call Settings

Options under the Other Call Settings menu include North American and International dialing and TTY Mode.

North American Dialing

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \checkmark to display the phone screen.
- 2. Touch Menu > Settings.
- 3. Check **North American dialing** when placing international calls while in the United States or Canada. See Call Using the Plus (+) Code.

International Dialing

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > **\bigcirc** to display the phone screen.
- 2. Touch **Menu** > **Settings**.
- 3. Uncheck **North American dialing** and touch **International dialing** to set the international dialing code when placing international calls from outside the United States or Canada. See Make and Receive Worldwide Calls.

TTY Mode

A TTY (teletypewriter, also known as a TDD or Text Telephone) is a telecommunications device that allows people who are deaf, hard of hearing, or who have speech or language disabilities to communicate by telephone.

Phone Calls

Your phone is compatible with select TTY devices. Please check with the manufacturer of your TTY device to ensure that it supports digital wireless transmission. Your phone and TTY device will connect using a special cable that plugs into your phone's headset jack. If this cable was not provided with your TTY device, contact your TTY device manufacturer to purchase the connector cable.

When establishing your Sprint service, please call Sprint Customer Service using the state Telecommunications Relay Service (TRS) by first dialing 7 1 1 1. K. Then provide the state TRS with this number: 866-727-4889.

To turn TTY mode on or off:

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc to display the phone screen.
- 2. Touch Menu > Settings.
- 3. Touch **TTY mode**.
- 4. Touch **TTY Full**, **TTY HCO**, or **TTY VCO** to turn TTY mode on.

– or –

Touch **TTY Off** to turn TTY mode off.

Note: When enabled, TTY mode may impair the audio quality of non-TTY devices connected to the headset jack.

Warning: 911 Emergency Calling

Sprint recommends that TTY users make emergency calls by other means, including Telecommunications Relay Services (TRS), analog cellular, and landline communications. Wireless TTY calls to 911 may be corrupted when received by public safety answering points (PSAPs), rendering some communications unintelligible. The problem encountered appears related to TTY equipment or software used by PSAPs. This matter has been brought to the attention of the FCC, and the wireless industry and the PSAP community are currently working to resolve this.

In-Call Options

While you're on a call, you will see a number of onscreen options. Touch an option to select it.



- Add call: Touch to initiate a 3-way call.
- **End:** End the current call.
- **Dialpad/Hide:** Toggle the appearance of the onscreen dialpad to enter additional numbers such as an extension or access code.
 - For example, when you call your bank's 800 number, use your dialpad to enter your account number and PIN.
- Mute: Mute the microphone (
) during an active call, or unmute the microphone (
- **Speaker:** Route the phone's audio through the speaker (____) or through the earpiece (_____).

Warning: Because of higher volume levels, do not place the phone near your ear during speakerphone use.

Touch **Menu** during a call to display a list of additional in-call features. Touch an option to select it.

- Contacts: Display your contacts list.
- **Bluetooth:** Route the phone's audio through a connected Bluetooth headset (On) or through the speaker (Off).

Call Log

The Call log tab of the Phone application lists max. 500 recent incoming, outgoing, and missed calls.

View Recent Calls

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \checkmark to display the phone screen.
- 2. Touch () to display the Call log list.
 - You can determine if an entry was an incoming, outgoing, or a missed call from the icons shown below.
 - Incoming Call

Your phone's Bluetooth capabilities let you use wireless headsets, send and receive pictures and files, and more. For details on your phone's Bluetooth settings, see Bluetooth.

Data Usage

Your phone provides a new data usage chart feature which shows current usage as well as usages in a specific period of time.

View Data Usage by Application

You can view the amount of the data usage for the specific period of time.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Data usage.
- 2. Confirm Mobile data is set to _____.
- 3. Touch *a* next to **Data usage cycle** to change the period of time for which the chart will display the data usage.
- 4. Touch either of the white lines on the chart to display the tabs. Drag the white tabs horizontally to see the data usage of a specific period within the displayed cycle.
 - The usage amount will be displayed just below the chart.

Set Data Usage Limit

You can also set the limit for mobile data in case you don't have unlimited data plan which cuts off data at a specified threshold.

Warning: The usage displayed is measured by your phone. Your carrier's data usage accounting may differ and the usage in excess of your data limit plan can result in charges. Data usage limit set in this menu is not guaranteed to prevent additional charges.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Data usage.
- 2. Touch to check **Set mobile data limit**. Read the message and touch **OK**.
- 3. Drag the red tab vertically to set the limit you want.
 - When your data usage reaches the limit, mobile data will be turned off automatically.
- 4. Drag the orange tab vertically to set the level you receive a warning.
 - When your data usage reaches the level set with the orange line, you will see the message.

Restrict Data Usage by Application

You can restrict the background data usage.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Data usage.
- 2. Touch **Menu** > **Restrict background data** to check it.
- 3. Read the message and touch **OK**.
- **Tip:** You can see the Wi-Fi usage. Touch **Menu** > **Show Wi-Fi usage** to check it.

Airplane Mode

Airplane mode allows you to use many of your phone's features, such as Gallery, Camera, and Music, when you are on an airplane or in any other area where making or receiving calls or data is prohibited. When you set your phone to Airplane mode, it cannot send or receive any calls or access online information.

To quickly turn Airplane mode on or off:

Press and hold the Power button and touch Airplane mode in Phone options menu. While in Airplane mode, the status bar will display .

To turn Airplane mode on or off in Settings:

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > More
- 2. Touch the **Airplane mode** check box. While in Airplane mode, the status bar will display

Tethering & Portable Hotspot

The portable Wi-Fi hotspot turns your phone into a wireless router and shares your phone's data connection with one or more computers or mobile devices using Wi-Fi. For details on your phone's tethering and portable hotspot settings, see Portable Wi-Fi Hotspot.

Mobile Networks

The Mobile Networks menu lets you enjoy the data connection and configure the roaming settings outside the Nationwide Sprint Network. For details on roaming within the United States on your phone, see Roaming. For International roaming, see Enable Global Roaming Mode and International Data Roaming.

Enable Data

Enable data access to enjoy the data connection.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > More....
- 2. Touch **Mobile networks** and touch **Data enabled** to check it.

Connections Optimizer

Your phone can be set to automatically select the best mobile network.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > More....
- 2. Touch Mobile networks > Connections Optimizer.
- 3. Read the message and touch **I Agree**.

Touch **More Information** for further details. Read the message and leave the check box checked if you agree, or touch the check box to uncheck if you do not agree.

Roaming

Roaming is the ability to make or receive calls and access data services when you're off the Nationwide Sprint Network.

Roaming Icon

Your display screen always lets you know when you're off the Nationwide Sprint Network. Anytime you are roaming, the phone displays the roaming icon ().

Roaming on Other Networks

When you're roaming on other networks, your call quality and security will be similar to the quality you receive when making calls on the Nationwide Sprint Network. However, you may not be able to access certain features, such as data services, depending on the available network.

Note: If you're on a call when you leave the Nationwide Sprint Network, your call is dropped. If your call is dropped in an area where you think Sprint service is available, turn your phone off and on again to reconnect to the network.

Check for Voicemail Messages While Roaming

When you are roaming off the Nationwide Sprint Network, you may not receive on-phone notification of new voicemail messages. Callers can still leave messages, but you will need to periodically check your voicemail for new messages if you are in a roaming service area for an extended period of time.

- 1. Dial your area code + your phone number.
- 2. When you hear your voicemail greeting, touch \star .
- 3. Enter your password at the prompt and follow the voice prompts.

When you return to the Nationwide Sprint Network, voicemail notification will resume as normal.

Roaming Settings

Your phone allows you to control your roaming capabilities. By using the Roaming menu option, you can determine which signals your phone accepts. Choose from different settings on your phone to control your roaming experience.

To set the roaming mode:

1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings.

- 2. Touch More... > Mobile networks > Roaming > Roaming mode.
- 3. Select an option:
 - **Home only** to access only the Nationwide Sprint Network and prevent roaming on other networks for both voice and data communications.
 - Automatic to seek service on the Nationwide Sprint Network. When Sprint service is unavailable, the phone searches for an alternate service. If you select this option, select the type(s) of communication for which roaming should be allowed.

When the roaming mode is set to **Automatic**, you can specify which service are available while roaming.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings.
- 2. Touch More... > Mobile networks > Roaming.
- 3. Select an option:
 - Domestic voice to allow voice communication only on domestic roaming systems.
 - Domestic data to allow data communication only on domestic roaming systems.
 - International voice to allow voice communication on international roaming systems.
 - International data to allow data communication on international roaming systems.
- **Note:** Data service is not available without voice service for both domestic and international settings. Disabling voice service automatically disables its data service.

Roaming Guard

Your phone alerts you when you are roaming off the Nationwide Sprint Network by requiring an extra step before you can place or answer a call, or try to access data while roaming.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings.
- 2. Touch More... > Mobile networks > Roaming > Roaming guards.
- 3. Select each service you want to enable Roaming guards for:
 - Voice to display a prompt that will require you to respond anytime you attempt to access voice service while roaming in the selected region (DOMESTIC or INTERNATIONAL).
 - Data to display a prompt that will require you to respond anytime you attempt to access data service while roaming in the selected region (DOMESTIC or INTERNATIONAL). The prompt will not appear again while you are in the data session you allowed.

- **Outgoing SMS** to display a prompt that will require you to respond anytime you attempt to send a text message while roaming internationally.
- **Tip:** If you prefer not to use the Roaming guards feature, touch the **Never ask** check box and then touch **OK** or **Roam** while the alert dialog is displayed. You will not be notified of your roaming status until you enable Roaming guards again.

To place roaming calls with Roaming guards on:

- 1. Touch **Home** (> ****.
- 2. Touch the area code + the seven-digit number and touch 📞.
- 3. Read the message and touch **OK**.

To answer roaming calls with Roaming guards on:

To access data services while roaming with Roaming guards on:

To send a text message while roaming with Roaming guards on:

Read the message and touch Send now. Touch Save as draft to save the message as draft and send it later.

Volumes

Adjust your phone's volume settings to suit your needs and your environment.

Settings

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Sound > Volumes.
- 2. Drag the onscreen sliders to adjust the volume level of **Music**, video, games, & other media, Ringtone & notifications, or Alarms.
- 3. Touch OK.
- **Tip:** You can adjust the ringer volume in standby mode (or the earpiece volume during a call) by using the volume button on the left side of your phone.

Silent Mode

The Silent mode option allows you to mute all sounds or vibrate (except for media and alarm sounds).

- 1. Touch Home -> Menu > System settings > Sound > Silent mode.
- 2. Select your option:
 - Off to disable the silent mode.
 - Vibrate to mute all sounds but vibrate. You can select the vibrate pattern. See Vibrate Pattern.
 - Mute to mute all sounds.
- **Tip:** Press the volume button down in standby mode until you see

Phone Ringtone

You can select and assign ringtones for your incoming calls.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Sound > Phone ringtone.
- 2. Touch a ringtone from the available list. The ringtone briefly plays when selected.
- 3. Touch **OK** to assign a ringer.
- **Tip:** You can assign individual ringtones to your contacts. See Assign a Ringtone to a Contact.

Vibrate Pattern

You can select the vibrate pattern.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Sound > Vibrate Pattern.
- 2. Touch a vibrate pattern from the available list. Your phone briefly vibrates when selected.

3. Touch **OK** to assign a vibrate pattern.

Default Notification

Use the settings menus to assign specific ringtones for notifications.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Sound > Default notification.
- 2. Touch a notification sound from the available list. The sound briefly plays when selected.
- 3. Touch **OK** to assign a notification sound.

Vibrate and Ring

• Check this option to let your phone ring and vibrate simultaneously.

Persistent Alerts

This menu lets you set alerts, such as beep, vibration, or LED blinking for notification.

- 1. Touch Home -> Menu > System settings > Sound > Persistent alerts.
- 2. Check the following:
 - Audible tone to beep when notification is on the notification bar.
 - Vibrate to vibrate when notification is on the notification bar.
 - Blink LED to blink the LED indicator when notification is on the notification bar.
- 3. Touch **OK** to assign a persistent alert type.

System

The SYSTEM settings menu lets you select whether you hear tones when touching numbers on the dialpad, selecting onscreen options, and more.

- **Dial pad touch tones:** Check to play tones when using the dialpad.
- **Touch sounds:** Check to play sounds when making an onscreen selection.
- Screen lock sound: Check to play sounds when locking or unlocking the screen.
- Vibrate on touch: Check to vibrate when touching softkeys and during certain other instances.
- Hearing aid: Check to use your hearing aid device effectively.

Display

Adjusting your phone's display settings not only helps you see what you want, it can also help increase battery life.

Brightness

Adjust your screen's brightness to suit your surroundings.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Display > Brightness.
- 2. Drag the Brightness slider left or right to adjust the screen brightness.

Check Automatic brightness to set the brightness automatically.

3. Touch OK.

Wallpaper

Select wallpaper using this menu.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Display > Wallpaper.
- 2. Select the wallpaper you want to display on the screen.

Auto-Rotate Screen

Your phone is capable of automatically changing the orientation of some onscreen content. With this feature, you can view the screen in either portrait or landscape orientation by turning the phone sideways. By default, the screen orientation automatically changes when the phone is rotated.

To deactivate the Auto-rotate feature:

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Display.
- 2. Touch the **Auto-rotate screen** check box to uncheck it.

If you open the phone to access the keyboard, the screen automatically changes to the landscape orientation. See Slide-Out QWERTY Keyboard.

Sleep

Select the delay time before the screen automatically turns off.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Display > Sleep.
- 2. Touch a delay time to select it.

Settings

Font Size

Choose the font size of the screen as you like.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Display > Font size.
- 2. Select your favorite size.

Keyboard Timeout

Select the delay time before the keyboard backlight automatically turns off.

- 1. Touch Home () > Menu > System settings > Display > Keyboard timeout.
- 2. Touch a time delay to select it.

Screen Proximity Safety

Set the distance between your phone and your face that triggers your phone's proximity sensor to work.

Note: If you disable the proximity sensor, it may cause accidental key presses during a call.

- Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Display > Screen proximity safety.
- 2. Drag the slider left or right to adjust the distance from your face and touch **OK**.

Storage

The Storage settings menu lets you see the available space of the internal storage and the SD card on your phone and provides options for your microSD card. For SD card options, see microSD Card.

Battery

The battery menu lets you see the current battery status and which applications have been using the battery.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Battery.
- 2. Touch [# of hours, minutes and seconds] **on battery** to see the history details of the battery usage.

PC Connection

Set your phone's default connection mode when connected to the USB port of a computer.

1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > PC connection.

- 2. Touch **Default connection type** and select one of the following options:
 - Charge Only: Let your PC charge your phone only.
 - Mass Storage: Let your phone function as a removable disk when connected to the USB port of a computer.
 - Media Transfer: Let your phone function as a media device when connected to the USB port of a computer.
 - **Phone as Modem:** Let your phone function as a modem when connected to the USB port of a computer.
- 3. Check **Ask me** if you want to display the selection screen whenever you connect your phone to a computer.

If **Ask me** is checked, the selection screen is displayed whenever you connect your phone to a computer. If you want this selection set as default, check **Remember this choice** > **Done** on the selection screen.

Apps

This menu lets you view applications on your phone.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Apps.
- 2. Touch one of the following tabs to select the applications to be displayed:
 - **DOWNLOADED:** Select to display downloaded applications. You can also see the storage status on your phone at the bottom of the screen.
 - **ON SD CARD:** Select to display applications stored on the microSD card. You can also see the storage status on your SD card at the bottom of the screen.
 - RUNNING: Select to display currently running applications. You can also see the RAM status on your phone at the bottom of the screen. Touch SHOW CACHED PROCESSES to see the cached processes of the application.
 - ALL: Select to display all applications on your phone and the installed SD card.

Accounts & Sync

The Accounts & sync settings menu lets you add and manage your accounts and synchronize the calendar or contacts on your phone.

Add Account

You can add additional accounts to your phone.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu) > System settings > Accounts & sync.
- 2. Touch **ADD ACCOUNT**.
- 3. Touch an account type.
 - Corporate, Google, etc.
- 4. Enter your account information and touch **Next**.
- **Note:** Depending on the account type, you may need to enter an email address or user address, password, domain name, or other information. For corporate accounts, contact your server administrator to determine what information you will need.

General Sync Settings

Let applications synchronize data in the background, whether or not you are actively working in them.

As default your Google Accounts are automatically synced.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Accounts & sync.
- 2. If you see <u>on</u> at the upper right corner, your accounts will automatically sync. Touch the account with data you want to sync.
- 3. Touch the types of data you wish to synchronize automatically. (A check mark indicates the feature is enabled.)
- **Note:** If you do not want to sync your Google Account automatically, touch on at the upper right corner and confirm off is displayed.
- **Note:** If you want to remove the account, touch **Menu** > **Remove account**.

Location Services

Your phone is equipped with a Location feature for use in connection with location-based services. The Location services menu allows the network to detect your position. Turning Location services off will hide your location from everyone except **911**.

Google's Location Service

This service uses Wi-Fi and/or mobile networks to detect your location.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Location services.
- 2. Touch **Google's location service**. (A check mark indicates this feature is enabled.)
- 3. Read the disclaimer and touch **Agree**.

GPS Satellites

This service uses available GPS to pinpoint your location within certain applications such as Google Maps.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Location services.
- 2. Touch **GPS satellites**. (A check mark indicates this feature is enabled.)

Location & Google Search

This service lets Google use your location to improve search results and other services.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Location services.
- 2. Touch Location & Google search. (A check mark indicates this feature is enabled.)
- 3. Read the disclaimer and touch Agree.

Security

The Security settings menus let you set phone security, lock codes, passwords, administrator settings, and more.

Screen Lock

You can choose the way how your phone acts when the phone's display screen is turned on. As default, you must flick the lock button on the screen. See Turn the Screen On and Unlock It.

The security of your phone can be increased by drawing the correct pattern on the screen, entering the correct PIN, or entering the correct password to unlock the phone's control keys, buttons, and touchscreen.

If you fail to enter the correct pattern, PIN or password after five attempts, you will have to wait for 30 seconds before you can try again.

To use a pattern:

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Security > Screen lock.
- 2. Touch Pattern.



- 3. Read the information and study the example pattern on the screen and touch Next.
- 4. Draw the screen unlock pattern by connecting at least four dots in a vertical, horizontal, or diagonal direction. Lift your finger from the screen when finished.
- 5. The phone records the pattern. Touch **Continue**.
- 6. When prompted, draw the screen unlock pattern again, and then touch **Confirm**.
- **Note:** Clear the **Make pattern visible** check box if you do not want the pattern to be displayed on the screen when you draw it.

To use a PIN:

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Security > Screen lock.
- 2. Touch PIN.
- 3. Enter a PIN and touch **Continue**.
- 4. Enter your PIN again and touch **OK** to confirm it.

To use a password:

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Security > Screen lock.
- 2. Touch **Password**.
- 3. Enter a password and touch **Continue**.
- 4. Enter your password again and touch **OK** to confirm it.
- **Note:** Check the **Vibrate on touch** check box if you want the phone to vibrate when you draw the pattern or enter the PIN.
- **Note:** Touch **Automatically lock** to select the time duration before the screen lock feature activates.
- **Note:** Check the **Power button instantly locks** check box to activate the screen lock feature by pressing the **Power** button.
- Note: Touch Owner info to enter your information to be displayed on the lock screen.

To change or disable the screen lock:

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Security > Screen lock.
- 2. Draw your unlock screen pattern, or enter your PIN or password and touch **Next**.
- 3. Touch **None** to disable the screen lock or change the unlock mode. Touch **Slide** to return to the default lock pattern.

Encryption

Warning: Once the encryption is performed, it cannot be undone. The process to remove the encryption will be a factory data reset for the phone and a formatting for the SD card, which will delete all the data on the phone and the SD card respectively.

You can encrypt your phone and the SD card installed in your phone. To decrypt, you need to enter a PIN or password.

- 1. Charge the battery first.
- 2. With your phone connected to the power source, touch **Home** \bigcirc > **Menu** \bigcirc .
- 3. Touch **System settings** > **Security** > **Encrypt data**.
- 4. Select the target to be encrypted from **Phone & SD card**, **Phone**, or **SD card**.
- 5. Read the message and touch **Next**.
- 6. Enter a PIN or password and touch **Next**.
- 7. Read the message and touch **Encrypt**.

Warning: Refrain from using the phone, including removing the battery and the SD card, during the encryption process as some or all of your data will be lost if the encryption process is interrupted.

Passwords

You can hide your password or PIN number as you type it.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Security.
- 2. Clear the **Make passwords visible** check box.

Device Administrators

You can disable the authority to be a device administrator of certain applications. If disabled, you will typically lose some functionality in those applications, such as the ability to sync new email or calendar events to your phone.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Security > Device administrators.
- 2. Touch an application you want to disable the authority to be a device administrator.

Unknown Sources

Follow the steps below to install non-Play Store applications.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Security.
- 2. Touch **Unknown sources** > **OK**. (A check mark indicates this feature is enabled.)

Credential Storage

You can see the trusted credentials on your phone's system.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Security > Trusted credentials.
- 2. Touch an item to read the information.

You can install encrypted certificates from the SD card.

- 1. Touch Home -> Menu > System settings > Security > Install from SD card.
- 2. Touch an available certificate.
- 3. Follow the onscreen instructions.

You can remove all the credentials on your phone.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Security > Clear credentials.
- 2. Touch OK.

Language & Input

Your phone's Language & input settings let you select a language for the phone's screens and menus, as well as manage a personal user dictionary. The keyboard settings let you select a preferred input method, control keyboard settings, and more. For details, see Enter Text.

This menu also provides the settings when using voice function. See Text-to-Speech Settings and Voice Search.

Language

You can choose to display your phone's onscreen menus in English or in Spanish.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Language & input > Language.
- 2. Touch English or Español.

Backup & Reset

This menu helps you to back up and restore your data.

Back Up My Data

You can back up your settings to a Google server.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Backup & reset.
- 2. Touch **Back up my data**. (A check mark indicates this feature is enabled.)

Automatic Restore

Check this option to restore your settings and other data when you install an application.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Backup & reset.
- 2. Touch Automatic restore. (A check mark indicates this feature is enabled.)

Factory Data Reset

Your phone's Backup & reset menu includes the **Factory data reset** option. This option lets you reset your phone to the original factory settings, which erases all data from the phone's application storage, including:

- Your Google Account
- All other email and social networking accounts

- System and application data and settings
- Downloaded applications

To reset your phone:

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Backup & reset > Factory data reset.
- 2. Read the Factory data reset information, check the **Erase SD card** box if necessary, and touch **Reset phone**.
- 3. Touch **Erase everything**. Your phone will power down and reset itself, which may take up to 10 minutes.

System



Scroll through the list to view all your contacts. To see a specific entry, scroll to it and touch it.

Contacts List Options

You can manage your contacts from the contacts list.

- Touch \square_{\perp} to add a contact. See Add a Contact.
- Touch \mathbf{Q} to search a contact.

You can also touch Menu To display the contacts list options.

- Contacts to display: Selects contacts to be displayed on People. See Display Options.
- Import/export: Imports/exports contacts from/to the microSD card.
- Accounts: Opens the Accounts & sync settings screen. See Accounts & Sync.
- **Settings:** Opens the Display options page. You can select how your contacts are displayed. See Display Options.

Add a Contact

Enter details such as name, phone numbers, email addresses, mailing addresses, and more.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > People.
- 2. Touch \square_{+} .
 - You may be prompted to select a type of the contact:

- Select an account to save contacts to from the displayed list.



 - 5. Touch **Next**. The inbox of the account is displayed.

Add a Corporate Account

If you synchronize your phone with your corporate account, you can read, manage, and send email in the same easy way as with a POP3/IMAP account. However, you can also access some powerful Exchange features.

- 3. Enter your **Email address** and **Password** information, and then touch **Next**. Consult your network administrator for further details:
 - Email address: your corporate email address.
 - Password: typically your network access password (case-sensitive).
- 4. Enter the **Domain\Username**, **Password**, and **Server** information and touch **Next**:
 - Domain\Username: enter your network domain\login username.
 - Password: typically your network access password (case-sensitive).
 - **Server:** your exchange server remote email address. Typically it is in the form mail.XXX.com. Obtain this information from your company's network administrator.
- 5. If your network requires SSL encryption, touch the **Use secure connection (SSL)** box to place a check mark and activate this additional level of security. If your exchange server requires this feature, leaving this field unchecked can prevent connection.
- 6. If the onscreen activation disclaimer is displayed, touch **Next**.
- 7. Configure your Inbox checking frequency, Days to sync (days to synchronize between your phone and server), and activate any other email settings, then touch **Next**.
- **Note:** Signal interruptions or incorrect user name or password information can cause completion issues.
 - 8. Identify your new account with a unique name, provide the outgoing name, and then touch **Done**.
- **Note:** You can have multiple corporate email accounts active on your phone.
- **Note:** Your corporate Exchange Server must support auto-detect for the phone to automatically set up the Exchange ActiveSync account. If your corporate Exchange Server does not support auto-detect, you will need to enter your Exchange Server settings after you touch **Next**. Ask your Exchange Server administrator for details.

Email Account Settings

You can edit settings for your individual email accounts, such as email address and password, name display and signature, frequency of retrieval, and more.

- 4. Set the following options:

 - Default account: Check to assign this account as the default email used for outgoing messages.
 - Inbox check frequency: Touch to select the time interval used by your phone to check your new emails from Automatic (Push) (corporate only), Never, Every 5 minutes, Every 10 minutes, Every 15 minutes, Every 30 minutes, and Every hour.
 - Days to sync: Set a period of time to synchronize your account (corporate account only).
 - Sync email: Check to synchronize your email (corporate account only).
 - **Sync contacts:** Check to synchronize your contacts (corporate account only).
 - Sync calendar: Check to synchronize your calendar (corporate account only).

- Download attachments: Check if you want to automatically download attachments via Wi-Fi.
- **Email notifications:** Check to display the email notification icon on the status bar when a new mail is received.
 - Choose ringtone: Select a ringtone for new email messages.
 - Vibrate: Select a vibration pattern for new email messages.

- Outgoing settings: Adjust the outgoing parameters, such as username, password, and other outgoing connection parameters (ex: SMTP server, not for a corporate account).
- **Out of office settings:** Set your current status and your message to reply automatically while you are out of the office (corporate account only).
- **Remove account:** Touch to remove the account.

Delete an Email Account

If you no longer want an email account on your phone, you can delete it through the mail settings menu.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Email.
- 2. Touch Menu > Settings.
- 3. Select the account you want to delete.
- 4. Touch **Remove account** > **OK**.

Text Messaging and MMS

With Text Messaging (SMS), you can send and receive instant text messages between your wireless phone and another messaging-ready phone.

Multimedia messages, or MMS, can contain text and pictures, recorded voice, audio or video files, or picture slideshows.

See your service plan for applicable charges for messaging.



Compose Text Messages

Quickly compose and send text messages on your phone.

- 1. Touch **Home** > . > Messaging.
- 2. On the Messaging screen, touch \blacksquare_{\perp} . The compose screen opens.
- 3. Fill in one or more recipients.
 - Enter phone numbers or email addresses in the **To** field. If you're sending the message to several recipients, separate the phone numbers or email addresses with commas. As you enter information, any matching phone numbers or addresses from your contacts list are displayed. Touch a match to enter that number or address.



Note: You can add a subject line by touching **Menu** > **Add subject**.

- 4. Touch **Type message** and then start composing your message.
- 5. When done, touch > to send the text message.

Send a Multimedia Message (MMS)

When you need to add a little more to a text message, you can send a multimedia message (MMS) with pictures, recorded voices, or audio or video files, or slideshows.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Messaging.
- 2. On the Messaging screen, touch E. The compose screen opens.
- 3. Fill in one or more recipients.
 - Enter phone numbers or email addresses in the **To** field. If you're sending the message to several recipients, separate the phone numbers or email addresses with commas. As you enter information, any matching phone numbers or addresses from your contacts list are displayed. Touch a match to enter that number or address.

Note: You can add a subject line by touching **Menu** > **Add subject**.

- 4. Touch **Type message** and then start composing your message.
- 5. Touch () and select from the following file attachments:
 - **Pictures:** Open **Gallery** to attach a photo from your storage card.
 - Capture picture: Run the camera application to take a photo and attach it.
 - Videos: Open Gallery to attach a video from your storage card.
 - **Capture video:** Run the camcorder application to record a video and attach it.
 - Audio: Select a ringtone and attach it.
 - **Record audio:** Run the voice recorder application to create a recording and attach it.
 - Slideshow: See Create a Slideshow for details.
- 6. To make changes to your attachment, touch **Replace** or **Remove**.
- 7. Touch $\sum_{k=1}^{MMS}$ to send the MMS message.

Create a Slideshow

In a multimedia message, you can add slides, each containing a photo, video, or audio.

- 1. In the multimedia message you're composing, touch \gg > Slideshow.
- 2. To compose your slideshow, do any of the following:
 - Touch Add slide to create a new slide. (This is a placeholder for new images to be added, similar to a playlist.)
 - Touch the created slide (example, Slide 1), touch **Add picture**, and then select the picture you want to add to the slide.

- Touch the text field below the image to enter a caption for the picture.
- Touch Preview (to preview the slide), Replace picture (to delete the currently selected picture), Remove slide, or touch Menu > Add music, Add slide, Duration, or Layout.
- When finished, touch **Done** to attach the slideshow to your message.
- 3. When you have finished composing the multimedia message, touch $\sum_{n=1}^{MS}$ or **Send**.

Save and Resume a Draft Message

While composing a text or multimedia message, touch **Back** \bigcirc > **Yes** to save your message as a draft.

To resume composing the message:

- 1. On the Messaging screen, touch the message to resume editing. "Draft" in red appears at the right of the message in the list.
- 2. When you finish editing the message, touch \triangleright or $\overset{\text{MMS}}{\triangleright}$.

New Messages Notification

Depending on your notification settings, the phone will play a ringtone, vibrate, or display the message briefly in the status bar when you receive a new text or multimedia message. To change the notification for new text and multimedia messages, see Text and MMS Options for details.

A new message icon 💭 or 🔽 also appears in the notifications area of the status bar to notify you of a new text or multimedia message.

To open the message, slide the status bar down to open the Notifications panel. Touch the new message to open and read it. For information on reading and replying to messages see Manage Message Conversations.

Manage Message Conversations

Text and multimedia messages that are sent to and received from a contact (or a number) are grouped into conversations or message threads in the Messaging screen. Threaded text or multimedia messages let you see exchanged messages (similar to a chat program) with a contact on the screen.

Read a Text Message

► Do one of the following:

- On the Messaging screen, touch the text message or message thread to open and read it.
- If you have a new message notification, slide the status bar down to open the Notifications panel. Touch the new message to open and read it.

To return to the Messaging screen from a text message thread, touch **Back** (-).

- **Note:** To view the details of a particular message, in the message thread, touch the message to open the options menu, and then touch **View details**.
- **Note:** If a message contains a link to a Web page, touch the message and then touch the link to open it in the Web browser.
- **Note:** If a message contains a phone number, touch the message to dial the number or touch and hold the message to add the number to your contacts.

View a Multimedia Message (MMS)

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Messaging.
- 2. On the Messaging screen, touch a multimedia message or message thread to open it.
- 3. Touch the attachment to open it.
- 4. To save the attachment to the storage card, touch and hold the message, and then touch **Save attachment** on the options menu.
- **Note:** When **Auto-retrieve** in MMS settings is disabled, only the message header is downloaded. To download the entire message, touch the **Download** button at the right side of the message. For details, see **Text** and MMS Options.
- **Note:** If you are concerned about the size of your data downloads, check the multimedia message size before you download it.

Reply With a Multimedia Message (MMS)

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Messaging.
- 2. On the Messaging screen, touch a text or multimedia message thread to open it.
- Touch the text box at the bottom of the screen, enter your reply message, attach files, and then touch
- **Note:** To reply to a text message with a multimedia message, open the text message and touch (1). The text message is automatically converted into a multimedia message.

Delete a Message Thread

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Messaging.
- 2. On the Messaging screen, touch and hold the message thread that you want to delete.
- 3. Touch 🚔.
- 4. When prompted to confirm, touch **Delete**.

Delete a Single Message

- 1. While viewing a message thread, touch and hold the message that you want to delete.
- 2. From the options menu, touch **Delete**.
- 3. When prompted to confirm, touch **Delete**.

When you have received a message from someone in your stored contacts, you can touch the contact's photo or icon in the message thread to open a menu of options. Depending on the stored contact information, you can view the contact details, phone or send an email message to the contact, and more.

Text and MMS Options

The messages settings menu lets you control options for your text and MMS messages including message limits, size settings, and notifications.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Messaging.
- 2. Touch **Menu** > **Settings**. You can set the following options:

Storage Settings

- **Delete old messages:** Automatically deletes older messages when the set limits are reached.
- **Text message limit:** Choose the maximum number of text messages to store in each conversation thread.
- **Multimedia message limit:** Choose the maximum number of MMS messages to store in each conversation thread.

Text (SMS) Messages Settings

• **Emergency Alerts:** Sets the federally supervised cell phone alert services to send out broadcast SMS messages for public warning:

- Presidential: Receives an emergency presidential alert. (Presidential is always grayed out [not selectable] and cannot be excluded.)
- Imminent Threat Extreme: Select this option if you want to receive emergency alerts in an extreme emergency situation (an extraordinary threat to life or property).
- Imminent Threat Severe: Select this option if you want to receive emergency alerts in a severe emergency situation (a significant threat to life or property).
- **Amber:** Select this option if you want to receive alerts related to missing or endangered children.
- **Emergency Alerts Test:** Select this option if you want to receive a test message to make sure that the alert messages can be successfully received.
- Help: Displays the help information for Emergency Alerts.

Multimedia (MMS) Messages Settings

• **Auto-retrieve:** Select this option to automatically retrieve all your multimedia messages completely. When selected, the multimedia message header plus the message body and attachments will automatically download to your phone. If you clear this check box, only the multimedia message header will be retrieved and shown in your Messaging screen.

Notifications Settings

- **Notifications:** Select this option if you want to receive a notification in the status bar when a new text or multimedia message arrives.
 - **Choose ringtone:** Select a ringtone that is specific to new text and multimedia messages. Note that the ringtone briefly plays when selected.
 - **Vibrate:** Select when your phone to vibrate when a new text or multimedia message arrives.

► Touch **Home** → **YouTube**. The library screen appears.

Note: Terms of Service may appear. Touch Accept, if you agree to the Terms of Service.

Watch YouTube Videos





Find and Install an App

When you install apps from the Google Play Store app and use them on your phone, they may require access to your personal information (such as your location, contact data, and more) or access to certain functions or settings of your phone. Download and install only apps that you trust.

- 1. Touch Home > : > Play Store.
- 2. When you open the Google Play Store app for the first time, the Terms of Service window will appear. Touch **Accept** to continue.
- 3. Find an app you want and touch it to open its details screen.



- **Note:** The Google Play Store screen shots and options may vary depending on the version installed on your phone. Your Google Play Store app will update automatically when available.
 - 4. Touch an app to read a description about the app and user reviews.
 - 5. Touch **Download** (for free applications) or the price icon (for paid applications).

Note: You need a Google Wallet account to purchase items on Google Play. See Create a Google Wallet Account to set up a Google Wallet account if you do not have one.

6. The subsequent screen notifies you whether the app will require access to your personal information or access to certain functions or settings of your phone. If you agree to the conditions, touch Accept & download (for free applications) or Accept & buy (for paid application) to begin downloading and installing the app.

If you selected a paid application, after touching **Accept & buy**, you're redirected to the Google Wallet screen to pay for the application before it's downloaded to your phone.



Open Google Maps



Find Your Current Location

Note: Don't forget to set your location sources.

On the Google Maps screen, touch (). A blinking blue arrow indicates your current location on the map. This feature is available when **Google's location service** or **GPS satellites** is enabled. See Location Services.

Search Maps

- 1. On the Google Maps screen, touch Q_{\bullet} .
- 2. Type the place that you want to search. You can enter an address, a city, or type of establishment.

Tip: Touch \bigcup to search by speaking the location you are searching.

- 3. Touch search or **Q**. A callout label appears on the map to indicate the location.
- 4. Touch the callout to open the menu for the location.

Add Map Layers

Layers allow you to view locations and additional info overlaid on the map.

On the Google Maps screen, touch 📚 and then touch one or more of the following options:

- **Traffic:** Add this layer to view real-time traffic conditions with roads marked in colorcoded lines that indicate the traffic condition. This mode is available in selected areas only.
- **Satellite:** Add this layer to use the same satellite data as Google Earth. The images are not real-time and are approximately one to three years old.
- **Terrain:** Add this layer for a shaded relief view of topographic features.
- **Transit Lines:** Add this layer to provide geographic representations of transit lines. This mode is available in selected areas only.
- Latitude: Add this layer to see your friends' locations and share yours with them. You may sign in with your Google Account to use this feature.
- My Maps: Adds this layer to display Google My Maps on Google Maps of your phone.
- **Bicycling:** Adds this layer to provide the road map suitable for bicycling.
- **Wikipedia:** Adds this layer to provide a list of Wikipedia articles that are geo-referenced. An extract of the Wikipedia article can be accessed by clicking on the icon, a link to the full version of the Wikipedia article is also available.

Get Directions

- 1. On the Google Maps screen, touch 📀
- 2. Do one of the following:
 - The starting point is set to your current location as default. Touch default to change your starting point place.
 - Touch End point: and type your destination or touch destination from the list.
- 3. Select the way to get to the destination (by car, by train, or by foot).

 Touch GET DIRECTIONS. The directions to your destination appear in a list or on the map. Touch NAVIGATION to open Google Navigation to navigate you to your destination.

Clear the Map

When you have reached your destination, touch **Menu** > **Clear Map** to reset the map.

TeleNav GPS Navigator

TeleNav GPS Navigator gives you turn-by-turn directions onscreen and over speakerphone.

Google Latitude

Google Latitude[™] user location service lets you and your friends share locations and status messages with each other. It also lets you send instant messages and emails, make phone calls, and get directions to your friends' locations.

Your location is not shared automatically. You must join Latitude, and then invite your friends to view your location or accept their invitations.

Open Latitude

To join Latitude:

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Latitude.
- 2. Read the privacy policy. If you agree with it, touch Agree & Continue.

After you join Latitude, you can start sharing your locations with your friends. Only friends that you have explicitly invited or accepted can see your location.

To open Latitude after joining:

 - Touch **MAP VIEW** to see your friend on Google Maps.
 - Touch $\Delta_{\mathbf{k}}$ to invite your friend to Latitude.

 - Touch Menu > Location settings > Location reporting to configure your location reporting and sharing.

- 1. In Latitude, touch Δ_{μ} .
- 2. Choose how to add friends:
 - Select from Contacts: Select any number of friends from contacts.
 - Add via email address: Enter an email address and touch Add friends.
- 3. Confirm your friend is checked and touch **Yes**.

If your friends already use Latitude, they receive an email request and a notification on Latitude. If they have not yet joined Latitude, they receive an email request that tells them to sign in to Latitude with their Google Account.

Accept an Invitation

When you get a sharing request from a friend, you see "... new sharing requests" message. Touch it and you can:

- Accept and share back: You can see your friends' locations, and they can see yours.
- Accept, but hide my location: You can see your friends' locations, but they can't see yours.
- **Don't accept:** No location information is shared between you and your friends.

You can change how your location is shared with each friend at any time. See Retrieve Voicemail Messages for details.

Show Your Friends

You can show your friends using the map view or the list view.

Map View:

Touch **MAP VIEW** on the Latitude screen. Google Maps[™] shows your friends' locations. Each friend is represented by a photo icon with an arrow pointing at his or her approximate location. If a friend has opted to enable city-level sharing, his or her icon will not have an arrow and it appears in the middle of the city. See Retrieve Voicemail Messages for more details.

To see your friend's profile and connect with him or her, touch the photo. This will display your friend's name, and then touch the balloon right above his or her icon.

List View:

To show a list of your friends, in Google Maps, touch **FRIENDS LIST**.

To see a friend's profile and connect with him or her, select your friend's name from the list.

Connect with Your Friends

Touch a friend's contact details balloon in map view or touch a friend in list view to open the friend's profile. In the profile screen, you can communicate with your friend and set privacy options.

- Map: Find a friend's location on the map.
- Directions: Get directions to the friend's location.
- **Ping for check in:** Send this friend a notification asking them to check in.
- Manage sharing: Select from the following:
 - Share best available location: Share your precise location information.
 - Share only city level location: Share only the city you are in, not the street-level location. Your friend can see your photo icon in the middle of the city you are in. To share more precise location again, touch Share best available location.
 - **Hide from this friend:** Stop sharing your location with this friend, both in list view and in map view.
- **Remove this friend:** Remove the friend from your list and stop sharing locations with him or her altogether.

Change Privacy Settings

You have control over how and when you can be found by your friends. Only the last location sent to Latitude is stored with your Google Account. If you turn off Latitude or are hiding, no location is stored.

To change your public profile:

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Latitude.
- 2. Touch your own name, and then touch **Location settings**.

– or –

Touch Menu > Location settings.

- 3. Set the following options to your preferences.
 - Location reporting: Let Latitude detect and update your location as you move. The update frequency is determined by several factors, such as how recently your location has changed.
 - Enable location history: Store your past location and visualize them on the Latitude website.
 - Manage your friends: Add or remove friends who can see your location.
 - **Sign out of Latitude:** Disable Latitude and stop sharing your location or status. You can always join Latitude again.
 - Automatic check-ins: Check you into places you have designated.
 - Check-in notifications: Enable notifications that suggest places to check in.
 - Manage your places: View and modify your automatic check-ins and muted places.

Music Player

The **Play Music** app plays digital audio files saved on the storage card. You need to copy music files to your storage card first to use the Music application. See Use the Phone's microSD Card as a USB Drive for more details on copying files.

Note: If you have signed up for Google Music[™], the first time you open the Music application you will be prompted to select the account whose online music library you want to access from the Android Music application. Follow the onscreen instructions to continue.



 - **PLAYLISTS** to select a customized playlist you've created.
 - **GENRES** to show your music library sorted by genre.
- 2. Touch a song in your library to play it. The Now playing screen opens.

– or –

Touch the triangular menu button __ next to an item and touch Play.



3. Touch <u>show options</u>. The following options are available for the control:



- Drag the slider to rewind or fast-forward.
- Touch II to pause. Touch > to resume playing.

- Touch I to go back to the start of the currently played piece. Touch I to jump to the start of the next piece.
- Touch \Rightarrow to toggle shuffle on or off.
- Touch
 to cycle through the repeat modes: Repeating all songs, Repeating current song, or Repeat is off.

Display Additional Options

While using the Music application you can touch the triangular menu button *a* next to any song, album, artist, or playlist to view additional options. These options may vary depending on the music data.

- **Play** to play the song.
- Add to playlist to add the song to the playlist.
- More by artist to show another album of the selected artist.
- Shop for artist to open the browser and find items related to the artist.
- **Search** to conduct a search using the application that you select.
- **Delete** to delete the song.
- **Tip:** To change the settings in the Android Play Music application, touch **Menu** from the Music library screen, and then touch **Settings**.

Search for Music in the Music Library

Follow the instructions to find music in your Music library.

- 1. Open the Music library and touch the Search icon Q_{\bullet} .
- 2. Start typing the name of the artist, album, song, or playlist you're looking for. As you type, matching information is displayed on the screen.
- 3. To select a matched item, touch the item.

Use Playlists

Create a playlist to organize your music.

Create Playlists

- 1. Open the Music library and browse for the song that you want to add to the playlist.
- 2. Touch 🖌 next to the song you want to add and touch Add to playlist.

Apps and Entertainment

- 3. On the Add to playlist window, touch **New playlist**.
- 4. Type the name of your new playlist and touch **OK**. After you save the playlist, it's added to the Playlists library.

- 2. Touch the playlist that contains the music you want to remove.
- 3. Touch __ next to the song you want to remove and touch **Remove from playlist**.

Rename Playlists

- 1. Open the Playlists library.
- 2. Touch __ next to the playlist you want to rename and touch **Rename**.
- 3. Type the new name of the playlist and touch **Rename**.

Play Song in Playlists

- 1. Open the Playlists library.
- 2. Touch *a* next to the song you want to play and touch **Play**.

Delete Playlists

- 1. Open the Playlists library.
- 2. Touch 🖌 next to the playlist you want to delete and touch **Delete**.
- 3. Touch **OK** to confirm.

Back Up Your Downloaded Music Files

Sprint recommends you back up your downloaded music files to your computer. Although the downloaded files can only be played on your phone and on your account, backing them up to your computer lets you access the files in case your microSD card is lost or damaged, or if you install a new microSD card. See Use the Phone's microSD Card as a USB Drive.

Apps and Entertainment

- 1. Connect your phone to your computer using a USB cable.
- 2. Use your computer to navigate to the microSD card's Music folder.
- 3. Select and copy the music files to a folder on your computer's hard drive.

Sprint TV & Movies

With Sprint TV & Movies, you can watch live TV and access movies and other on demand entertainment on the go.

- Note: If Sprint TV & Movies isn't already installed on your phone, you can download it from Sprint Zone: Touch Home > :::> Sprint Zone > Sprint SUGGESTS and scroll down to Sprint TV & Movies under the Sprint Applications tab.

Watch TV

- 1. Touch **Home** > ::: > Sprint TV & Movies. Depending on your settings, your phone may prompt you to accept a data connection.
- **Note:** SprintTV can only be viewed over a cellular connection. Turn off your Wi-Fi communication prior to using this application. If prompted, touch **Disable Wi-Fi** to continue.
 - 2. Select Live TV, On Demand, Movies, Shops, or Help to display channel options.
 - 3. Touch an entry to select a channel from the Sprint TV listings or to select an available category.

Portable Wi-Fi Hotspot

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi provides wireless Internet access over distances of up to 300 feet. To use your phone's Wi-Fi, you need access to a wireless access point or "hotspot."

The availability and range of the Wi-Fi signal depends on a number of factors, including infrastructure and other objects through which the signal passes.

Use the wireless & networks setting menu to enable your phone's Wi-Fi radio and connect to an available Wi-Fi network.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings.
- 2. If **OFF** is displayed at the right of Wi-Fi, Touch it to turn Wi-Fi on. **ON** is displayed and the phone will scan for available wireless networks.
- 3. Touch **Wi-Fi**. The network names and security settings (open network or secured with WEP/WPA/WPA2 PSK) of detected Wi-Fi networks are displayed.

4. Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect. If you selected an open network, you will be automatically connected to the network. If you selected a network that is secured, enter the key, and then touch **Connect**.

Depending on the network type and its security settings, you may also need to enter more information or choose a security certificate.

When your phone is connected to a wireless network, the Wi-Fi icon () appears in the status bar and tells you the approximate signal strength. (The above icon indicates maximum signal strength.)

If **Network notification** is enabled, this icon (??) appears in the status bar whenever the

phone detects an available open wireless network within range. Touch **Menu** > **Advanced**, and check **Network notification**.

- **Note:** The next time your phone connects to a previously accessed secured wireless network, you will not be prompted to enter the security key again, unless you reset your phone to its factory default settings.
- **Note:** Wi-Fi networks are self-discoverable, which means no additional steps are required for your phone to connect to a Wi-Fi network. It may be necessary to provide a user name and password for certain closed wireless networks.

Check the Wireless Network Status

Check the status of your current wireless network, including speed and signal strength, through the Wireless & networks settings menu.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Touch the wireless network that the phone is currently connected to. You will see a message box showing the Wi-Fi network name, status, speed, signal strength, and other details.
- **Note:** If you want to remove the phone's wireless network settings, touch **Forget** on this window. You need to enter the settings again if you want to connect to this wireless network.

Connect to a Different Wi-Fi Network

Use the Wireless & networks settings to scan for and connect to a different Wi-Fi network.

- 1. Touch **Home** > **Menu** > **System settings** > **Wi-Fi**. Detected Wi-Fi networks are displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section. To manually scan for available Wi-Fi networks touch **SCAN**.
- 2. Touch another Wi-Fi network to connect to it.
- **Note:** If the wireless network you want to connect to is not in the list of detected networks, touch **ADD NETWORK**, enter the wireless network settings and then touch **Save**.

Sprint Connections Optimizer

The Sprint Connections Optimizer will help you get the most out of your data experience. Rather than having to remember to turn off/on network settings, the Sprint Connections Optimizer will automatically do this for you and connect to Wi-Fi networks in your remembered list.

How to Use Sprint Connections Optimizer

Setting up your phone to automatically connect to your preferred Wi-Fi connections is as easy as checking a box.

To enable the feature:

See Connections Optimizer.

To set up your preferred Wi-Fi connections:

Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Wi-Fi. See Turn Wi-Fi On and Connect to a Wireless Network for details. This will make the connection to these networks automatic when in range. These are considered 'remembered' networks.

Note: Refrain from manually toggling the radios on or off. Manually turning the radios off will temporarily disable the Sprint Connections Optimizer.

To disable the feature:

Touch Home > Menu > System settings > More... > Mobile networks > Connections Optimizer and uncheck the Connections Optimizer check box.

The Wi-Fi radio on your phone will be automatically turned on at pre-specified locations and times of day. Your phone will then scan to identify available Wi-Fi networks and automatically connect to those you've previously specified.

FAQs

Below is a list of the most frequently asked questions about Sprint Connections Optimizer.

• Q: Is there an additional charge for Sprint Connections Optimizer?

A: No, Sprint does not charge a fee for enabling or using this feature.

• Q: Is Sprint Connections Optimizer a secure feature?

A: Yes, customer specific information is not used by the feature and the Sprint Connections Optimizer will not automatically connect you to open Wi-Fi networks. Open Wi-Fi networks must be manually setup as a remembered network in the Wi-Fi section of Settings in order to establish an automatic connection.

• Q: How will my phone find the same Wi-Fi networks every time?

A: Customers should setup their preferred Wi-Fi connections in the Wi-Fi section within Settings. When the Wi-Fi radio is on and the phone is in range of a remembered Wi-Fi network, Wi-Fi connection occurs automatically. There are no limits to the number of access points that can be remembered.

• Q: Is Wi-Fi secure?

A: Yes, when using a secure, password protected Wi-Fi network. There is no data security when using an open, unsecured Wi-Fi network unless you are running VPN software, which encrypts the data.

• Q: Will Sprint connect me automatically to an unsecured Wi-Fi network?

A: No. Sprint Connections Optimizer will not automatically connect you to open Wi-Fi networks. Open Wi-Fi networks must be manually setup as a remembered network in the Wi-Fi section of Settings in order to establish automatic connection.

• Q: Will Sprint connect me automatically to a Wi-Fi network that charges for use?

A: No. Sprint Connections Optimizer will not automatically connect customers to paid Wi-Fi networks. Customers using paid Wi-Fi networks must accept the third party charges each time they connect.

• Q: How do I forget a remembered Wi-Fi network?

A: Customers can choose to forget a remembered Wi-Fi network by the following: Touch **Home** > **Menu** > **System settings** > **Wi-Fi**. Touch the remembered Wi-Fi network > **Forget**.

• Q: What is the difference between a Wi-Fi network and Sprint Mobile Hotspot?

A: Wi-Fi is a wireless technology that allows connection to the Internet when in range of an access point. Sprint Mobile Hotspot is an attachable option for wireless phones, essentially turning them into an access point to connect other Wi-Fi enabled devices to the Internet.

• Q: Can the Sprint Connections Optimizer be deleted?

A: The feature cannot be deleted from the phone like applications, however, it can be disabled by touching Home () > Menu () > System setting > More... > Mobile Networks > Connections Optimizer and unchecking the Connections Optimizer check box.

Data Services

With your Sprint service, you are ready to start enjoying the advantages of data services. This section will help you learn the basics of using your data services, including managing your user name, launching a data connection, and navigating the Web with your phone.

Important: Certain data services requests may require additional time to process. While your phone is loading the requested service, the touchscreen or QWERTY keyboard may appear unresponsive when in fact they are functioning properly. Allow the phone some time to process your data usage request.

Your User Name

Your User Name

When you buy your phone and sign up for service, you're automatically assigned a user name, which is typically based on your name and a number, followed by "@sprintpcs.com." (For example, the third John Smith to sign up for Sprint data services might have jsmith003@sprintpcs.com as his user name.)

When you use data services, your user name is submitted to identify you to the Nationwide Sprint Network. Your user name is automatically programmed into your phone. You don't have to enter it.

Update Your User Name

If you choose to change your user name and select a new one online, or make any changes to your services, you must then update the profile on your phone.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > System update.
- 2. Touch **Update profile**.

Launch a Web Connection

Launching a Web connection is as simple as opening the browser on your phone.

- ► Touch **Home** > ::: > **Browser**. (Your data connection starts and you see the home page.)
- **Note:** Internet connections can be made either through the Sprint service or via Wi-Fi (configured within the **Settings** > **Wi-Fi**).
- Tip: To change the phone's default launch page to your current page, touch Menu > Settings > General > Set homepage > Current page.
- **Note:** The Browser automatically launches when a Web link is touched from within either an email or text message.

Data Connection Status and Indicators

Your phone displays the current status of your data connection through indicators at the top of the screen. The following symbols are used:

lcon	Description
3Ğ	Your phone is connected to the Sprint 3G Network. When the arrows are animated, your phone is transferring data (for example, when you are opening a Web page).
++ 3G	Your phone is connected to the network but is not currently transferring data (for example, when you are viewing a Web page that is completely open).

In any state, you can receive incoming calls.

If you do not see an indicator, your phone does not have a current data connection. To launch a connection, see Launch a Web Connection.

Browser

Your phone's Web browser gives you full access to both mobile and traditional websites on the go, using data service or Wi-Fi data connections.

Learn to Navigate the Browser

Navigating through menus and websites during a data session is easy once you have learned a few basics.

Note: Before you access the SprintWeb home page, you may be asked to enter your 10-digit wireless phone number and touch **OK**. Entering your phone number is not required for access to other Web pages.

Scrolling

As with other parts of your phone's menu, you'll have to drag up and down to see everything on some websites.

To scroll through a website's page:

▶ In a single motion, touch and drag across or up and down a page.

Selecting

To select onscreen items or links:

▶ Drag across a page, and then touch or touch an onscreen link to select the link.

Links, which are displayed as <u>underlined text</u>, allow you to jump to Web pages, select special functions, or even place phone calls.

Go Back

To go back one page:

Go to a Web Page

- 1. Touch the Address field (top of the browser window) and enter a new Web address.
 - As you enter the address, possible matches are displayed within an onscreen list. Touch an entry to launch the desired website.
- 2. Touch **Go** or **Go** to launch the new page.

Note: Not all websites are viewable on your phone.

Browser Menu

The browser menu offers additional options to expand your use of the Web on your phone.

Open the Browser Menu

The browser menu may be opened anytime you have an active data session, from any page you are viewing.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Browser.
- 2. Touch **Menu** . You will see the browser menu.


Options available within the browser menu include:

- **Stop:** Stops loading the current Web page.
- **Refresh:** Reloads the current Web page.
- **Forward:** Returns you to a previously viewed page.
- **Bookmarks:** Allows you to access and manage your bookmarks.
- **Save to bookmarks:** Adds the currently viewed page as a bookmark.
- Share page: Allows you to send a URL via Gmail, SMS, Email, or Bluetooth.
- Find on page: Searches the current Web page for a word.
- **Request desktop site:** Displays the PC site of the current Web page.
- Save for offline reading: Saves the current Web page in cache to read it offline.
- Settings: Lets you configure and manage your browser settings.
- **Note:** These additional options can also be accessed via the QWERTY keyboard by using a combination of the Menu key () and the specified keys.

Select Text on a Web Page

You can highlight text on a Web page and copy it, search for it, or share it.

- 1. Scroll to the area of the Web page containing the text you want to select.
- 2. Touch and hold the text you want to copy. Drag the tabs to expand or reduce the range of the selected text. Any selected text will appear highlighted.



Tip: Touch **SELECT ALL** to select all the text on the Web page.

- 3. Touch and select the following options.
 - **Copy** to copy the selected text.
 - Share to share the selected text via Bluetooth, Gmail, or messaging, etc.
 - **Find** to find the selected text on the Web page.
 - Web Search to search the selected text on Internet.

Adjust Browser Settings

You can change the settings for your browser, including setting your home page, and more.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Browser.
- 2. Touch Menu > Settings > General.
- 3. Select from one of the following browser general settings.
 - Set homepage: Sets the current home page for the Web browser.
 - Form auto-fill: Fills out web forms with a single touch.
 - Auto-fill text: Sets up text to auto-fill in web forms.

Adjust Browser Privacy and Security Settings

You can adjust your browser's privacy and security settings such as whether or not to save passwords, history, or cache.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Browser.
- 2. Touch Menu > Settings > Privacy & security.
- 3. Select from one of the following browser privacy and security settings.
 - Clear cache: Deletes all currently cached data. Touch **OK** to complete the process.
 - Clear history: Clears the browser navigation history. Touch OK to complete the process.
 - **Show security warnings:** Notifies you if there is a security issue with the current website. Clear the check mark to disable this function.
 - Accept cookies: Allows sites that require cookies to save and read cookies from your phone.
 - Clear all cookie data: Clears all current browser cookie files.
 - **Remember form data:** Allows the phone to store data from any previously filled-out forms. Clear the check mark to disable this function.
 - Clear form data: Deletes any stored data from previously filled out forms. Touch OK to complete the process.
 - Enable location: Allows sites to request access to your current location (using the built-in GPS function).
 - Clear location access: Clears location access for all websites. Touch OK to complete the process.
 - Remember passwords: Stores user names and passwords for visited sites. Clear the check mark to disable this function.
 - Clear passwords: Deletes any previously stored usernames or passwords. Touch OK to complete the process.

Adjust Browser Accessibility Settings

You can adjust your browser's accessibility settings such as font size or screen inversion.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Browser.
- 2. Touch Menu > Settings > Accessibility.

- 3. Select from one of the following browser accessibility settings.
 - Force enable zoom: Overrides a website's request to control zoom behavior.
 - **Text scaling:** Changes text size as you see on its preview screen.
 - **Zoom on double-tap:** Enables zoom function by double-tapping the screen.
 - Minimum font size: Sets the minimum font size on the Web as you see on its preview screen.
 - Inverted rendering: Inverts the screen image. Black becomes white and vice versa.
 - **Contrast:** When **Inverted rendering** is enabled, you can set the contrast using the slider.

Adjust Browser Advanced Settings

You can adjust your browser's advanced settings such as setting search engine or default zoom.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Browser.
- 2. Touch **Menu** > **Settings** > **Advanced**.

 - **Open in background:** New pages are launched in a separate page and displayed behind the current one. Clear the check mark to disable this function.
 - Enable JavaScript: Enables javascript for the current Web page. Without this feature, some pages may not display properly. Clear the check mark to disable this function.
 - Enable plug-ins: Allows you to determine the way your phone handles program enhancements. Select Always on, On demand, or Off.
 - Website settings: Allows you to configure advanced settings for individual websites.
 - Default zoom: Sets the default browser viewing size. Choose from: Far, Medium, or Close.
 - **Open pages in overview:** Provides an overview of the recently opened pages.
 - Auto-fit pages: Allows Web pages to be resized to fit as much of the screen as possible.

- Block pop-ups: Prevents pop-up advertisements or windows from appearing onscreen. Clear the check mark to disable this function.
- Text encoding: Adjusts the current text encoding.
- **Reset to default:** Resets the browser settings to default.

Adjust Browser Bandwidth Management Settings

You can adjust your browser's bandwidth management settings.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Browser.
- 2. Touch Menu > Settings > Bandwidth management.
- 3. Select from one of the following browser bandwidth management settings.
 - **Search result preloading:** Allows browser to preload high confidence search results in the background.
 - Load images: Displays images on Web pages.

Adjust Browser Labs Settings

You can adjust your browser's labs settings.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Browser.
- 2. Touch Menu > Settings > Labs.
- 3. Select from one of the following browser labs settings:
 - Quick controls: Opens the Quick controls and hide application and URL bars.
 - **Fullscreen:** Enables the full screen mode and hide the status bar.

Set Search Engine

You can select the default search engine.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Browser.
- 2. Touch Menu > Settings > Advanced.
- 3. Touch **Set search engine** and select a search engine you want to use.

Create Website Settings

You can create settings for individual websites.

Set Up Portable Wi-Fi Hotspot

- 2. Touch **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot** and place a check mark in the adjacent field to activate the service.
 - Using both data service and hotspot drains your phone's battery at a much faster rate than when using any other feature combination.
- **Note:** The best way to keep using the phone as a hotspot is to have it connected to a power supply.

Important: Write down the passkey (password) for this WEP/WPA/WPA2 PSK communication (shown onscreen).

Connect to Portable Wi-Fi Hotspot

- 1. Enable Wi-Fi (wireless) functionality on your target device (laptop, media device, etc.).
- 2. Scan for Wi-Fi networks from the device and select your phone hotspot from the network list.
 - Your phone name can be changed by touching Home > :> > Portable Wi-Fi hotspot > Network SSID.
- 3. Select this device and follow your onscreen instructions to enter the passkey (provided on the Portable Wi-Fi hotspot page).
- 4. Launch your Web browser to confirm you have an Internet connection.

Configure Sprint Mobile Hotspot

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot**.
- 2. Set the following options:
 - **Network SSID:** Sets your network name.
 - **Security:** Sets the security level.
 - **Password:** Sets a password if necessary.
 - Maximum Wi-Fi clients: Sets the maximum Wi-Fi clients that can connect to your phone.
 - **Auto off:** Sets the length of time to elapse when your hotspot feature is disabled if there is no device connected.
 - Channel: Selects the channel you want to use.
 - Touch Menu > Advanced: Sets the advanced settings, such as local router or DHCP server settings.

When the portable Wi-Fi hotspot is active and is ready to share its connection, the hotspot icon appears on the status bar.

Phone As Modem

You can tether your phone to your computer with a USB cable, to share your phone's Internet connection with your computer.

- Touch Home > Menu > System settings > More... > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 2. Check the **Phone as modem** check box to turn on the tethered mode.

When the tethered mode is active, the tethered mode icon Ψ appears on the notification panel.

If you want to use your phone in tethered mode whenever it is connected to a PC, select Phone as modem in Default connection type of PC connection. See PC Connection.

You can use the camera or camcorder to take and share pictures and videos. Your phone comes with a 3.2 megapixel camera that lets you capture sharp pictures and videos.





- 2. **Available shots:** Displays the number of shots left available (depending on the capacity of the microSD card).
- 3. **Zoom slider:** Drag this slider to change the zoom settings. You can also change the zoom settings by pressing the volume button up and down.
- 4. **Settings button:** Reveals the additional camera mode buttons (8-12).
- 5. **Thumbnail:** Thumbnail of the latest picture. Touch to view and manage.
- 6. **Shutter button:** Touch to take a picture.
- 7. Switch button: Touch to select camera or camcorder.

- 8. **Close button:** Touch to close the camera mode buttons (9-12) and return to the zoom slider.
- 9. **Flash mode button:** Touch to select the flash mode.
- 10. White balance button: Touch this button to change the white balance to enable the camera to capture colors more accurately by adjusting to your current lighting.
- 11. Scene mode button: Touch to select a scene mode.
- Note: If you select items other than Auto, you cannot select Auto Exposure, Flash mode, and White balance.
 - 12. **Camera settings button:** Opens the camera settings menu and lets you change the camera settings. For more information, see Camera/Video Settings.

Review Screen

After capturing a photo or video, touch the thumbnail and the review screen is displayed. You can instantly share your photos or videos. See Share Photos and Videos. Touch the Gallery icon to edit your photos or videos. See View Pictures and Videos Using Gallery.



- 1. **Gallery:** Opens the Gallery application to edit your photos or videos.
- 2. **Share:** Displays the available applications to share your photos or videos.

Take a Picture

You can take high-resolution pictures using your phone's camera.





- 2. **Recorder button:** Touch to record a video. Touch again to stop.
- 3. **Zoom slider:** Drag this slider to change the zoom settings. You can also change the zoom settings by pressing the volume button up and down.
- 4. **Switch button:** Touch to select camera or camcorder.
- 5. **Settings button:** Reveals the additional video mode buttons (6-10).
- 6. **Close button:** Touch to close the video mode buttons (7-10) and return to the zoom slider.
- 7. Flash mode button: Touch to select the flash mode.
- 8. White balance button: Touch this button to change the white balance to enable the video to record colors more accurately by adjusting to your current lighting.
- 9. Video quality button: Touch to select a video quality.
- 10. Video settings button: Touch this button to change the video settings. For more information, see Camera/Video Settings.

Record a Video

Record high-quality videos (up to WVGA resolution) using your phone's video camera.

- 1. Press and hold the camera button at the lower right side of the phone.
 - or –

Touch Home 🗀 > 👀 > Camera.

- 2. Touch 💽 and then touch 🔜 to activate camcorder mode.
- 3. Select **MMS** or **Long video**.

Camera and Video

- MMS: Select this option to attach the captured video to your mail. The quality will be automatically set to QCIF(176x144) and the maximum length of a video is 30 seconds.
- Long video: Select this option to capture a long video. The quality can be selected.
- 4. Frame your subject on the screen.
- 5. Touch O to start capturing video.
- 6. Touch **o** to stop capturing.
- 7. Choose what you want to do with the video you've just captured. See Review Screen for details.

Camera/Video Settings

Follow the steps below to change the camera/video settings.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Camera.
 - or –

Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Camera and then touch \bigcirc > \blacksquare .

- 2. Touch -- and then touch to show the camera/video settings menu.
 - Store location: Stores the location information of the picture/video.
 - Picture size: Selects from: 3.2M(2048x1536), 2.0M(1600x1200), 0.8M(1024x768), VGA(640x480), or HVGA(480x320) (camera only).
 - Picture quality: Selects the quality of the pictures from: Super fine, Fine, or Normal (camera only).
 - Color effect: Adds a color effect to the picture. Choose from: None, Mono, Sepia, Negative, or Aqua.
 - Auto exposure: Selects the exposure metering range from: Frame average, Center weighted, or Spot metering.
 - **Restore defaults:** Restores all of the camera/video settings to their default values.

View Pictures and Videos Using Gallery

Using the Gallery application, you can view photos and watch videos that you've taken with your phone's camera, downloaded, or copied onto your microSD card.

For photos that are on your microSD card, you can do editing. You can also easily make a photo as your contact picture or wallpaper and share photos with your friends.

The Gallery application opens in the Albums view where your photos and videos organized by albums for easy viewing.





Photos or videos you took with the internal camera are stored in **Camera** album.


Folders in your storage card that contain photos and videos will also be treated as albums and will be listed below **Camera**. The actual folder names will be used as the album names. If you have downloaded any photos and videos, these will be placed in the **download** album.

When viewing pictures in Gallery, scroll left or right the screen to view more albums. Simply touch an album to view the photos or videos in that album.

Note: Depending on the number of pictures stored on the microSD card, it may take some time for Gallery to load all your photos on the screen.

View Photos and Videos

After selecting an album, you can browse through the photos and videos of that album in grid view. Touch a photo or video to view.



- 1. Touch to go back to the Gallery screen.
- 2. Name of the album.
- 3. Touch to show the slideshow of pictures in this album.
- ► Touch **Menu** to select pictures or sort pictures.

Zoom In or Out on a Photo

There are two ways you can zoom in or out of a photo.

Touch the screen twice quickly to zoom in, and then touch the screen twice quickly again to zoom out.

Watch a Video

Use the onscreen controls to play, pause, or stop the video.

- Crop: Crops the picture. See Crop a Photo.
- **Details:** Shows the details of the picture.

- **Show on map:** Shows the location where you took the picture in Google Maps if Store location is set to ON. See Camera/Video Settings.

Edit a Photo

Your phone has a built in editing tool and you can alter the picture you took easily.

- 3. Touch **Menu** > Edit.



- 4. Touch the following icon to edit the picture and scroll left and right to select your favorite effect.

- 5. When finished, touch **SAVE**.

Rotate and Save a Photo

You can rotate your photos.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Gallery.
- 2. Touch an album and then touch a picture.
- 3. Touch **Menu** > **Rotate left** or **Rotate right**.

Crop a Photo

You can crop your photos to the size you like.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Gallery.
- 2. Touch an album, and then touch a picture.
- 3. Touch **Menu** > **Crop**. A crop box then appears on the photo.

Camera and Video



- 4. To adjust the crop box size, touch and hold the edge of the box. When directional arrows appear, drag your finger inward to or outward to resize the crop box.
- 5. To move the crop box to the part of the photo that you want to crop, drag the crop box to the desired position.
- 6. Touch **CROP** to apply the changes to the picture.

The cropped picture is saved on the storage card as a copy. The original picture remains unedited.

Send Photos or Videos by Multimedia Message

Although you can send several photos or videos in a multimedia message, it may be better to just send one at a time, especially if the files are large in size.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Gallery.
- 2. Touch the album that contains the photos or videos you want to share.
- 3. Touch and hold the photo or video until you see a blue frame around it. Touch multiple photos and videos to select them.
- 4. Touch See all....
- 5. Compose your message and then touch $\overset{\text{\tiny MMS}}{\blacktriangleright}$.

Send Photos or Videos Using Bluetooth

You can select several photos, videos, or both and send them to another phone or your computer using Bluetooth.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Gallery.
- 2. Touch the album that contains the photos or videos you want to share.
- 3. Touch and hold the photo or video until you see a blue frame around it. Touch multiple photos and videos to select them.
- 4. Touch Selection Selection 1.
- In the next few steps, you'll be asked to turn on Bluetooth on your phone and connect to the receiving Bluetooth device so the files can be sent. For more information, see Bluetooth.

Calendar

Use Calendar to create and manage events, meetings, and appointments. Your Calendar helps organize your time and reminds you of important events. Depending on your synchronization settings, your phone's Calendar stays in sync with your Calendar on the Web, or the corporate calendar.

Add an Event to the Calendar

Add events to your calendar directly from the Calendar application.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Calendar.
- 2. On any Calendar view, touch **Menu** > **New event**.
- 3. If you have more than one calendar, select a calendar in which to add the event.

- **Note:** You can create multiple Google Calendars only in Google Calendar on the Web. After creating them in Google Calendar on the Web, you'll be able to see them in the Calendar application on your phone. For more information about creating and managing multiple Google Calendars, visit the Google website: calendar.google.com.
- **Note:** If you have synchronized your phone with a corporate account, you can also select these calendars.
 - 4. Enter a name for the event.
 - 5. Enter the event location.
 - 6. To specify the date and time of the event, do one of the following:
 - If there is a time frame for the event, touch the FROM and TO dates and times to set them.
 - If the event is a special occasion such as a birthday or an all-day event, set the FROM and TO dates, and then select the ALL DAY check box.
 - 7. Select the time zone for the event.
 - 8. Enter email addresses to invite guests to your event and add the event descriptions. See Invite Guests to Your Event (Google Account Only).
 - 9. If the event occurs on a regular basis, touch the **REPETITION** box and then choose how often the event occurs.
 - 10. Set the event reminder time and select how you are notified.

Note: You can add another reminder time in a Google Calendar event. Touch **Add reminder** to add another reminder.

- 11. Select your status to be displayed on your calendar.
- 12. Set the privacy status of this event.
- 13. Touch DONE.

Invite Guests to Your Event (Google Account Only)

If you want to invite guests to your event, you need to create and add the event in your Google Calendar.

An email invitation will be sent to your guests using your Google Account.

- 1. Open Calendar and create a new event. Select your Google Account (or one of your other Google Calendars). See Add an Event to the Calendar.
- 2. Add details about the event, such as date and time, location, and more.

- 3. In the **GUESTS** field, enter the email addresses of everyone you want to invite to the event. Separate multiple addresses with commas.
- 4. Add the description of the event to be displayed on the email to your guests.
- 5. Touch **DONE** to add the event to your Google Calendar.

If the people to whom you send invitations use Google Calendar, they'll receive an invitation in Calendar and by email.

Event Alerts

When your phone is turned on and you have an event alarm scheduled, your phone alerts you and displays the event summary.

There are several ways your phone alerts you to scheduled events:

- By playing the assigned ringer or vibration.
- By showing the **II** icon on the status bar.
- By showing the Alert pop-up screen.

Event Reminders

If you have set at least one reminder for an event, the upcoming event icon **1** will appear in the notifications area of the status bar to remind you of the upcoming event.

To view, dismiss, or postpone the reminder:

- 1. Slide the status bar down to open the Notifications panel.
- 2. Touch the upcoming event name to display the event.

Note: If you have other pending event reminders, these events will also appear on the screen.

- 3. Do one of the following:
 - Touch **Snooze all** to postpone all event reminders for five minutes.
 - Touch **Dismiss all** to dismiss all event reminders.
 - Touch Back to keep the reminders pending in the notifications area of the status bar.

To set reminder settings:

On any Calendar view, touch Menu > Settings > General settings, and set the items under REMINDER SETTINGS.


View Events

You can display the Calendar in daily, weekly, monthly, or agenda view. To change the Calendar view, touch the month and year displayed at the upper left corner, and touch **Day**, **Week**, **Month**, or **Agenda**.

The color of the events indicate the type of calendar that includes the event. To find out what each color represents, touch **Menu** > **Calendars to display**.

Day and Agenda Views

Day view displays a list of the events of one day. Agenda view shows a list of all your events in chronological order.



When in Day view, slide left or right across the screen to view earlier or later days.

When in Week view:

- Touch an event to view its details.
- Slide left or right across the screen to view earlier or later weeks.

Month View

In Month view, you'll see markers on days that have events.



When in Month view:

• Touch a day to view the events of that day.

• Slide up or down the screen to view earlier or later months.

Erase Events

It's easy to erase scheduled events from your calendar.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Calendar.
- 2. Open the calendar event details.
 - In Agenda, Day, and Week views, touch the calendar event you want to delete.
 - In Month view, touch the date where the calendar event occurs, and touch the calendar event.
- 3. Touch 👕 > **OK**.

– or –

If the calendar event is recurring, select **Only this event**, **This and future events**, or **All events**, and touch **OK**.

Show or Hide Calendars

You can choose to show or hide a calendar from your current view.

In any Calendar view, touch Menu > Calendars to display, and then touch a calendar to check to display or uncheck to hide it.

Synchronize Calendars With Your Phone

You can choose which Google Calendars to keep synchronized on your phone or which ones to stop synchronizing.

Synchronize a Google Calendar

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Accounts & sync.
- 2. Touch the account you want to sync with.
- 3. Touch Sync Calendar.
- 4. In any Calendar view, touch **Menu** > Calendars to display > Calendars to sync.
- 5. Check the calendar to sync and touch OK.

Synchronize a Corporate Calendar

If you have set up a corporate account on your phone, you can also synchronize corporate calendar events on your phone. Calendar events on your corporate account will also show in Calendar if you chose to synchronize with the Exchange ActiveSync Server.

Clock & Alarm

The Clock application functions as a desk clock that shows the date and time. You can also use it to turn your phone into an alarm clock.





Set an Alarm

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Clock.
- 2. Touch O on the screen.



Note: When you first open the alarms, two alarms are set up by default and ready for you to customize. These alarms are turned off by default.

- 3. Touch an existing alarm to change the settings or touch **Add alarm** to add a new one and set the alarm time.
- 4. Touch **Time** to adjust the hour and minute by touching \blacktriangle or \checkmark .
- 5. Touch **Repeat** to select a repeat status for the alarm.
- 6. Touch **Ringtone** to select a ringtone that will play as an alarm.
- 7. Touch **Vibrate** to add a vibration feature to the alarm.
- 8. Touch **Label** to enter a name for the alarm.
- 9. Touch **Turn alarm on** to set the alarm on.
- 10. When you're finished, touch **OK**. (Alarms that are set are checked in blue.)
 - Touch the check mark next to an alarm to turn it on or off.

Delete an Alarm

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Clock.
- 2. Touch O on the screen.
- 3. From the Alarms screen, touch a desired alarm, and then touch **Delete**.
- 4. Touch **OK** to confirm the deletion.

Change Alarm Settings

You can configure the settings of the alarm feature.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Clock.
- 2. Touch O on the screen.
- 3. From the Alarms screen, touch **Menu** > **Settings**.
- 4. Configure the following options.
 - Alarm in silent mode: Select to sound the alarm even when the phone is set to silent mode.
 - Alarm volume: Select to set the alarm volume.
 - **Snooze duration:** Select to set the snooze duration from 5 to 30 minutes in 5-minute intervals.
 - Auto-silence: Select to set how long the alarm sounds.
 - Volume and Camera: Select to set the behavior of the volume and camera buttons when pressed while the alarm sounds. Choose from: None, Silence, Snooze, or Dismiss.
 - Set default ringtone: Select to set the ringtone for the alarm.

Calculator

Your phone comes with a built-in calculator.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Calculator.
- 2. Enter numbers by touching the onscreen keys.
- 3. Touch **DELETE** to clear a number. Touch and hold to clear an entire number.
- To access more advanced features, flick the screen left or touch Menu
 Advanced panel.
- 5. Touch **Back** to close the calculator.

Voice Services

Your phone's voice services let you place calls using your voice, convert text into speech, and more.

Automatic Speech Recognition (ASR)

Automatic Speech Recognition (ASR)

You can use your phone's built-in automatic speech recognition (ASR) software (Voice Dialer) to dial a phone number in your contacts or to launch phone functions. All you have to do is to talk into the phone, and ASR will recognize your voice and complete tasks by itself.

Activate the Voice Dialer

► Touch Home > See > Voice Dialer.

The phone prompts you to say a command from the list displayed on the screen. To complete your task, simply follow the onscreen prompts or touch an onscreen option.

If the application does not recognize the number, name, or application name, it will find the most likely matches and display a list. Touch a selection or touch **Cancel** to exit the Voice Dialer.

Tip: Use ASR in a quiet environment so it can accurately recognize your commands.

Make a Voice Call with the Voice Dialer

- 1. Touch Home > ::: > Voice Dialer.
- 2. When prompted to speak, say "Call [contact]" or "Dial [number]."
- 3. For example, say "**Call John Smith on mobile**," to call John Smith's mobile phone. Your phone dials the number stored for the contact "John Smith" with the label "Mobile."

Open an Application with the Voice Dialer

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Voice Dialer.
- 2. When prompted to speak, say "Open [application name]."
 - For example, say "Open Calendar," to open the Calendar. The application screen is displayed.

Open a Settings Menu with the Voice Dialer

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Voice Dialer.
- 2. When prompted to speak, say "Open [settings menu name]."
- 3. For example, say "**Open sound settings**." The Sound settings menu screen is displayed.

Text-to-Speech Settings

Your phone can convert text into speech in some downloaded applications. You may select the language you hear or adjust its speed.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Language & input.
- 2. Touch **Text-to-speech output**.
- 3. Select your engine. Touch $\frac{1}{2}$ to configure the settings of the selected engine.
- 4. Touch **Speech rate** and select a speed.
- 5. Touch **Listen to an example** to play a short demonstration of the set speech synthesis.

Voice Search

Voice Search allows you to find information on the web as well as items and information on your phone by speaking your search terms.

- 1. Touch $\oint g$ on the Google Search Bar.
 - or –

Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Search > \bigcirc .

- 2. Speak clearly into the phone's microphone. If an error occurs, touch **Speak again** or **Try again**.
- 3. Touch a matching item from the onscreen list.

Voice Search Settings

You can configure the settings of the voice search feature.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Language & input.
- 2. Touch Voice Search.
 - Language to set the language used when entering text by speaking.
 - SafeSearch to filter explicit text and images from the search results. Select from Off, Moderate, or Strict.
 - Block offensive words to replace recognized offensive words in transcriptions with [#] when entering text by speaking.
 - **Personalized recognition** to improve speech recognition accuracy.
 - **Google Account dashboard** to manage your collected data.

Eco Mode

The Eco Mode allows you to save battery life while using your phone.

- 1. Touch Home > ::: > Eco Mode.
- 2. Drag the onscreen slider to select when you use the Eco Mode:
 - Never: Disables the Eco Mode.
 - 10-90%: Selects the remaining battery power when the Eco Mode activates. For example, 40% means the Eco Mode activates when the remaining battery power reaches 40%.
 - Always: Sets your phone to always use the Eco Mode.
- 3. Touch **Eco settings** to select the Eco level. Touch the leaf of the following items to select:
 - **Sleep** to set the screen timeout to 15 seconds.
 - Display brightness to decrease the display brightness.
 - Wallpaper to select the Eco wallpaper.
 - **Auto-sync** to disable automatic synchronization with applications.
 - Haptic feedback to turn off the Haptic feedback feature.
 - Auto-rotate screen to disable the Auto-rotate screen feature.
- 4. Touch **Close**.

When Eco Mode is on, the Eco Mode icon *m* appears on the status bar.

Configured settings in the Eco Mode are automatically reflected in the respective Settings menu, and vice versa.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range communications technology that allows you to connect wirelessly to a number of Bluetooth devices, such as headsets and hands-free car kits, and Bluetooth-enabled handhelds, computers, printers, and wireless phones. The Bluetooth communication range is usually approximately 30 feet.

Turn Bluetooth On and Off

Use the Bluetooth menu to enable or disable your phone's Bluetooth capabilities.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings.
- 2. If **OFF** is displayed at the right of Bluetooth, touch it to turn Bluetooth on. **ON** is displayed and the phone will scan for available Bluetooth devices.
- **Note:** Turn off Bluetooth when not in use to conserve battery power, or in places where using a wireless phone is prohibited, such as aboard an aircraft and in hospitals. Touch on and confirm off is displayed.

The Bluetooth Menu

The Bluetooth menu gives you access to information and controls for your phone's Bluetooth feature.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch your phone name (at the top of the list) to set your phone visible to other devices.
- **Note:** Touch again to set your phone to not visible to other devices. The time duration your phone is visible can be changed.
 - 3. Touch **Menu** and set the following options:
 - **Rename phone** to rename your phone. See Change the Device Name.
 - Visibility timeout to select the time duration your phone is visible to other devices.
 - **Show received files** to show the files received using the Bluetooth feature.

Change the Device Name

The phone name identifies your phone to other devices.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. If the Bluetooth is not turned on, touch off to turn Bluetooth on.
- 3. Touch **Menu** > **Rename phone**.
- 4. Enter the name for your phone in the dialog box, and then touch **Rename**.

Connect a Bluetooth Headset or Car Kit

You can listen to music over a Bluetooth stereo headset, or have hands-free conversations using a compatible Bluetooth headset or car kit. It's the same procedure to set up stereo audio and hands-free devices.

To listen to music with your headset or car kit, the headset or car kit must support the A2DP Bluetooth profile.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. If the Bluetooth is not turned on, touch off to turn Bluetooth on.
- 3. Make sure that the headset is discoverable, so that your phone can find the headset. Refer to the instructions that came with the headset to find out how to set it to discoverable mode.
- 4. Touch **SEARCH FOR DEVICES**. Your phone will start to scan for Bluetooth devices within range.
- 5. When you see the name of your headset displayed on the **AVAILABLE DEVICES** list, touch the name. Your phone then automatically tries to pair with the headset.
- 6. If automatic pairing fails, enter the passcode supplied with your headset.

The pairing and connection status is displayed below the hands-free headset or car kit name in the Bluetooth devices section. When the Bluetooth headset or car kit is connected to your phone, the Bluetooth connected icon 😵 is displayed in the status bar. Depending on the type of headset or car kit you have connected, you can then start using the headset or car kit to listen to music or make and receive phone calls.

Note: Due to different specifications and features of other Bluetooth compatible devices, display and operations may be different, and functions such as transfer or exchange may not be possible with all Bluetooth compatible devices.

Reconnect a Headset or Car Kit

When you have paired a headset with your phone, you should be able to reconnect it automatically by turning on Bluetooth on your phone and then turning on the headset. However, sometimes you will need to reconnect manually, for example if you have been using your headset with another Bluetooth device.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. If the Bluetooth is not turned on, touch OFF / to turn Bluetooth on.
- 3. Make sure that the headset is discoverable.
- 4. Touch the headset's name on the **AVAILABLE DEVICES** list.

- 5. If prompted to enter a passcode, try 0000 or 1234, or consult the headset or car kit documentation to find the passcode.
- 6. If you still cannot reconnect to the headset or car kit, follow the instructions in Disconnect or Unpair From a Bluetooth Device, and then follow the instructions in Connect a Bluetooth Headset or Car Kit.

Disconnect or Unpair From a Bluetooth Device

You can manually disconnect or unpair from a Bluetooth device through the Bluetooth settings menu.

Disconnect a Bluetooth Device

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. On the **PAIRED DEVICES** list, touch the device you want to disconnect.
- 3. Touch OK.

Unpair From a Bluetooth Device

You can make your phone forget its pairing connection with another Bluetooth device. To connect to the other device again, you may need to enter or confirm a passcode again.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. On the **PAIRED DEVICES** list, touch $\frac{-1}{-1}$ next to the device you want to unpair.
- 3. Touch Unpair.

Send and Receive Information Using Bluetooth

You can use Bluetooth to transfer information between your phone and another Bluetoothenabled device such as a phone or notebook computer. The first time you transfer information between your phone and another device, you need to enter or confirm a security passcode. After that, your phone and the other device are paired, and you will not need to exchange passcodes to transfer information in the future.

Send Information From Your Phone to Another Device

You can send the following types of information, depending on the device you are sending to:

- Images and videos
- Contacts information
- 1. Set the receiving device to discoverable mode. You may also need to set it to "Receive Beams" or "Receive Files." Refer to the device's documentation for instructions on receiving information over Bluetooth.

- On the phone, open the application that contains the information or file you want to send. For example, if you want to send a saved photo, touch Home > ::: > Gallery.
- 3. Follow the steps for the type of item you want to send:
 - Photo or video (in Camera): After capturing a photo or video, on the preview screen, touch).
 - Photos and videos (in Gallery): On the Albums tab, touch an album, and select the items you want to share. Touch <> Bluetooth.
 - Contacts information (in People): Touch the entry, touch Menu > Share > Bluetooth.
- 4. If you are prompted to turn on Bluetooth, touch **Turn on**.
- 5. Touch the name of the receiving device.
- 6. If prompted, accept the connection on the receiving device, and enter the same passcode on both your phone and the other device, or confirm the auto-generated passcode.
- 7. On the receiving device, accept the file.

The location where the information is saved depends on the type of information and the receiving device:

- If you send a contact, it is normally added directly to the contact application on the receiving device.
- If you send another file type to a Windows computer, it is normally saved in the Bluetooth Exchange folder within your personal document folders.
 - On Windows XP, the path may be: C:\Documents and Settings\[your username]\ My Documents\Bluetooth Exchange.
 - On Windows Vista, the path may be: C:\Users\[your username]\Documents.
- If you send a file to another device, the saved location may depend on the file type. For example, if you send an image file to another wireless phone, it may be saved in a folder named "Images."

Receive Information From Another Device

Your phone is capable of receiving a wide variety of file types with Bluetooth, including photos, videos, or contacts.

To receive files from another device, you need to have a microSD card installed in your phone.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. If the Bluetooth is not turned on, touch OFF to turn Bluetooth on.
- 3. Touch your phone name to set it visible to other devices.
- 4. Touch **Menu** > **Visibility timeout**.
- 5. Select the time duration your phone is visible to others.
- 6. On the sending device, send one or more files to your phone. Refer to the phone's documentation for instructions on sending information over Bluetooth.
- 7. If prompted, enter the same passcode on both your phone and the other device, or confirm the auto-generated passcode. A Bluetooth authorization request is displayed on your phone.
- 8. Touch OK.
- 9. When your phone receives a file transfer request notification, slide down the notifications panel, and then touch **Accept**.
- 10. When a file is transferred, a notification is displayed. To open the file immediately, slide down the notifications panel, and then touch the relevant notification.

When you open a received file, what happens next depends on the file type:

• For a vCard contact file, if there are multiple vCard files on your storage card, you can choose to import one, several, or all of those contacts to your contacts list.

microSD Card

Your phone is equipped with a microSD[™] (Secure Digital) memory card that allows you to store images, videos, music, documents, and voice data on your phone.

Important: Your phone comes with the microSD card preinstalled.






- 1. Unmount the microSD card. See Unmount the microSD Card.
- Hook your thumb- or fingernail into the slot on the side of the battery compartment cover (①) and lift the cover off gently (②).



Gently push the microSD card inward and release it. The card is now halfway out of the microSD card slot (③). Gently pull out the card from the slot (④).



4. Replace the cover, making sure all tabs have seated and there are no gaps (5).




- **Warning:** You can easily damage the microSD card by improper operation. Please be careful when inserting, removing, or handling the microSD card.
- **Note:** Make sure your battery is fully charged before using the microSD card. Your data may become damaged or unusable if the battery runs out while using the microSD card.

Insert a microSD Card

Remove the battery cover to insert a compatible microSD card into your phone.


Hook your thumb- or fingernail into the slot on the side of the battery compartment cover

View the microSD Card Memory

The Apps settings menu gives you access to your microSD card memory information.

- With the microSD card inserted, touch Home > Menu > System settings > Apps.
- 2. Touch **ON SD CARD** tab. The total and available memory space will be displayed at the bottom of the screen.

Format the microSD Card

Formatting a microSD card permanently removes all files stored on the card.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Storage.
- 2. Touch Erase SD card > Erase SD card > Erase everything.
- **Note:** The formatting procedure erases all the data on the microSD card, after which the files CANNOT be retrieved. To prevent the loss of important data, please check the contents before you format the card.

Unmount the microSD Card

When you need to remove the microSD card, you must unmount the microSD card first to prevent corrupting the data stored on it or damaging the microSD card.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Storage.
- 2. Touch **Unmount SD card** > **OK**.

Use the Phone's microSD Card as a USB Drive

To transfer music, pictures, and other files from your computer to your phone's microSD card, you need to set the phone's microSD card as a USB drive.

- 1. Connect the phone to your computer using the supplied USB cable.
- 2. The **PC connection** screen automatically opens.

– or –

If you see when on the status bar, slide it down to open the Notifications panel and touch the USB connection notification.

- 3. Touch Mass Storage > Done > OK. See PC Connection.
- 4. On your computer, the connected phone is recognized as a removable disk. Navigate to this removable disk and open it.
- 5. Do one of the following:

- Copy files from the computer to the root folder on the phone's storage card.
- Copy files from the phone's storage card to a folder on your computer or computer desktop.
- 6. After copying the files, unmount the removable disk (that is, the connected phone) as required by your computer's operating system to safely remove your phone, and disconnect the phone from the computer.
- **Note:** The phone will not recognize the microSD card when it is connected to a computer as a disk drive. You will not be able to use some of the phone's applications such as Camera or Play Music.

Use the Phone's microSD Card as a Media Device

You can connect your phone as a media device to your computer.

- 1. Connect the phone to your computer using the supplied USB cable.
- 2. The **PC connection** screen automatically opens.

If you see when on the status bar, slide it down to open the Notifications panel and touch the USB connection notification.

3. Touch **Media Transfer > Done**. See **PC Connection**.

Enable Global Roaming Mode

Your phone is designed to disable/enable global roaming mode to avoid automatically connecting to an appropriate network when you travel.

To set your global roaming options:

- 1. Touch Home)> Menu > System settings.
- 2. Touch More... > Mobile networks > Roaming > Roaming mode.
 - To allow connections to the Nationwide Sprint Network only, touch **Home only**.
 - To allow connections to available networks, touch Automatic.

If you select **Automatic**, select the type(s) of communication for which global roaming should be allowed:

- International voice: Select to allow voice communication on international roaming systems.
- International data: Select to allow data communication on international roaming systems.

Note: You cannot select the international data roaming only.

Make and Receive Worldwide Calls

When travelling on international networks, you can place and answer calls as you would on the Sprint network (see Make Phone Calls and Receive Phone Calls), although some additional instructions may be required to place a call. Some features and services are not available in some countries. For more information on services that are available while roaming, visit sprint.com/sww.

Make Calls Using Plus (+) Code Dialing

Placing calls from one country to another country is simple with the Plus (+) Code Dialing feature. When placing international calls, you can use Plus Code Dialing to enter the appropriate international access code for your location (for example, 011 for international calls placed from the United States).

Note: International access codes and dialing information are available online at sprint.com/sww.

To use Plus Code Dialing to place an international call from outside the United States or Canada:

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc .

- 5. Delete the previous value.
- 6. Enter a new value and touch **OK**.

To use Plus Code Dialing to place an international call from the United States or Canada:

- 3. Check the North American dialing check box.

To place an international call:

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc . (If necessary, first touch \bigcirc tab.)
- Touch and hold 0: to insert a "+" on the phone dial screen. (The "+" symbol automatically inserts the international access code for the country from which you are calling.)
- 3. Enter the country code and phone number, and then touch **C**. (The phone automatically prepends the access code for international dialing, followed by the country code and phone number.)

International Data Roaming

Set Up Your Voicemail Access Number

To simplify accessing your Sprint Voicemail while travelling, you can set up your voicemail access number as a contacts entry. This will make it faster and easier to access your messages while roaming internationally.

- 2. Touch 🖳.
- 3. Type the contact information (for example, "Voicemail").
- 4. Enter "+", "1", your area code, and your wireless phone number.
- 5. Touch **DONE**.

Access Your Voicemail

You will need to call your voicemail number to access your voicemail while roaming internationally.

New Message Indicators

When you are roaming off the Nationwide Sprint Network, you may not receive notification of new voicemail messages. Sprint recommends that you periodically check your voicemail. See Retrieve Voicemail Messages.

Retrieve Voicemail Messages

The voicemail retrieval process while travelling is the same as on the Sprint Network; however, you will be required to enter your voicemail password.

To retrieve your voicemail messages:

- 1. Touch **Home** () > **People**, touch the voicemail entry and then touch the number to call it.
- 2. When your voicemail answers, touch *****, enter the password and touch **#** to access your voicemail.

Voicemail Troubleshooting

Please keep the following tips in mind when using Sprint voicemail while travelling:

- Some carriers may not support voicemail indicators. It may be necessary to call your voicemail to see if you have any new messages.
- If you hear the message "Please enter the number of the subscriber you wish to call," enter your 10-digit wireless phone number.

Contact Sprint for Assistance

If you experience any issues with voice or data services while outside of the United States, Sprint offers customer support 24 hours a day. In the event that you do experience an issue, try the following actions:

- First try powering your phone off and then back on; this will force your phone to reregister with the network.
- Try manually selecting another network. Information for selecting networks can be found in the phone guide.

If neither of these actions resolves your issue, you will need to contact customer service (see below). When calling to report an issue, the following information will be beneficial in trying to resolve your issue as quickly as possible:

- Your wireless phone number.
- The city and country you are travelling in.
- Any error message that displays on your phone or that you heard when trying to place a call.
- If the issue is with data, were you able to place voice calls?
- If the issue is with voice service, were you able to access data?
