## Important Messages

IMPORTANT: If the account type you want to set up is not in the device database, you will be asked to enter more details. You should get all pertinent information for the email account such as incoming and outgoing server settings before you proceed.

WARNING: Use only Sprint-approved or manufacturer-approved batteries and chargers with your device. The failure to use a Sprint-approved or manufacturerapproved battery and charger may increase the risk that your device will overheat, catch fire or explode, resulting in serious bodily injury, death or property damage.

## Set Up Your Phone

You must first install and charge the battery to begin setting up your phone.
Important: Close your phone before removing the cover and inserting the battery.

1. Install the battery.

- Insert a coin or other flat object into the slot at the bottom of the battery compartment cover and lift the cover up gently.

- Insert the battery, contacts end first, and gently press the battery into place.

- Replace the battery compartment cover, making sure all the tabs are secure and there are no gaps around the cover.


Note: When you insert the battery, your phone may power on automatically.
2. Insert the USB cable into the phone's Charger/Accessory jack.

3. Plug the charging head into a standard AC power outlet.

Always use a Sprint-approved or Samsung-approved desktop charger, travel charger, or vehicle power adapter to charge your battery.

Note: The front LED turns red to indicate the battery is currently charging.

- Plug the flat end of the charger into the phone's charger jack and the other end into an electrical outlet. The phone turns on and indicates its charge state via the battery icon.

Warning! While the device is charging, if the screen does not function due to an unstable power supply, unplug the USB power adapter from the power outlet or unplug the USB cable from the device.

With the Sprint-approved Li-Ion battery, you can recharge the battery before it becomes completely run down.

- Plug the AC adapter into an electrical outlet. Fully charging a battery may take up to three hours.

Note: Your phone's battery should have enough charge for the phone to turn on and find a signal, run the setup application, set up voicemail, and make a call. You should fully charge the battery as soon as possible.
4. Open your phone then press and hold

End ${ }^{\circ}$ to turn the phone on.


- If your phone is activated, it will turn on, search for Sprint service, and begin the setup application.


## Activate Your Phone

- If you purchased your phone at a Sprint Store, it is probably activated and ready to use.
- If you received your phone in the mail and it is for a new Sprint account or a new line of service, it is designed to activate automatically. To confirm your activation, make a phone call.
- If you received your phone in the mail and you are activating a new phone for an existing number on your account, you can activate on your computer online or directly on your phone.

To activate on your computer:

- Go to www.sprint.com/activate and follow the instructions.

To activate on your phone:
Note: For security reasons, you will need your Sprint phone number and PIN to use this activation method.

1. Turn on your new phone. (Make sure the old one is turned off.) Your phone will automatically attempt Hands-Free Activation.
2. Follow the on-screen prompts to complete the activation process.
3. After you have completed the wizard, make a phone call to confirm your activation.

If your phone is still not activated or you do not have access to the Internet, contact Sprint Customer Service at 1-888-211-4727 for assistance.

Note: If you are having difficulty with activation, contact Sprint Customer Service by dialing 1-888-211-4727 from any other phone.

## Set Up Voicemail

Your phone automatically transfers all unanswered calls to your voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off. You should set up your Sprint Voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your phone is activated. Always use a password to protect against unauthorized access.

1. From standby mode, press and hold $\mathbf{1}$ to dial your voicemail number.
2. Follow the system prompts to:

- Create your password.
- Record your name announcement.
- Record your greeting.

Note: Voicemail Password - Sprint strongly recommends that you create a password when setting up your voicemail to protect against unauthorized access. Without a password, anyone who has access to your phone is able to access your voicemail messages.

## Sprint Account Passwords

## Account User Name and Password

If you are the account owner, you will create an account user name and password when you sign on to sprint.com. (Click Sign in/Sign up and then click Sign up now! to get started.) If you are not the account owner (if someone else receives the bill for your Sprint service) you can get a sub-account password at sprint.com.

## Voicemail Password

You'll create your voicemail password when you set up your voicemail. See Set Up Voicemail for more information on your voicemail password.

## Data Services Password

With your Sprint phone, you may elect to set up an optional data services password to control access and authorize Premium Service purchases.

## Sprint 411

You can get up to three pieces of information per call, and the operator can automatically connect your call at no additional charge.

There is a per-call charge to use Sprint 411, and you will be billed for airtime.

## Phone Basics

Your phone is packed with features that simplify your life and expand your ability to stay connected to the people and information that are important to you. The topics in this section will introduce the basic functions and features of your phone.

## Your Phone's Layout

The illustrations and descriptions below outline your phone's basic layout.


## Key Functions

- Status Bar Icons provide information about your phone's status and options, such as signal strength, roaming, ringer setting, messaging, and battery charge.
- Display Screen displays all the information needed to operate your phone, such as the call status, the Contacts list, the date and time, and the greeting.
- Navigation Key allows you to scroll through the phone's menu options and acts as a shortcut key from standby mode.
- Softkeys let you select softkey actions or menu items corresponding to the bottom left and bottom right lines on the Display Screen.
- TALK Key allows you to place or receive calls, answer Call Waiting, use 3-Way Calling, or activate Voice Dial.
- Keypad lets you enter numbers, letters, and characters, and select menu items. Press and hold keys for speed dialing.
- Microphone allows other callers to hear you clearly when you are speaking to them.
- BACK/Clear Key deletes characters and numbers from the display in text entry mode. When in a menu, pressing the Back key returns you to the previous menu. This key also allows you to return to the previous screen in a data session.
- END/POWER Key lets you turn the phone on or off, end a call, or return to standby mode. While in the main menu, it returns the phone to standby mode and cancels your input. When you receive an incoming call, press to mute the ringer or ignore the call.
- MENU/OK lets you access the phone's menus and selects the highlighted choice when navigating through a menu.
- Earpiece lets you hear the caller and automated prompts.

- Volume Button allows you to adjust the ringer volume in standby mode (with the phone open) or adjust the voice volume during a call.
- Charger/Accessory Jack allows you to connect the phone charger or an optional USB cable (included).
- Camera contains the hardware enabling you to capture pictures.
- Headset Jack allows you to plug in a headset for convenient, hands-free conversations.

- Front-facing Camera lets you capture pictures with the phone closed.

CAUTION! Inserting an accessory into the incorrect jack may damage the phone.

## Turn Your Phone On and Off

Turning your phone on and off is a simple as pressing and holding the End key, which also serves as your phone's power button.

Turn Your Phone On

- Press and hold End ${ }^{\circ}$

Turn Your Phone Off

- Press and hold END ${ }^{\circ}$

Your screen remains blank while your phone is off (unless the battery is charging).

## Your Home Screen

The home screen is the starting point for your phone's applications, functions, and menus.


## Status Bar

The status bar at the top of the home screen provides phone and service status information on the right side and notification alerts on the left.

## Making Calls

Making calls is as easy as entering a phone number and pressing the Talk key.

1. Enter a phone number from standby mode. (If you make a mistake while dialing, press BACK to erase the numbers.)
2. Press ${ }^{\text {TALK }}$. (To make a call when you are roaming and Call Guard is enabled, highlight Roam Call and press talk

3. Press ${ }^{\text {END }}$. or close the phone when you are finished.

Tip: To redial your last outgoing call, press TaLK twice. To redial other recent numbers, press talk, highlight a number, and press ${ }^{\text {TALK }}$ again.

You can also place calls from your phone by speed dialing numbers from your Contacts using your History listings and Voice Services.

## Dialing Options

When you enter numbers in standby mode, such as when you are making a call, several dialing options are available on the phone's screen via the Options menu.

To initiate an option:

- Press OPTIONS (right softkey).
- Save: Enter a seven-digit or ten-digit number (phone number and area code) and press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Save to save the phone number in your Contacts.
- Hard Pause: Enter a seven-digit or ten-digit number (phone number and area code) and press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Hard Pause. This inserts a pause between the dialed phone number and the next entered digits.

Note: Use this feature to navigate through automated menus. If you know the number sequence required to connect you to the right destination, enter a Hard Pause between each number. A Hard Pause entry displays a " p ".

Example: (214) 555-7777p1p2p3

- 2-Sec Pause: Enter a seven-digit or ten-digit number (phone number and area code) and press OPTIONS (right softkey) > 2-Sec Pause. This inserts a longer pause between the dialed phone number and the next entered digits.

Note: Use this feature to navigate through automated menus. If you know the number sequence required to connect you to the right destination and the menu prompts require more time to accept your number choice, enter a 2-Sec Pause between each number. A 2 -Sec Pause entry displays a "t".

Example: (214) 555-7777t5t6t7

## Answering Calls

There are several convenient ways to answer calls on your phone.

1. Make sure your phone is on. (If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.)

2. You can also press may also answer incoming calls by opening the phone or by pressing any number key.

Your phone notifies you of incoming calls in the following ways:

- The phone rings or vibrates.
- The indicator light flashes.
- The backlight illuminates.
- The screen displays an incoming call message.

If the incoming call is from a number stored in your Contacts, the entry's name is displayed. You may also see the caller's phone number, if available.

If you set CALL ANSWER to Talk Key, you also see the following options. To select an option, press the corresponding softkey.

- Answer to answer the incoming call.
- Silence to set the ringer to silent mode.
- Send to Voicemail redirects the call to your voicemail.
- Ignore with Text to immediately send the caller a text message.


## Answering a Roam Call with Call Guard Enabled

Call Guard is an option that helps you manage your roaming charges when making or receiving calls while outside the Nationwide Sprint Network.

- Select Answer to answer the call.

Note: When your phone is off, calls go directly to voicemail.

## Ending a Call

- Close the phone or press END $^{\circ}$


## Missed Call Notification

When you do not answer an incoming call, your screen displays the Missed Call log.
To display the Missed Call entry from the notification screen:

- Highlight the entry and press
(To dial the phone number, press ${ }^{\text {TALK }}$.)
To display a Missed Call entry from standby mode:

1. Press $\xlongequal{\text { Meñ }}>{ }^{\text {Kin }}$ History.
2. Highlight an entry and press

## Calling Emergency Numbers

You can place emergency calls to 911 , even if your phone is locked or your account is restricted.

Note: When you place an emergency call, your phone automatically enters Emergency mode.
To view options during an emergency call:

- Press OPTIONS (right softkey) to view the following:
- My Phone \# (left softkey) to display your MSID and device phone number during an emergency call.

Note: You must highlight MSID and press $\frac{\text { MeNv }}{\text { OKN }}$ to view the MSID number.

- Unlock (right softkey) to unlock your phone (appears only if the phone is locked).

To exit Emergency mode:

1. Press End $^{\text {® }}$ to end a 911 call.
2. Press * snift and \#spece to exit.

## Enhanced 911 (E911) Information

This phone features an embedded Global Positioning System (GPS) chip necessary for utilizing E911 emergency location services where available.

When you place an emergency 911 call, the GPS feature of your phone seeks information to calculate your approximate location. Depending on several variables, including availability and access to satellite signals, it may take up to 30 seconds or more to determine and report your approximate location.

Important: Always report your location to the 911 operator when placing an emergency call. Some designated emergency call takers, known as Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs) may not be equipped to receive GPS location information from your phone.

## In-Call Options

Pressing OPTIONS (right softkey) during a call displays a list of available in-call features.


To select an option, press the corresponding keypad number or highlight the option and press
MENU
The following options may be available through the Options menu:

- Speaker On to route the phone's audio through the speaker or through the earpiece.

Note: After selecting this option, the menu item changes to Speaker Off. Select this option to disable the speaker.

- Contact Details to display the detail screen of the current caller.
- 3-Way Call to initiate a 3-way call.
- Contacts to display your Contacts list.
- Voice Memo to record the current call.
- Phone Info to display your phone information.
- Key Mute to silence the key tones.

Note: After selecting this option, the menu item changes to Key Unmute. Select this option to unmute the keys.

- Messages to display your current messages (Voicemail, text messages, etc.).
- Recent History to view your call histories.
- Tools to access the Tools menu.

WARNING: Because of higher volume levels, do not place the phone near your ear during speakerphone use.

## End-of-Call Options

After you receive a call from or make a call to a phone number that is not in your Contacts, at the end of the call the phone displays the phone number and the duration of the call. Press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Save to add the new number to your Contacts.

You can also send a text message to the recent caller. Press SEND MSG (left softkey). The caller's phone number or saved contact name automatically displays in the recipient field.

Note: The End-of-Call options are not displayed for calls identified as No ID or Restricted.

## Saving a Phone Number

You can store up to 4600 phone numbers and 600 Contacts entries in your phone. Each entry's name can contain 64 characters. Your phone automatically sorts the Contacts entries alphabetically. See Contacts for more information.

To save a number from standby mode:

1. Enter a phone number and press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Save.

2. Highlight New Contact or Existing Contact and press

OK
3. Highlight a label and press

MENU
OK
4. Use the keypad to enter the new contact name and press ${ }^{\text {MexN }}$ or

Search for an existing contact name and press $\underset{\substack{\text { MENU } \\ \text { OKN }}}{ }$ to save the new number.
5. Press DONE (left softkey).

## Finding a Phone Number

You can find a phone number in your contacts by searching Contacts for entries by name.

1. Press CONTACTS (right softkey) and enter the first letter or letters of an entry. (The more letters you enter, the more specific the search.)
2. To display an entry, highlight it and press . To dial a number, highlight it and press talk

## Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers with Pauses

You can dial or save phone numbers with pauses for use with automated systems, such as voicemail or credit card billing numbers.

There are two types of pauses available on your phone:

- Hard Pause sends the next set of numbers when you press ${ }^{\text {TALK }}$
- 2-Second Pause automatically sends the next set of numbers after two seconds.

Note: You can have multiple pauses in a phone number and combine two-second and hard pauses.

To dial or save phone numbers with pauses:

1. Enter the phone number.
2. Press OPTIONS (right softkey) $>$ Hard Pause or 2-Sec Pause.
3. Enter additional numbers.
4. Press talk to dial the number.
or
Press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Save to save the number in your Contacts.

Note: When dialing a number with a hard pause, press

## Abbreviated Dialing

Abbreviated Dialing is similar to speed dialing. You can use either of the following abbreviated dialing features.

- Contacts Match retrieves any number saved in your Contacts by entering only the last four digits of the number. Press ${ }^{\text {TALK }}$ to dial the retrieved number.
- Abbreviated Dialing retrieves any number saved in your Contacts when you enter the prepended 5 to 6 digits (area code and prefix) to any 4 or 5 digits entered.

To activate Abbreviated Dialing:

1. Press MENV $_{\text {OKN }}^{\text {M }}>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Settings $>$ Others $>$ Abbreviated Dialing.
2. Select On or Off.

To activate the Contacts Match feature:

1. Press MExU $>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Settings $>$ Others $>$ Contacts Match.

- Select On or Off.

To place a call using Contacts Match:

1. Enter the last four or five digits of a Contact entry's phone number.

The contact number matching the entered digits displays at the bottom of the screen.
2. Highlight the contact and press ${ }^{\text {TALK }}$. (If there is more than one matched number in your Contacts, highlight a name and then press TALK to place a call.)

Tip: You can also view the contact details or enter a pause by pressing OPTIONS (right softkey) and the appropriate choice after step 1 above.

To place a call using Prepend Abbreviated Dialing:

1. Enter the last four to six digits of a Contact entry's phone number.

The contact number matching the entered digits displays at the bottom of the screen.
2. Highlight the contact and press TALK.
(If there is more than one matched number in your Contacts, highlight a name and then press to place a call.)

## Dialing From the Contacts List

You can dial phone numbers directly from your Contacts list.

1. Press ${ }^{\text {MENU }}$ ô $>$ CONTACTS.
2. Highlight the contact you want to call and press Men (o dial the entry's default phone number.
3. Highlight a phone number and press $\square$
or
4. Press ${ }_{\left(\begin{array}{c}\text { MENU } \\ \text { ONT } \\ \end{array}>\text { CONTACTS. }\right.}$
5. Press and hold the contact you want to call. You will see a blue option wheel in the top right corner of the screen.
6. Use your navigation keys to select an option (defined below).

7. Highlight the Make a Call option and press

MENU

## Three-Way Calling

With 3-Way calling, you can talk to two people who are on two different phone lines at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

1. Place your call to the first recipient.
2. Once you have established the connection, press OPTIONS (right softkey) > 3-way call. (Your first call is automatically put on hold.)
3. Select one of the following:

- Contacts to choose a caller from your Contacts list.
- Recent History to use your History list to locate a call recipient
- Enter phone number to manually enter the call recipient's phone number.

4. Press ${ }^{\text {TALK }}$ after you highlight the appropriate contact or enter the phone number.
5. When you're connected to the second party, press JOIN (right softkey) to combine both calls into a single 3-way call.

Note: If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all callers are disconnected.


## Speed Dialing

You can store up to 98 numbers in your phone's speed dial memory. Dial speed dial entries using one keypress for locations 2-9 or two key presses for locations 10-99.

To use One-Touch Dialing for speed dial locations 2-9:

- Press and hold the appropriate key for approximately two seconds. The display confirms that you have dialed the number when it shows "connecting...".

To use Two-Touch Dialing for speed dial locations 10-99:

1. Press the first digit.
2. Press and hold the second digit for approximately two seconds. The display confirms that you have dialed the number when it shows "connecting...".

## Plus (+) Code Dialing

When placing international calls, Plus Code Dialing automatically enters the international access code for your location (for example, 011 for international calls made from the U.S.).

1. Press and hold $\mathbf{a}^{+}$until you see a " + " on the display screen.
2. Dial the country code and phone number, and then press ${ }^{\text {TALK }}$.
(The phone automatically prepends the access code for international dialing, followed by the country code and phone number.)

## Viewing History

History is a list of the last 240 phone numbers (or Contacts entries) for calls you placed, accepted, or missed. History makes redialing a number fast and easy. It is continually updated as your phone automatically adds new numbers to the beginning of the list and removes the oldest entries from the bottom of the list.

Each entry contains the phone number (if it is available) and Contacts entry name (if the number is in your Contacts). Duplicate calls (same number and type of call) may only appear once on the list.

1. Press $\xlongequal{\text { MENU }}>$ History.

2. Highlight an entry and press

MENU

Shortcut: You can also press TALK from standby mode to display your recent calls.
Note: History records only calls that occur while the phone is turned on. If a call is received while your phone is turned off, it will not be included in history.

If you return a call from the voicemail menu, it will not be included in your phone's history.

## History Options

The options available in your phone's history menu include adding entries to create a new group, saving phone numbers, viewing contact details, and deleting history entries.

1. Press $\xlongequal{\text { MENU }}$ © History.
2. Press OPTIONS (right softkey) to display the following options:

- New Group to select entries from your history and add them to a new group.
- Save to save the number to a new or existing entry.

Note: This option displays only when the highlighted number has not been saved as a new contact or appended to an existing one.

- Contact Details to view contact information.

Note: This option displays only when the highlighted number is saved to the list of Contacts.

- Delete to delete the entry.
- Delete All to delete all entries.

To access options for a specific entry:

2. Highlight a specific entry and press | MENU |

| OK |
3. Press OPTIONS (right softkey) to display the following options:

- Delete to delete the entry.
- Delete All to delete all entries.
- Prepend to add numbers to the beginning of the selected number.

Note: You can only use this procedure for unsaved numbers. See Prepending a Number from History for more information.

- Save Contact to save the number to a new or existing entry.

Note: This option displays only when the number has not been saved as a new contact or appended to an existing one.

- Contact Details to view contact information.

Note: This option displays only when the number is saved to the list of Contacts.

## Making a Call from History

You can make a call directly from your History list.

1. Press MENU ${ }^{\text {OK }}$ > History.
2. Highlight an entry and press
talk

Note: You cannot make calls from History to entries identified as No Caller ID or Restricted.

## Saving a Number from History

You can save a number from your History list by creating a new contact entry or by adding the number to an existing contact.

2. Select New Contact to create a new Contacts entry for the number or Existing Contact to save the number to an existing entry.

## Prepending a Number from History

If you need to make a call from History and you are outside your local area code, you can add the appropriate prefix by prepending the number.

## Changing the Outer Screen

You can customize the outer screen by choosing wallpaper or contrast.

## Changing the Picture ID

Select Picture IDs for your contacts, unsaved numbers, or private numbers.

- Keypad light is set to Off.

2. Highlight a single contact and press ASSIGN (left softkey).
3. Select one of the following: Default Ringer, Downloaded, Preloaded or No Ringer.
4. Use your navigation key to scroll through the available ringers. A sample ringer will sound as you highlight each option.
5. Press $\xlongequal{\text { MENU }} \begin{gathered}\text { OK } \\ \text { 5o assign a ringer. }\end{gathered}$

To assign ringers to Unsaved Numbers or Private /Unknown:

1. Select Unsaved Numbers or Private / Unknown.
2. Select Downloaded, Preloaded, or No Ringer.

## Phone Information

Your phone provides information specific to your phone, such as the phone number, memory status, an icon glossary, your phone's software version, and information about your account.


The following information is available:

Phone Number/User ID displays your phone number and identification information. Press to view your Phone Number/User ID, Memory Status, Icon Glossary, Version, Advanced, or My Account. Press DONE (left softkey) when finished viewing the information.

## Lock Phone

When your phone is locked you can only receive incoming calls and make calls to 911, Sprint Customer Service, or special numbers.

## Location

Your phone is equipped with a Location feature for use in connection with location-based services.

The Location feature allows the network to detect your position. Turning Location off will hide your location from everyone except 911.

Note: Turning Location on will allow the network to detect your position using GPS technology, making some Sprint applications and services easier to use. Turning Location off will disable the GPS location function for all purposes except 911, but will not hide your general location based on the cell site serving your call. No application or service may use your location without your request or permission. GPS-enhanced 911 is not available in all areas.

To enable your phone's Location feature:

1. Press $\stackrel{\text { MENV }}{\text { OK }}>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Settings $>$ Location. (The Location disclaimer displays.)
2. Read the disclaimer and press

OENU
OK
3. Highlight On or Off and press

When you turn the Location feature on, the phone displays the icon. When you turn Location off, the phone displays the icon.

## Parental Controls

Parental Controls provide restrictions to various phone services such as Voice, Messaging, Data, and Camera. These restrictions are governed by an independent Parental Code that is separate from the previously mentioned Lock code.

## Using Parental Controls

With your phone's parental controls settings, you can disable certain phone services without turning off your phone. You can restrict access to all data services, including Web and text messaging. Disabling data services will avoid any charges associated with these services. While signed out, you can still place or receive phone calls, check voicemail, and use other voice services. You may enable data services again at any time.

To enable Parental Controls:

1. Press $\xlongequal{\text { MENU }}$ ovi $>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Settings $>$ Parental Controls.
2. Use the navigation keys to toggle Parental Controls On.
3. If this is your first time to setup these controls, you will be asked to setup a parental lock code that manages the areas that will be locked via this menu.

- Re-enter the new code and press Done (left softkey).

To disable Parental Controls:

2. Use the navigation keys to toggle Parental Controls Off.

## Changing the Parental Control Code

## Customize Parental Controls Restrictions

Customize your parental controls options, such as preventing outgoing calls, restricting text messaging, Web access, or camera use.

Note: The Parental Control Restrictions that you set on your phone do not reflect those configured on Sprint.com. For online configuration information, sign in to My Sprint, select the My Preferences tab, and select a control feature within Limits and Restrictions.

- Force Location On to protect GPS activity. Set the feature to On to always enable the GPS feature or Off to never allow access to GPS capabilities.

6. Press ${ }^{\text {BACk }}$ to return to the previous page.

## Reset/Delete

Resetting the phone restores all default settings to your phone.

## Reset Settings

You can choose to reset only the phone settings. These are any preferences you have set to personalize your phone.

1. Press ${ }_{\text {MENU }}^{\text {EN }}>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Settings $>$ Reset/Delete and enter your Lock code.
2. Select Reset Settings. (You will see a disclaimer.)
3. If you are certain that you would like to restore all factory settings, press RESET (left softkey).

## Reset Phone

Resetting your phone restores all settings and tools to their default state.

1. Press ${ }_{\text {MENU }}^{\text {MN }}>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Settings $>$ Reset/Delete and enter your Lock code.
2. Select Reset Phone. (You will see a disclaimer.)

## Others

You can customize additional settings on your phone such as Abbreviated Dialing assignments, call answer and airplane mode settings, Roaming options, Navigation Key shortcut customizations, your phone's Language display, data settings, Contact Match, accessibility, and TTY options.

Your phone's Accessibility settings let you take advantage of the built-in automatic speech recognition software.

## Voice Recognition

You can use your phone's built-in automatic speech recognition (ASR) software to dial a phone number in your Contacts or to launch phone functions. All you have to do is to talk into the phone, and ASR will recognize your voice and complete tasks by itself.

2. Select Audio Modes and select an option.

- Expert Mode to sound a beep only.
- Prompt Mode to prompt for required information.

To view information about the software:

2. Select About.

## Voice Guide

Voice Guide provides audible output of selected menu items. For example, in GRID VIEW of the main menu, if you highlight 覓, you will hear "Contacts".

## Airplane Mode

Airplane Mode allows you to use many of your phone's features, such as Camera, Calculator, Calendar, and Voice Memos, when you are in an airplane or in any other area where making or receiving calls or data is prohibited. When you set your phone to Airplane Mode, it cannot send or receive any calls or access online information.

1. Press ${ }^{\text {MeNu }}>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Settings $>$ Others $>$ Airplane Mode.
2. Read the disclaimer and press OK (left softkey).
3. Highlight On, Off, or On Power Up and press Mevi

Note: While in Airplane Mode, your phone's standby screen will display "Phone off."

## Data

Data settings on your phone help prevent accidental connections to the Web.

## Net Guard

When you first connect to the Web, the Net Guard will be displayed to confirm that you want to connect. This feature helps you avoid accidental connections. You can disable the Net Guard in the future by selecting Always Auto-Connect when the Net Guard is displayed.

To change your Net Guard settings:


- Select On to activate the Net Guard.
- Select Off to deactivate the Net Guard.

Note: When enabled, the Net Guard appears only once as long as you have not turned the phone off and on.

## Update Data Profile

If you choose to change your user name and select a new one online, you must then update the user name on your phone.

- Press $\stackrel{\text { MENU }}{\text { OK }}>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Settings $>$ Others $>$ Data $>$ Update Data Profile. (To cancel, press before completing the update.)


## Contact Match

The Contact Match feature allows you to choose whether or not contacts matching the numbers you enter into the keypad display under the entry screen. This feature is turned on by default.

## Roaming

When you're roaming on digital networks, your call quality and security will be similar to the quality you receive when making calls on the Nationwide Sprint Network. However, you may not be able to access certain features, such as data services, depending on the available network.

## Data Roam Guard

Depending on service availability and roaming agreements, your phone may be able to access data services while roaming on certain digital systems. You can set your phone to alert you when you are roaming off the Nationwide Sprint Network and try to use data services such as messaging.

To set your Data Roam Guard notification:
 Domestic > Data.
2. Highlight On or Off and press

To use data services when Data Roam Guard is active:

- When a pop-up notification appears informing you that data roam charges may apply, press DONE (left softkey) to connect.


## Setting Roam Mode

Your phone allows you to control your roaming capabilities. By using the Roaming menu option, you can determine which signals your phone accepts. Choose from three different settings on your dual-band phone to control your roaming experience.

Note: If you're on a call when you leave the Nationwide Sprint Network, your call is dropped. If your call is dropped in an area where you think Sprint service is available, turn your phone off and on again to reconnect to the network.

1. Press ${ }^{\text {MENU }}$ OK Settings/Tools $>$ Settings $>$ Others $>$ Roaming $>$ Roaming Mode.
2. Highlight an option and press

MENU
OK

- Automatic to seek service on the Nationwide Sprint Network. When Sprint service is unavailable, the phone searches for an alternate system.
- Sprint Only to access only the Nationwide Sprint Network and prevent roaming on other networks.


## Language

You can choose to display your phone's onscreen menus in English or in Spanish.

1. Press ${ }_{\text {MENU }}^{\text {OKN }}>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Settings $>$ Others $>$ Language .
2. Highlight English or Español and press meñ

## Contacts

You can use the Contacts settings menu to both set up and view information pertaining to your Contacts list.

1. Press \(\xlongequal{\mathrm{MENX}_{\mathrm{KN}}}>\) Settings/Tools \(>\) Settings \(>\) Others \(>\) Contacts.
```

2. Select one of the following options:

- Speed Numbers to view all numbers assigned to the speed dial list.
- Hide/Show Secret to view the list of hidden contacts.
- My Name Card to enter information into a new personal name card or view information in your existing name card.
- Services to access shortcut dialing numbers for customer services.


## TTY Options

A TTY (also known as a TDD or Text Telephone) is a telecommunications phone that allows people who are deaf, hard of hearing, or who have speech or language disabilities, to communicate by telephone. Your phone is compatible with select TTY phones. Please check with the manufacturer of your TTY phone to ensure that it is compatible with digital cell phones. Your phone and TTY phone will connect via a special cable that plugs into your phone's headset jack. ## Web and Data

With your Sprint service, you are ready to start enjoying the advantages of data services and Web access from your phone. This section will help you learn the basics of using your data services, including managing your user name, launching a data connection, and navigating the Web with your phone.

## Getting Started with Web and Data Service

## Your User Name

When you buy your phone and sign up for service, you're automatically assigned a user name, which is typically based on your name and a number, followed by "@sprintpcs.com." (For example, the third John Smith to sign up for Sprint data services might have jsmith003@sprintpcs.com as his user name.)

When you use data services, your user name is submitted to identify you to the Nationwide Sprint Network. Your user name will be automatically programmed into your phone. You don't have to enter it.

## Finding Your User Name

If you aren't sure what your user name is, you can easily find it on your phone.

- Press ${ }^{\text {MENU }}$ > Settings /Tools $>$ Settings > Phone Information > Phone Number/User ID.


## Updating Your User Name

If you choose to change your user name and select a new one online, you must then update the user name on your phone.

- Press ${ }^{\text {ork }}>$ Settings $/$ Tools $>$ Settings $>$ Others $>$ Data $>$ Update Data Profile. (To cancel, press END $^{\circ}$ before completing the update.)


## Launching a Web Connection

You can access the Web from your phone.

- Press ${ }_{\text {page.) }}{ }^{\text {MENU }}>$ Web. (Your data connection starts and you see the SprintWeb ${ }^{\text {SM }}$ home

While connecting, you may see an animation and a "Connecting" message.

## Data Connection Status and Indicators

Your phone displays the current status of your data connection through indicators at the top of the screen.

The following symbols are used:

| Icon | Description |
| :--- | :--- |
|  | Your phone is on and is connected to the Sprint 2G data network. When the <br> arrows are white, your phone is transferring data (for example, when you are <br> opening a Web page) and you can receive calls. |
|  | When the arrows are gray, your phone is connected to the network but is not <br> currently transferring data (for example, when you are viewing a Web page that <br> is completely open), and you can receive calls. If you do not see an indicator, <br> your phone does not have a current data connection. |

Note: If Net Guard is enabled and displayed, press OK to continue and launch the Web.
Tip: To change the default launch page to the last page you viewed, press TOOLBAR > OPTIONS > Advanced > Startup page and select The last page I viewed.

## Navigating the Web

Navigating through menus and websites during a data session is easy once you've learned a few basics. Here are some tips for getting around:

## Softkeys

During a data session, the bottom line of your phone's display contains one or more softkeys. These keys are shortcut controls for navigating around the Web, and they correspond to the softkeys directly below the phone's display screen.

To use softkeys:

- Press a softkey. (If you see an additional pop-up menu when you press the softkey, select the menu items using your keypad [if they're numbered], or by highlighting the option and pressing

MENU

Tip: Depending on which websites you visit, the labels on the softkeys may change to indicate their function.

## Scrolling

As with other parts of your phone's menu, you'll have to scroll up and down to see everything on some websites.

To scroll line by line through websites:

- Press the navigation key up and down.

To scroll page by page through websites:

- Press the volume buttons on the side of the phone.


## Selecting

Once you've learned how to use softkeys and scroll, you can start navigating the Web.
To select onscreen items:

- Use the navigation key to highlight an item, and then press the left softkey (or press

MENU

Tip: You'll find that the left softkey is used primarily for selecting items. This softkey is often labeled "OK."

If the items on a page are numbered, you can use your keypad (number keys) to select an item. Links, which are displayed as underlined text, allow you to jump to Web pages, select special functions, or even place phone calls.

To select links:

- Highlight the link and press the appropriate softkey.


## Going Back

To go back one page:

- Press BACK the key on your phone.


## Going Home

To return to the home page from any other page:

- Press TOOLBAR (right softkey) > MY HOMEPAGE.


## Data Services FAQs

Check our list of FAQs to answer questions you may have about your phone's data services.
How will I know when my phone is ready for data service?

Your user name (for example, bsmith01@sprintpcs.com) will be displayed when you press
MENU
> Settings /Tools> Settings > Phone Information > Phone Number/User ID.
How do I sign in for the first time?
You are automatically signed in to access data services when you turn on your phone.
How do I know when my phone is connected to data services?

Your phone automatically connects when you use data service or an incoming message arrives. You will also see the indicator.

Can I make calls and use data services at the same time?
You can receive calls while data is active. You can place an outgoing call anytime, but it will interrupt any in-progress data session.

When is my data connection active?
Your connection is active when data is being transferred. Outgoing calls are allowed. When active, the indicator is animated on the display screen.

When is my data connection dormant?
If your phone receives no data for 10 seconds, the connection goes dormant. When the connection is dormant, you can make and receive voice calls. (The connection may become active again quickly.) If your phone receives no data for an extended period, the connection will terminate.

## Can I sign out of data services?

You can sign out without turning off your phone; however, you will not be able to browse the Web or use other data services. While signed out, you can still place or receive phone calls, check voicemail, and use other voice services. You may sign in again at any time.

To sign out:

1. Press ${ }^{\text {MENU }}$ OK
2. Press NEXT (left softkey) > Disable Vision and press menv

## Browser

The browser menu offers additional options to expand your use of the Web on your phone. Although the home page offers a broad and convenient array of sites and services for you to browse, not all sites are represented, and certain functions, such as going directly to specific websites, are not available. For these and other functions, you will need to use the browser menu.

## Opening the Browser Menu

The browser menu or toolbar may be opened anytime you have an active data session, from any page you are viewing.

To open the browser toolbar:

- Press TOOLBAR (right softkey). (You will see the browser menu.)

Options available under the browser menu include:

- BACK to visit the previous page.
- FORWARD to move forward a page.

Note: You can also use the key for deleting text (like a BACKSPACE key) when you are entering text.

- MY HOMEPAGE returns the browser to the SprintWeb ${ }^{\text {SM }}$ home page.
- MY PAGES accesses your favorite and recently viewed Web pages.
- SEARCH launches the Google ${ }^{\circledR}$ search engine.
- OPTIONS accesses the Browser options:
- Set a Homepage to set the current page as your browser homepage.
- Font size allows use of a slider to adjust the current text size displayed within the browser. Press Save to store your new setting.
- Send this page to copies the current Web address and attaches it to an outgoing text message.
- Clear private data allows you to delete the current browsing history, browser cache, cookies, and stored passwords.
- Help provides browser shortcut information.
- Advanced allows you to access additional Browser menu options such as: Icon Row, Startup page, Page info, Images on/off, Virtual mouse, Redirect prompt, Send referrer, Turn on error logging, Certificates, Reset browser setting, Reset browser, and About Browser prompt.


## Restarting the Web Browser

If the Web browser seems to be malfunctioning or stops responding, you can usually fix the problem by simply restarting the browser.

1. Press TOOLBAR (right softkey) to open the browser menu.
2. Select OPTIONS > Advanced > Reset Browser Settings.

## Camera

Taking pictures with your phone's built-in camera is as simple as choosing a subject, pointing the lens, and pressing a button.

## Taking Pictures

You can activate the phone's camera mode to take pictures whether the phone is open or closed.

To take a picture with the phone open:

1. Press ${ }_{\text {MENU }}^{\text {OK }}>$ Photos $>$ Camera to activate camera mode. Additional camera options are available through the camera mode OPTIONS (right softkey) menu.

Shortcut: To activate camera mode menu, you can also press the camera key ( ) twice or press and hold the side camera button to open the camera function.
2. Using the phone's display screen as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject.

3. Press ${ }^{\text {MENU }}$ until the shutter sounds. (Your phone automatically saves the picture to the Album.)
4. Press Mork to return to camera mode to take another picture.

To take a picture with the phone closed:
Note: The keys are locked when the phone is closed. Press and hold the camera key and volume key together to unlock the keys.

1. Press $\xlongequal{\text { MaÑ }}$ © Photos $>$ Camera to activate camera mode.
2. Point the camera lens at yourself with the phone closed. (You can check the picture framing through the external display screen.)
3. Press to take the picture. (Your phone automatically saves the picture.)

## Displaying the Status

The Status feature allows you to zoom in on an object when you take a picture.

- From camera mode, press the navigation key up and select an option:
- Status off removes the status information from the screen.
- Status on displays the status icons that reflect your current settings.


## Using the Timed Mode

The Timed Mode feature allows you to take a photo within a 5 or 10 second window of time.

- From camera mode, press the navigation key down and select an option:
- off removes the status information from the screen.
- 5 gives you a five second time delay before the shutter automatically captures the photo.
- 10 gives you a ten second time delay before the shutter automatically captures the photo.


## Camera Settings

When the phone is open and in camera mode, press OPTIONS (right softkey) to display additional camera settings and options:

## Shooting Mode

You can choose from five different shooting modes with your phone's camera.
Note: Single Shot is the default camera function that allows you to take one shot at a time.


## Taking Continuous Shots

The Continuous shots feature allows you to take either 5 or 10 shots in a continuous sequence. When you take continuous shots, you will see a slider that indicates the shot number sequence.

1. From camera mode, press OPTIONS (right softkey) $>$ SHOOTING MODE $>$ Continuous.
2. Highlight an option and press

WENU

- Off to deactivate the multiple shots option.
- 5 to take a series of five pictures
- 10 to take a series of 10 pictures.

Note: The Continuous setting will automatically set the shot image size to $240 \times 320$.
3. Using the phone's display screen as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject.
4. Press $\mathrm{maN}_{\mathrm{KK}}$ until the shutter sounds. (Your phone automatically saves the picture to the Album.)
5. Press Men
or
Press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Review Album to review your continuous shot frames.


## Taking Mosaic Shots

The Mosaic shots feature allows you to take 4 shots in a continuous sequence.

1. From camera mode, press OPTIONS (right softkey) $>$ SHOOTING MODE $>$ Mosaic.
2. Highlight an option and press Mox

- Off to deactivate the multiple shots option.
- 4 to take a series in mosaic format.

Note: The Mosaic setting will automatically set the shot image size to $480 \times 640$.
3. Move the camera toward the desired direction.
menu
4. Press

MEN to take the pictures.


Note: Your phone automatically saves the pictures in your Album. The Mosaic shots will display as one photo split into a four-part grid


## Taking Panorama Shots

This feature allows you to take landscape-oriented or panoramic photos. You can also move the camera left to right or up and down for a wider range of the desired image. The camera will capture a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 8 shots to produce a panoramic image.

1. From camera mode, press OPTIONS (right softkey) $>$ SHOOTING MODE $>$ Panorama.
2. Highlight an option and press MEN:

- Off to deactivate the panoramic option.
- On to activate the panoramic option.

Note: The Panoramic setting will automatically set the shot image size to $240 \times 320$.
3. Move the camera toward the desired direction.
4. Press ${ }^{\operatorname{mox}}{ }_{\mathrm{Kk}}$ only once to begin the panoramic photo process.
5. Move the camera slowly from left to right, ensuring that the red frame evenly surrounds the screen during each automated shot.

Note: The camera will not capture a photo unless the red frame evenly surrounds the screen.
6. After completion, your phone will compile the separate shots into one image and save it to your Album.
7. Press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Review Album to view your panoramic photo.


## Taking Night Shots

Night shots allow you to activate low light image capture. Enabling this feature allows you to take better quality photos in low light conditions.

1. From camera mode, press OPTIONS (right softkey) $>$ SHOOTING MODE $>$ Night Shot.

MENU
2. Highlight an option and press

- Off to deactivate the night shot option.
- On to activate the night shot option.

3. Move the camera toward the desired direction.


## Adjusting the Resolution

You can adjust the resolution of the photos you take.

1. From camera mode, press OPTIONS (right softkey).
2. Use the right navigation key and highlight Resolution.

3. Select 1.3M, High, Med, or Low.

## Adjusting the White Balance

You can adjust the white balance setting on your phone's camera.

1. From camera mode, press OPTIONS (right softkey).
2. Use the right navigation key and highlight WHITE BALANCE.

3. Select one of the following:

- Auto - The white balance has been set to Automatic. Use this for taking pictures indoors or outdoors using automatic white balance settings.
- Daylight - The white balance has been set to Sunny. Use this for taking pictures or movies outdoors on bright sunny days.
- Cloudy - The white balance has been set to Cloudy. Use this for taking pictures or movies outdoors under cloudy conditions.
- Incandescent - The white balance has been set to Tungsten. Use this for taking pictures or movies indoors under normal lighting conditions.
- Fluorescent - The white balance has been set to Fluorescent. Use this for taking pictures or movies indoors under fluorescent lighting conditions.
- Manual - The white balance has been set to Manual. Use this for taking pictures indoors or outdoors using your own custom settings.


## Adjusting Color Tones

Select a color tone for your photos.

1. From camera mode, press OPTIONS (right softkey).
2. Use the right navigation key and highlight EFFECT.

3. Use your right and left navigation keys to view the color previews.
4. Select a color tone.

## Adjusting the Quality

Your phone's camera quality settings include Fine, Normal, and Economy.

1. From camera mode, press OPTIONS (right softkey).
2. Use the right navigation key and highlight QUALITY.

3. Select Fine, Normal, or Economy.

## Adjusting the Shutter Sound

You can choose how the shutter will sound as you snap a picture.

1. From camera mode, press OPTIONS (right softkey).
2. Use the right navigation key and highlight Shutter Sound.

3. Select Off, Shutter1, Shutter2 or Shutter3.

## Adjusting the Grid

This feature allows you to adjust the camera's grid.

1. From camera mode, press OPTIONS (right softkey).
2. Use the right navigation key and highlight Grid.

3. Select Off or On.

## Adjusting the Brightness

This feature allows you to adjust the brightness of the picture.

- From camera mode, press the navigation key left or right. (You will see the gauge bar.)
- Press the right to increase the brightness or the left navigation key to decrease it.


## Erasing Pictures

This feature allows you to delete the photo you just captured, or to delete multiple photos at the same time.

To erase the last photo taken:

1. Take a picture. See Taking Pictures for more information.
2. With the picture displayed, press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Erase.

To erase multiple photos:

1. Press ${ }^{\text {MENU }}$ OK Photos $>$ My Photos.

2. Select OPTIONS (right softkey).
3. Select Delete and select an option:

- Focused Item to delete the selected photo.
- ALL to delete all photos in My Photos.


## Sending a Picture

Once you have taken a photo, you can use the messaging capabilities of your phone to instantly share it with family and friends.

To send a photo to a Contact:

1. Take a picture.
2. With the picture displayed, press SEND (left softkey).
3. Select a listed contact or one of the following options:

- Go to Contacts to select a recipient from your phonebook entries.
- MULTIPLE (left softkey) to select multiple contacts from the list of recent recipients.
- NEW ADDR (right softkey) to enter a new Phone Number or Email Address.

4. Press CONTINUE (left softkey).
5. Compose a message in the space provided.
6. Press OPTIONS (right softkey) to display a list of optional sending, marking, and text input choices. (Text Mode, Add Preset Message, Add/Change Recipient, Add/Change Attachment, Add/Change Subject, Save as Draft, Mark as Urgent, and Set Callback \#.)
7. Press SEND (left softkey).

## Assigning Photos

After taking a picture, assign it as a wallpaper or as a picture ID for a Contacts entry.

1. Take a picture.
2. With the picture displayed, press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Assign and select an option.

- Picture ID to assign the picture to a Contacts entry.
- Select one of the following options:
- Contacts
- Unsaved Numbers
- Private / Unknown
- Wallpaper to assign the picture as a screen saver.

3. Highlight an entry and press ${ }^{\text {MKNU }}$ to assign the picture.

## Tools and Calendar

Learn how to use many of your phone's productivity-enhancing features, such as the alarm, calendar, Bluetooth, voice service, calculator, phone self service, world time, memo pad, and voice memo.

## Alarm

Your phone comes with a built-in alarm clock that has multiple alarm capabilities.

1. Press MENU ${ }^{\text {OK }}>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Alarm.
2. Press CREATE NEW (left softkey).

3. Highlight the ALARM field to turn the alarm on or off.
4. Select a time for the alarm.

- Select AM or PM by pressing the right softkey.

5. Select a ringer type for the alarm by highlighting the ringer field and pressing

MENU OK

- To select a ringer menu, press $\begin{gathered}\text { MENU } \\ \text { © } \\ \text { - }\end{gathered}>$ Downloaded for downloaded ringers, Preloaded for preprogrammed ringers, or No Ringer for ringer sound.

6. Select a repeating status for the alarm by highlighting the repeat field and pressing

- Highlight Daily, Once, or select individual days of the week and press DONE (left softkey).

7. Select a Snooze Interval using the right and left navigation keys.

- Select an interval of 5 minutes, $\mathbf{1 0}$ Minutes, $\mathbf{1 5}$ Minutes, $\mathbf{2 0}$ Minutes, or Off to disallow the Snooze feature.

8. Select a Volume level using the right and left navigation keys.
9. Press DONE (left softkey).

## Calendar

Your phone's Calendar tool helps you organize your time and you can set it to remind you of important events.

## Viewing the Calendar

You can view the calendar in several different ways, including month or day view.

- Press ${ }_{\text {©k }}$ > Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Calendar $>$ Scheduler.



## Viewing the Current Day's Schedule

Your phone comes in handy for checking your current day's schedule.

- Press ok Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Calendar $>$ Today.

## Adding a Schedule

Use your phone's scheduler to add events to your calendar.

3. Enter the event title information and press NEXT (left softkey).

4. Select an event type using your navigation keys to scroll left or right.
5. Select an alarm time for the event using your navigation keys to scroll left or right. You can choose No Alarm, On Time, 10 Min. Before, 30 Min. Before, or 1 Hour Before.

Note: The default alarm time is $\mathbf{1 0} \mathbf{~ M i n . ~ B e f o r e . ~}$
6. Select a repeating status for the event using your navigation keys to scroll left or right.
7. Select a ringer type for the alarm by highlighting the ringer field and pressing

- To select a ringer menu, press $\begin{gathered}\text { Mevi } \\ \text { - }\end{gathered}>$ Downloaded for downloaded ringers, Preloaded for preprogrammed ringers, or No Ringer for ringer sound.

8. Select a Start and End time and date for the event.
9. Select Go to Contact to select one or more contacts to associate with this event.
10. Press DONE (left softkey) to save the event.

## Viewing the Task List

The Task List displays a summary of your upcoming events in chronological order. Each entry displays its relative priority, due time, due date, and whether or not the task was missed.

- Press ${ }^{\text {MexN }}$ > Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Calendar $>$ Task List.

## Viewing the Countdown

The Countdown List displays the number of days that remain until specific scheduled events. If the event itself was missed or ignored through your event alerts, that event displays the number of days passed since the scheduled time.

- Press ${ }_{\text {ok }}>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Calendar $>$ Countdown.

## Managing the Schedule Alerts

When your phone is turned on and you have an event alarm scheduled, your phone alerts you and displays the event summary. There are several ways your phone alerts you to scheduled events:

- By playing the assigned ringer type.
- By illuminating the backlight.
- By flashing the LED.

1. To silence the alarm and reset the schedule, press any key except the navigation keys.
2. To view additional options, press the appropriate option:

- Snooze silences the alarm and schedules it to replay again in 10 minutes.
- View displays the event detail screen.
- Dismiss (right softkey) stops the alarm and eliminates any further notices about the event.


## Erasing a Day's Events

You can delete events scheduled for a specific time and date.

1. Press ${ }^{\text {MENU }}$ (NX
2. Highlight the day for which you would like to erase events and press

OK
3. Highlight the event you want to erase and press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Delete.
4. Select Yes (left softkey) or No (right softkey).

## Erasing All Events

You have the option of deleting all events scheduled before a specific time and date.

1. Press ${ }^{\text {MENU }}$ OK $>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Calendar $>$ Scheduler.
2. Press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Delete All.
3. Select Yes (left softkey) or No (right softkey).

## Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range communications technology that allows you to connect wirelessly to a number of Bluetooth phones, such as headsets and hands-free car kits, and Bluetooth-enabled handhelds, computers, printers, and wireless phones. The Bluetooth communication range is usually up to approximately 30 feet.

## Turning Bluetooth On and Off

Before using Bluetooth, you must turn it on. By default, your phone's Bluetooth feature is set to Off. Turning Bluetooth on makes your phone "discoverable" by other in-range Bluetooth phones.

To turn Bluetooth on:

1. Press MENU $_{\text {OK }}^{\text {M }}>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Bluetooth.
2. Highlight On and press ${ }_{\text {MENV }}^{\text {OK }}$ to enable Bluetooth.

To turn Bluetooth off:

1. Press ${ }^{\text {MENU }}$ © ${ }^{\text {K }}$ Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Bluetooth.
2. Highlight Off and press ${ }^{\text {Mex }}$ to enable Bluetooth.

## Using the Bluetooth Settings Menu

The Bluetooth menu allows you to set up many of the characteristics of your phone's Bluetooth service. These include:

- Entering or changing the name your phone uses for Bluetooth communication.
- Setting your phone's visibility (or "discoverability") for other Bluetooth phones.
- Displaying your phone's Bluetooth address.

To access the Bluetooth Settings menu:

```
1. Press \({ }^{\text {ok }}>\) Settings/Tools \(>\) Tools \(>\) Bluetooth.
```

2. Set your Bluetooth options.

- Highlight My Bluetooth Info and press EDIT (left softkey) to rename your phone for Bluetooth.
- Select Visibility > Always Visible, Visible for 3 Min, or Hidden to set your Bluetooth visibility.
- Select My Bluetooth Info to display your phone's Bluetooth profiles and address.


## Pairing Bluetooth Phones

The Bluetooth pairing process allows you to establish trusted connections between your phone and another Bluetooth phone. When you pair phones, they share a passkey, allowing for fast, secure connections while bypassing the discovery and authentication process.

To pair your phone with another Bluetooth phone:

1. Press $\xlongequal[\text { MENU }]{\text { OK }}>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Bluetooth $>$ Add New $><$ Search $>$. (Your phone will display a list of discovered in-range Bluetooth phones.)
2. Highlight a phone and press

3. Enter the PIN code and press

Note: Due to different specifications and features of other Bluetooth-compatible phones, display and operations may be different, and functions such as transfer or exchange may not be possible with all Bluetooth-compatible phones

## Updating Phone

From time to time, software updates may be available for your phone.
To download software updates to your phone:

```
1. Press \(\xlongequal{\text { MeN }}{ }^{\mathrm{KK}}>\) Settings/Tools \(>\) Tools \(>\) Update Phone.
```

2. Press Update Firmware to update your phone's software version or Update PRL to update the list of geographic areas your phone can use during roaming. (Your phone automatically downloads and installs any available updates. You may be required to power your phone off and back on to complete the software upgrade.)

## Voice Service

Your phone's voice service capabilities make it possible for you to complete tasks such as dialing a phone number in your Contacts simply by talking into your phone.

## Automatic Speech Recognition (ASR)

You can use your phone's built-in automatic speech recognition (ASR) software to dial a phone number in your Contacts or to launch phone functions. All you have to do is to talk into the phone, and ASR will recognize your voice and complete tasks by itself.

## Activating ASR

- Press and hold ${ }^{\text {talk }}$

The screen displays "Say a command" and the phone prompts you to say the name of the command you want to use. To complete your task, simply follow the voice prompts.

Available ASR commands include:

- Call <name or \#> to call an entry in your Contacts list or a spoken phone number.
- Send Text <Name or \#> to send a text message to the spoken name or phone number.
- Lookup <Name> to lookup the spoken contact name.
- Go To <Menu> to jump directly to menu items or applications.
- Check <ltem> to check your phone's status.

Tip: Use ASR in a quiet environment so it can accurately recognize your commands.

## Making a Voice Call with ASR

1. Press and hold

TALK
2. If you hear "Say a command," say "Call."
3. If you hear "Say the name or number," say a name or a phone number.
4. If you hear "Which location?", say a number type (for example, "Mobile").

Tip: You can skip steps 3 and 4 by saying a name and location after "Call" without pausing (for example, "Call John Jones mobile").

Note: If ASR does not recognize the name or number, it will find the most likely matches and display a list of up to three names or numbers. You will hear "Did you say..." followed by the name or number. You can confirm by saying "Yes." Say "No" to change the selection.

## Opening Menus with ASR

You can jump directly to many menu items or applications by saying "Go to" followed by a menu option.

1. Press and hold

2. If you hear "Say a command," say "Go To."
3. If you hear "Which shortcut?," say an application name (for example, "Messages").
4. The phone opens the selected menu.

## Checking Phone Status Using ASR

You can use ASR to obtain information about your phone:

- Status
- Time
- Signal Strength
- Network
- Battery
- My Phone Number

1. Press and hold

TALK
2. If you hear "Say a command," say "Check."
3. If you hear "Which status item?," say a command.

## ASR Options

To change ASR confirmation:

1. Press and hold
talk
2. Press SETTINGS (right softkey) > Confirmation and select an option.

- Automatic to ask for confirmation only when the system is not sure what you said.
- Always Confirm to always ask for confirmation.
- Never Confirm to never ask for confirmation.

To adapt the system to your voice:

1. Press and hold talk
2. Press SETTINGS (right softkey) $>$ Adaptation $>$ Adapt Voice.
3. Press START (left softkey) and repeat each word, phrase, or telephone number you hear.

To reset the adaptation:

1. Press and hold
2. Press SETTINGS (right softkey) > Adaptation > Reset Voice > Yes (left softkey).

To change the ASR mode:

1. Press and hold
2. Press SETTINGS (right softkey) > Audio Modes and select an option.

- Expert Mode to sound a beep only.
- Prompt Mode to prompt for required information.


## Calculator

Your phone comes with a built-in calculator and handy tip and eco-calculators for figuring tip percentages and miles-per-gallon.

1. Press MENU $>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Calculator $>$ Calculator.

2. Enter numbers using your keypad.

- Press ${ }^{\text {* snif }}$ to enter decimal points.
- Press ${ }^{\# \text { smad }}$ to change the sign from positive to negative.
- Press CLEAR (right softkey) to clear all numbers.

3. Press ${ }^{\text {MENU }}$ OK for the calculation result.

## Tip Calculator

With the tip calculator, you can configure the tip percentage you owe on a bill.

2. Use your keypad and navigation key to enter the Bill (\$) amount, Tip (\%), and \# Paying.

The Tip (\$) displays the amount you pay for a tip and You pay displays the total amount you pay on the bill.

## Eco Calculator

Your phone comes with an eco calculator that allows you to configure the amount you pay per gallon of fuel and the resulting efficiency of your car's mileage.

To calculate your car's price of fuel per gallon:

1. Press $\xlongequal{\text { MENU }}$ OKN Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Calculator $>$ Eco Calculator.
2. Press Create (left softkey).
or

Press OPTIONS (left softkey) > Create.

3. Use your keypad and navigation key to enter the Distance (mi), Fuel (\$), (gallon), and Price (\$/gallon) amounts.

The calculator displays the (\$/mile) and (gallon/mile) efficiency amounts.

## Device Self Service

This built-in service on your phone allows you to activate your phone manually via a Webenabled UI.

1. Press ${ }^{\text {MENV }} \mathrm{OK}>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Device Self Service.
2. Follow the onscreen prompts to manually activate your new phone.

## World Time

You phone gives you the capability to view the time in over 50 different locations around the world.

1. Press $\xlongequal{\text { MeNu }}>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ World Time.

2. Use your right or left navigation keys to scroll through the list of cities.
3. Press SET DST (left softkey) to turn Daylight Savings Time On or Off.

## Memo Pad

Your phone comes with a memo pad that you can use to compose and store reminders and notes to help keep you organized.

To compose a memo:

1. Press ${ }^{\text {MeNV }}$ OKV $>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Memo Pad $>$ Add New.
2. Type your note using the keypad and press

To read a saved note:

1. Press ${ }^{\text {MENU }} \mathbf{0} \times$ Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Memo Pad .
2. Highlight a note and press Meñ

To delete saved notes:

1. Press $\xlongequal{\text { MENU }} \mathrm{OK}$ Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Memo Pad.
2. Highlight a note and press MEN
3. Press OPTIONS (right softkey) $>$ Delete $>$ Yes (left softkey).

## Voice Memos

Use your phone's Voice Memo feature to record brief memos to remind you of important events, phone numbers, or grocery list items and to record conversations during a call.

Note: Your phone can store 1 minute of memos during a call and 2 minutes within the Tools menu.

## Recording a Current Call

With your phone's Voice Memo feature, you can record a phone call while you are on the call.

1. While on a call, press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Voice Memo to begin recording the call.
2. To pause the recording, press PAUSE (left softkey), or press STOP (left softkey) to stop recording.

## Recording Voice Memos

Recording Voice Memos is as easy as speaking into your phone.

1. Press ${ }^{\text {MENU }}>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Voice Memo $>$ Record.
2. Begin recording after the voice prompt.


To end the recording of your memo:

- Press or FINISH (right softkey).


## Playing Voice Memos

You can play and review the voice memos you have recorded.

1. Press ${ }^{\text {MENU }} \mathbf{\text { OKN }}$.
2. Highlight the Memo you want to play and press REVIEW (left softkey).

## Erasing Voice Memos

You can erase voice memos that you have previously recorded.

1. Press $\xlongequal{\text { MeNU }}>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Voice Memo $>$ Review.
2. Highlight the Memo you want to erase and press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Delete > DELETE (left softkey).

To erase all voice memos:

2. Press OPTIONS > Delete All > DELETE (left softkey).

## Editing Voice Memos

You can edit the titles or captions you assign to voice memos.

1. Press ${ }^{\text {MENU }}$ OK
2. Highlight the Memo you want to edit, and press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Edit Caption.
3. Enter the new title and press DONE (left softkey).

## Check Voice Memo Information

You can check information about your voice memos such as length, and time and date of the recording.

2. Highlight the Memo whose information you want to view and press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Info.
3. Check the information and press DONE (left softkey).

## Send a Voice Memo Message

You can even send a voice memo as a message.

1. Press ${ }^{\text {Mex̃ }}$ ok $>$ Settings/Tools $>$ Tools $>$ Voice Memo $>$ Review.
2. Highlight the Memo you want to send and press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Send Message.
3. Select the message recipient and press

OK information.
