Assembling

Unpack

Check your product box for the following items:

- · Mobile phone
- Battery
- Travel adapter (charger)
- User manual



Use only Samsung-approved software. Pirated or illegal software may cause damage or malfunctions that are not covered by your manufacturer's warranty.



- The items supplied with your phone may vary depending on the software and accessories available in your region or offered by your service provider.
- You can obtain additional accessories from your local Samsung dealer.
- The supplied accessories perform best for your phone.

Install the SIM or USIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services. To use UMTS or HSDPA services, you can purchase a Universal Subscriber Identity Module (USIM) card.

To install the SIM or USIM card and battery,

- If the phone is on, press and hold the Power/End key to turn it off.
- Remove the back cover.



Be careful not to damage your fingernails when you remove the back cover.

Insert the SIM or USIM card.





- Place the SIM or USIM card into the phone with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.
- If you do not insert a SIM or USIM card, you can only use your phone's non-network services and some menus.

4 Insert the battery.



5 Replace the back cover.



Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

You can charge the phone with the provided travel adapter or by connecting the phone to a PC with a PC data cable.



Use only Samsung-approved chargers and cables. Unauthorised chargers or cables can cause batteries to explode or damage your phone.



When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and display a low battery message. The battery icon (IIII) will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

Charge with the travel adapter

- Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the phone.
- 2 Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.



Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages due to misuse are not covered by the warranty.





3 Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.



- You can use the phone while it is charging, but it may take longer to fully charge the battery.
- While charging, the phone may heat up. This is normal and should not affect your phone's lifespan or performance.
- If your phone is not working properly, bring your phone and the charger to a Samsung Service Centre.

4 When the battery is fully charged (the battery icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the phone and then from the power outlet.



- Do not remove the battery before removing the travel adapter. Doing this may cause damage to the phone.
- To ensure peak performance of your battery, fully charge and discharge (use until empty) the battery the first two or three times.

When you charge the battery for the first time, charging your battery completely may take about 2 hours. Because the battery is a consumable part, the battery will gradually wear out and the charging time will be reduced. The initial charging capacity of your battery is about 900 mAh.

Charge with the PC data cable

Before charging, ensure that your PC is turned on.

- Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the phone.
- 2 Plug one end (micro USB) of the PC data cable into the multifunction jack.
- 3 Plug the other end of the PC data cable into a USB port on a PC.



Depending on the type of PC data cable you are using, it may take some time before charging begins.

4 When the battery is fully charged (the battery icon is no longer moving), unplug the PC data cable from the phone and then from the PC.

Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards with maximum capacities of 16 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).

- Samsung uses approved industry standards for memory cards, but some brands may not be fully compatible with your phone. Using an incompatible memory card may damage your phone or the memory card and can corrupt data stored on the card.
 - Your phone supports only the FAT file structure for memory cards. If you insert a card formatted with a different file structure, your phone will ask you to reformat the memory card.
 - Frequent writing and erasing of data will shorten the lifespan of memory cards.

- Remove the back cover.
- Insert a memory card with the gold-coloured contacts facing up.



3 Replace the back cover.

Remove the memory card

- Ensure that the phone is not currently using the memory card.
- 2 Remove the back cover.

- 3 Push the memory card in gently until it disengages from the phone, and then pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.
 - Do not remove a memory card while the phone is transferring or accessing information, as this could result in loss of data or damage to the memory card or phone.

> Format the memory card

Formatting your memory card on a PC may cause incompatibilities with your phone. Format the memory card only on the phone.

In Menu mode, select **Settings** \rightarrow **Memory settings** \rightarrow **Memory card** \rightarrow **Format memory card** \rightarrow **Yes**.

Before formatting the memory card, remember to make backup copies of all important data stored on your phone. The manufacturer's warranty does not cover loss of data resulting from user actions.

Attach a hand strap (optional)

- Remove the back cover.
- 2 Slide a hand strap through the hand strap hole and hook it over the small projection.



3 Replace the back cover.

Getting started

Turn your phone on and off

To turn on your phone,

- Press and hold [76].
- 2 Enter your PIN and press **Confirm** (if necessary).
- 3 When the setup wizard opens, customise your phone as desired by following the screen

To turn off your phone, repeat step 1 above.



- Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where the use of wireless devices is restricted, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.
- To use your phone's non-network services only, switch to the offline profile. ► p. 20

Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

- / In Idle mode, press < Menu > to access Menu mode.
 - Use the Navigation key to scroll to a menu or option.
- 3 Press **Select**>, **Save**>, or the Confirm key to confirm key to confirm the highlighted option.
- 4 Press < Back> to move up one level; Press [] to close the menu or application and return to Idle mode.

Use the shortcut toolbar

You can use the shortcut toolbar to access your favourite menus.

To access a menu from the shortcut toolbar,

In Idle mode, scroll left or right to the menu you want and press the Confirm key.

To edit menus on the shortcut toolbar,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → Shortcuts toolbar.
- *?* Press **<Options>** → **Edit**.
- 3 Select the menus you want. Press < Options> → Open to select submenus (if necessary).
- 4 Press **<Save**>, or press **<Options**> → **Save**.

Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

- Change the language of the display
- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone settings → Language → Screen text.
- 2 Select a language you want.
- Set the current time and date
 - In Menu mode, select **Settings** \rightarrow **Time and date**.
- 2 Select the time zone updating option and your time zone.
- 3 Set the time and date format, and enter the current time and date.
- \mathcal{A} Press **Save**.
- Adjust the volume of the key tones
 In Idle mode, press [▲/▼] to adjust the volume.

Switch to the silent profile

In Idle mode, press and hold [#] to mute or unmute your phone.

> Set up a sound profile

You can change your phone's sounds by customising the current sound profile or switching to another sound profile. To set up a profile,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.
- 2 Press **<Options>** → **Edit**.
- 3 Customise the sound options for incoming calls, incoming messages, and other phone sounds.



Available sound options vary depending on the selected profile.

4 Press < Options $> \rightarrow$ Save.

To switch to another profile, select it from the list.

Select a wallpaper for the idle screen

You can select separate wallpapers for each panel of the idle screen.

- In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Display and light** → **Home screen**.
- 2 Scroll left or right to Image.
- 3 Select Wallpaper.
- 4 Scroll left or right to a memory location (if necessary).
- 5 Select an image category \rightarrow an image.
- 6 Press < Options> → Save.

Select a theme for menu screens

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → My theme.
- 2 Select a theme.

- 3 Scroll left or right to preview the theme.
- 4 Press <**Save**>.

To create and apply a theme,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and Light → My theme.
- 2 Press < Options > → Create → Easy or Expert.
- 3 Customise the theme as desired by following the screen.
- 4 When you are finished, enter a name for the theme and press <**Save**>.
- 5 Press < Yes> to apply the theme.



If you select the same colour for the entire theme, you may not be able to recognise the display.

Adjust the brightness of the display

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → LCD brightness.
- 2 Scroll left or right to adjust the level of brightness.
- Press <**Save>**.



The brightness level of the display will affect how quickly the phone consumes battery power.

Use shortcuts from the toolbar

Use the icons on the toolbar to access popular applications. To activate and customise the toolbar,

- In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Display and Light** → **Shortcuts toolbar**.
- 2 Press <Options> → Edit.
- 3 Select applications to use on the toolbar.
- 4 Press <Save> or press <Options> → Save.

Lock your phone

You can lock your phone by activating the phone password.

- In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Security** → **Phone** lock → On
- Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and press <Confirm>.
- Enter the new password again and press **Confirm**>.



The first time you access a menu that requires a password, you will be prompted to create and confirm a password.

Once the phone lock is enabled, you must enter the password each time you turn on the phone.



- If you forget your password, bring your phone to a Samsung Service Centre to unlock it.
- Samsung is not responsible for any loss of passwords or private information or other damages caused by illegal software.

Lock your SIM or USIM card

You can lock your phone by activating the PIN supplied with your SIM or USIM card.

- In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Security** → **PIN lock** → On
- Enter the PIN of your SIM or USIM card and press <Confirm>.

Once the PIN lock is enabled, you must enter the PIN each time you turn on the phone.



card.

- If you enter an incorrect PIN too many times, your SIM or USIM card will be blocked. You must enter a PIN unlock key (PUK) to unblock the SIM or USIM
 - If you block your SIM or USIM card by entering an incorrect PUK, bring the card to your service provider to unblock it.



Activate the mobile tracker

When someone inserts a new SIM or USIM card in your phone, the mobile tracker feature will automatically send the contact number to specified recipients to help you locate and recover your phone.

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Security → Mobile tracker.
- 2 Enter your password and press **Confirm**>.
- 3 Scroll left or right to On.
- 4 Scroll down and press the Confirm key to open the recipient list.
- 5 Press < Options> → Phonebook to open your contact list.
- 6 Select a contact \rightarrow a number.

- Press the Confirm key to save the recipients.
- δ Scroll down and enter the sender's name.
- 9 Press the Confirm key → < Accept>.

Enter text

You can enter text by pressing keys on the keypad.

Change the text input mode

- Press [#] to switch an input mode; Press and hold [#] to select an input mode.
- Press [*] to change case or switch to Number mode in ABC or T9 mode.
- Press and hold [*) to switch to Symbol mode.

Communication

Calling

Learn to use calling functions, such as making and answering calls using options available during a call, or customising and using call-related features.

Make and answer a call

Make a call

- In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone number.
- Press [] to dial the number.
 For a video call, press < Options > → Video call.
- 3 To end the call, press [\sim].



- Use the phonebook to save numbers you dial frequently. ► p. 55
- To quickly access the call log to redial the numbers you dialled recently, press [~].

Answer a call

- When a call comes in, press the Dial key.
- 2 For a video call, press < Show me> to allow the caller to see you via the front camera lens.
- 3 To end the call, press [\sim].

Reject a call

When a call comes in, press the Power/End key. The caller will hear a busy tone.



You can set up a list of numbers to reject incoming calls automatically. ▶ p. 30

Call an international number

- In Idle mode, press and hold [0] to insert the + character.
- 2 Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code and phone number), and then press [] to dial the number.

Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the device, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press the headset button, and then press and hold the button.
- To answer a call, press the headset button.
- To end a call, press the headset button.

Use options during a voice call

You can use the following options while a voice call is in progress:

- To adjust the voice volume, press [▲/▼].
- To place a call on hold, press < Hold >. To retrieve a held call, press < Retrieve >.
- To activate the speakerphone feature, press the Confirm key → < Yes>.



In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing some calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better audio performance, use the normal phone mode.

- To turn off the microphone so that the other party cannot hear you, press < Options> → Mute.
- To listen and talk to the other party via the headset, press
 Options> → Switch to headset.
- To switch the current call to a video call, press
 Options> → Switch to video call.

- To dial a second call, place the first call on hold and then dial a new number.
- To answer a second call, press < Options> → New
 call when a call waiting tone sounds. The first call is
 automatically placed on hold. You must subscribe to the
 call waiting service to use this feature.
- To switch between the two calls, press < Swap>.
- To end the call on hold, press < Options> → End → Held call.

Use options during a video call

You can use the following options while a video call is in progress:

- To adjust the voice volume, press [▲/▼].
- To hide your image from the other party, press < Hide me>. To show your image to the other party, press
 <Show me>.
- To deactivate the speakerphone feature, press < Options> → Normal.

- To listen and talk to the other party via the headset, press
 Options> → Switch to headset.
- To select an alternative image to be shown to the other party, press <**Options**> → **Outgoing image**.

• To turn off the microphone so that the other party

- cannot hear you, press < Options> → Mute.

 To record a video call. select press < Options> → Record
- video call.
- To switch between the front and rear camera lens,
 <Options> → Front camera or Rear camera.
- To capture the other party's image, <Options> →
 Capture image.
- To apply display options, such as brightness and effects, press < Options> → Display options.
- To switch the current call to a voice call, press < Options>
 → Switch to voice call.

View and dial missed calls

Your phone will display calls you have missed on the display. To dial the number of a missed call,

- / Press < View >.
- 2 Scroll to the missed call you want to dial.
- 3 Press [
 →] to dial.

Use additional features

You can use various other call-related features, such as auto rejection, fake calls, or Fixed Dialling Number (FDN) mode.

Set auto rejection

Use auto rejection to reject calls from certain numbers automatically. To activate the auto rejection and set up the reject list.

- In Menu mode, select **Settings** \rightarrow **Application settings** \rightarrow **Call** \rightarrow **All calls** \rightarrow **Auto reject**.
- Scroll left or right to **On**.
- Select **Reject list**.
- 4 Press <Options> → Create.
- 5 Enter a number to reject and press $\langle \mathbf{Options} \rangle \rightarrow \mathbf{Save}$.
- To add more numbers, repeat steps 4-5.
- 7 Select numbers to reject.
- Press < **Options** > → **Save**.
- 9 Press <Save>.

Make a fake call

You can simulate incoming calls when you want to get out of meetings or unwanted conversations.

To make a fake call, press and hold $[\P]$ in Idle mode. A fake call comes in after a specified length of time.



You can change the delay time before fake calls. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Application settings** → **Call** → **Fake** call → **Fake** call timer.

You can make fake calls appear more realistic by playing back a recorded voice. To record a voice,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Application settings → Call → Fake call → Fake call voice.
- 2 Scroll to Fake call voice and press <Options> → Edit.
- 3 Press < Record > to start recording.
- 4 Speak into the microphone.
- 5 When you are finished speaking, press the Navigation key down.
- 6 Press **Set**> to use the recording as a response for fake calls.
- 7 Select **Fake call voice** and press the Confirm key.

Use Fixed Dialling Number (FDN) mode

In FDN mode, your phone will restrict outgoing calls, except for the numbers stored in the FDN list. You must first set up your FDN list in the phonebook to use FDN mode. ▶ p. 57

To activate FDN mode,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Security → Fixed dialling mode.
- 2 Select **On**.
- 3 Press < Save >.
- 4 Enter the PIN2 supplied with your SIM or USIM card and press < Confirm>.

Set call diverting

Call diverting is a network feature to send incoming calls to another number that you specify. You can set this feature separately for several conditions when you are not able to answer calls, such as when you are already on the phone or when you are outside of the service area.

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Application settings → Call → Voice call or Video call → Call diverting.
- 2 Select a condition.
- 3 Enter a number to which calls will be forwarded.
- 4 Press < Options > → Activate.

Your setting will be sent to the network.

Set call barring

Call barring is a network feature to restrict certain types of calling or to prevent others from making calls with your phone.

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Application settings → Call → Voice call or Video call → Call barring.
- 2 Select a call type to restrict.
- β Enter a call barring password.
- 4 Press < Options> → Activate.
 Your setting will be sent to the network.

Set call waiting

Call waiting is a network feature to alert you of an incoming call while you are on a previous call. This feature is available only for voice calls.

- In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Application** settings \rightarrow Call \rightarrow Voice calls \rightarrow Call waiting.
- Press < Options $> \rightarrow$ Activate. Your setting will be sent to the network.

Call log

Learn to view and manage logs of calls you have dialled. received, or missed and messages you have sent.

View call and message logs

You can view logs of your calls and messages filtered by their types. Your phone will save logs for up to 30 dialled calls, 30 missed calls, 30 received calls, 30 received messages, and 30 sent messages.

- In Menu mode, select **Call log**.
- Scroll left or right to select a log type.
- Select a log to view its details.



From the detail view, you can dial the number, send a message to the number or add the number to the phonebook or reject list.

View the log manager

From the log manager, you can check the amount of data or number of messages sent or received and the cost and duration of your calls.

- In Menu mode, select Call log.
- Press **<Options>** → Call manager.

Option	Function
Data counter	View the amount of data you have sent or received.
Call cost	View cost records for your calls, such as the cost of the last call and the total cost of all calls. You can also set the currency and price per unit, or cost limit to restrict calls according to your calling plan; The cost counter may be unavailable depending on your SIM or USIM card.
Call time	View time data for your calls, such as the duration of the last call and the total duration of all calls.



You can reset the records in the log manager. From each screen, press < Options > → Reset or Reset all.

Messages

Learn to create and send text (SMS), multimedia (MMS), or email messages, and view or manage messages you have sent or received.



You may incur additional charges for sending or receiving messages while outside your home service area. For details, contact your service provider.

Send a text message

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create message → Message.
- 2 Enter a recipient number and scroll down.
- 3 Enter your message text.
- 4 Press the Confirm key to send the message.

> Set up an MMS profile



Connectivity

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology capable of exchanging information over a distance of about 10 metres (30 feet) without requiring a physical connection.

You do not need to line up the devices to beam information with Bluetooth. If the devices are within range of one another, you can exchange information between them even if they are located in different rooms.



- Samsung is not responsible for the loss, interception, or misuse of data sent or received via the Bluetooth wireless feature.
- Always ensure that you share and receive data with devices that are trusted and properly secured. If there are obstacles between the devices, the operating distance may be reduced.
- Some devices, especially those that are not tested or approved by Bluetooth SIG, may be incompatible with your phone.

Turn on the Bluetooth wireless feature

- In Menu mode, select **Applications** \rightarrow **Bluetooth**.
- 2 Press <Options> → Settings.
- 3 Scroll down to Activation.
- 4 Scroll left or right to **On**.

5 To allow other devices to locate your phone, scroll down to My phone's visibility → a visibility option → < OK>.

If you selected **Custom**, set duration that your phone is visible.

- 6 Press < Options> → Save.
- Find and pair with other Bluetoothenabled devices
- In Menu mode, select Applications → Bluetooth → Search for new devices.
- 2 Scroll to a device and press < Select>.

Enter a PIN for the Bluetooth wireless feature or the other device's Bluetooth PIN, if it has one, and press < OK>. Alternatively, press < Yes> to match the PIN between your phone and the device.
When the owner of the other device enters the same

PIN or accepts the connection, pairing is complete. If

the pairing is successful, the device will automatically

search for available services



Some devices, especially headsets or hands-free car kits, may have a fixed Bluetooth PIN, such as 0000. If the other device has a PIN, you must enter it.

Once the phone is paired with another Bluetooth-enabled device, the device icon will turn blue. Press **Options**> and use the following options:

- To browse the file directory of the device and exchange files, select **Browse files**.
- To check Bluetooth services available on the paired device, select Service list.

- To change the device name, select **Rename**.
- To allow the device to access your phone without your confirmation, select Authorise device.



To check Bluetooth services available on your phone and information about the services, select **Bluetooth services**.

Send data using the Bluetooth wireless feature

- Select a file or item, such as a contact, calendar event, memo, task, or media file, from an appropriate application or **My files**.
- 2 Press <Options> → Send via, Send namecard via or Send URL via → Bluetooth (when sending contact data, specify which data to send).

Receive data using the Bluetooth wireless feature

- I Enter the PIN for the Bluetooth wireless feature and press <**OK**> (if necessary).
- 2 press < Yes> to confirm that you are willing to receive data from the device (if necessary).

Received data is saved to an appropriate application or folder according to its type. For example, a music or sound clip is saved to the sound folder and a contact to the phonebook.

Print data using the Bluetooth wireless feature

Select a file or item, such as a message, contact, calendar event or image, from an appropriate application or My files.

- 2 Press <Options> → Print via Bluetooth. For images, press <Options> → Print via → Bluetooth.
- 3 Search for and pair with a Bluetooth-enabled printer.

Use Remote SIM mode



- Mobile tracker: Activate or deactivate the mobile tracker feature which helps you locate your phone when it is lost or stolen.

Network settings

Access or alter the following settings to control how your phone selects and connects to networks:

- **Network selection**: Set the network selection method to automatic or manual.
- Network mode: Select a network band.
- Connections: Set up connection profiles to use for network features.
- Certificates: View certificates required for network services.

PC connections

Set a USB mode to be activated when you connect the phone to a PC. \blacktriangleright p. 72

Setup wizard

Initiate the wizard that helps you customise your phone.

Memory settings

Access and alter the following settings to control your phone's memory use:

 Clear phone memory: Erase the selected data from your phone's memory.



This will permanently erase all selected data from the phone's memory.

- Memory card: Access details about your memory card and set Bluetooth visibility for files in the memory card. You can also format the memory card or change the memory card's name.
- Memory status: View the used and available memory for various types of files.
- Default memory: Select the default memory location to save files.



Reset settings

Reset various settings to the factory default values. Select which settings to reset. You must enter your phone password to reset the settings.

Troubleshooting

When you turn on your phone or while you are using the phone, it prompts you to enter one of the following codes:

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
Password	When the phone lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password you set for the phone.
PIN	When using the phone for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM card. You can disable this feature by using the PIN lock menu.
PUK	Your SIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
PIN2	When you access a menu requiring the PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied with the SIM card. For details, contact your service provider.

Your phone displays "Service unavailable" or "Network error"

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription.
 Contact your service provider for more details.

Calls are being dropped

When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose your connection to the network. Move to another area and try again.

Outgoing calls are not connected

- Ensure that you have pressed the Dial key.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number you are dialling.

Incoming calls are not connected

- Ensure that your phone is turned on.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the incoming phone number.

Others cannot hear you speaking on a call

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- · If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

Audio quality is poor

- Ensure that you are not blocking the phone's internal antenna.
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

When dialling from contacts, the call is not connected

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the contact's phone number.

The phone beeps and the battery icon flashes

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the phone.

The battery does not charge properly or the phone turns off

- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both goldcoloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery (refer to your local ordinances for proper disposal instructions).

Your phone is hot to the touch.

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your phone for an extended period of time, your phone may feel hot to the touch. This is normal and should not affect your phone's lifespan or performance.

Error messages appear when launching the camera

Your Samsung mobile phone must have sufficient available memory and battery power to operate the camera application. If you receive error messages when launching the camera, try the following:

- Charge the battery or replace it with a battery that is fully charged.
- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your phone.
- Restart the phone. If you are still having trouble with the camera application after trying these tips, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

Error messages appear when launching the FM radio

The FM radio application on your Samsung mobile phone uses the headset cable as an antenna. Without a headset connected, the FM radio will be unable to receive radio stations. To use the FM radio, first ensure that the headset is properly connected. Next, scan for and save the available radio stations.

If you still cannot use the FM radio after performing these steps, try accessing your desired station with another radio receiver. If you can hear the station with another receiver, your phone may require service. Contact a Samsung Service Centre.

Error messages appear when opening music files

Some music files may not play on your Samsung mobile phone for a variety of reasons. If you receive error messages when opening music files on your phone, try the following:

- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your phone.
- Ensure that the music file is not Digital Rights
 Management (DRM)-protected. If the file is DRMprotected, ensure that you have the appropriate license
 or key to play the file.
- Ensure that your phone supports the file type.

Another Bluetooth device is not located

- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on your phone.
- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on the device you wish to connect to, if necessary.
- Ensure that your phone and the other Bluetooth device are within the maximum Bluetooth range (10 metres/30 feet).

If the tips above do not solve the problem, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

A connection is not established when you connect the phone to a PC

- Ensure that the PC data cable you are using is compatible with your phone.
- Ensure that you have the proper drivers installed and updated on your PC.

Keep your phone away from small children and pets
