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Section 1: Getting Started

This section allows you to quickly start using your phone by installing and charging the battery, activating your service, and setting up voicemail.

Understanding this User Manual

The sections of this manual generally follow the features of your phone. A robust index for features begins on page 207. Also included is important safety information that you should know before using your phone. Most of this information is near the back of the guide, beginning on page 173.

This manual gives navigation instructions according to the default display settings. If you select other settings, navigation may be different.

Unless otherwise specified, all instructions in this manual assume that you are starting from the Home screen, and using the external keys. To get to the Home screen, you may need to unlock the phone or keypad. For more information, see Locking and Unlocking see "Locking and unlocking the phone" on page 13.

Note: Instructions in this manual are based on default settings, and may vary from your phone, depending on the software version on your phone, and any changes to the phone's Settings.

Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this User Manual start with the phone unlocked, at the Home screen.

All screen images in this manual are simulated. Actual displays may vary, depending on the software version of your phone and any changes to the phone's Settings.

Special Text

Throughout this manual, you'll find text that is set apart from the rest. These are intended to point out important information, share quick methods for activating features, to define terms, and more. The definitions for these methods are as follows:

- Notes: Presents alternative options for the current feature, menu, or sub-menu.
- Tips: Provides quick or innovative methods, or useful shortcuts.
- Important: Points out important information about the current feature that could affect performance.
- Warning: Brings to your attention important information to prevent loss of data or functionality, or even prevent damage to your phone.

Text Conventions

This manual provides condensed information about how to use your phone. To make this possible, the following text conventions are used to represent often-used steps:

Highlight Use **Directional Keys** or to move focus to an item on the screen.

Select Use **Directional Keys** to highlight an item on the screen, then press the **Center Select Key**

or . The Center Select Key function changes based on the type of item highlighted.

Arrows are used to represent the "highlight, then select" steps in longer, or repetitive, procedures.

For example: "From the Home screen, press the Center Select Key to select MENU → Messaging → New Message.

Activating your Phone

If you purchased your phone at a Verizon Wireless store, it is activated and ready to use. If you received a new phone by mail, it may need to be activated before you can use it.

To activate your phone, choose from the following:

Displaying Your Telephone Number

My Number displays the ten-digit telephone number assigned to your phone.

From the Home screen, press the Center Select Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone Info → My Number.

Battery

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable, standard Li-lon battery. A USB cable and Charging Head are included with the phone, for charging the battery.

Note: The battery comes partially charged. You must fully charge the battery before using your phone for the first time. A fully discharged battery can require up to 4 hours of charge time. After the first charge, you can use the phone while charging.

Warning! Use only Samsung-approved charging devices and batteries. Samsung accessories are designed to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may invalidate your warranty and may cause damage.

Battery Indicator

The battery icon in the upper-right corner of the display shows battery power level, with four bars [IIII] indicating a full charge. Two to three minutes before the battery becomes too low to operate, the empty battery icon will flash and a tone will sound. If you continue to operate the phone without charging, the phone will power off.

Battery Cover

The battery is under a removable cover on the back of the phone.

Removing the battery cover

 Hold the device firmly and lift the cover at the cover release latch.



Installing the battery cover

 Align the cover and press it into place, making sure it snaps securely all the way around.

Installing the Battery

- **1.** Remove the battery cover. For more information, see *"Removing the battery cover"* on page 7.
- Insert the top end of the battery into the phone housing, aligning the gold contacts on the battery with the gold contacts in the phone. Push down on the bottom of the battery down until it snaps into place.

Removing the Battery

- 2. Lift the battery up by the slot provided.



3. Lift the battery up and out of the phone.

Charging the Battery

Your phone includes a USB Cable and Charging Head to rapidly charge your phone from any 120/220 VAC outlet.

Note: The battery comes partially charged. You must fully charge the battery before using your phone for the first time. A fully discharged battery can require up to 4 hours of charge time. After the first charge, you can use the phone while charging.

1. Connect the USB cable to the charging head.



2. Insert the USB cable into the USB/Accessory port.



- Plug the charging head into a standard AC power outlet
- 4. When charging is complete, unplug the charging head from the power outlet and remove the USB cable from the phone.

Non-Supported Batteries

Samsung handsets do not support the use of non-approved batteries.

Important! Using a non-supported battery may damage to your phone.

When using a non-supported battery you will hear a series of beeps and see a warning message:

"NON-SUPPORTED BATTERY. SEE USER MANUAL"

If you receive this warning, battery charging has been disabled.

Samsung charging accessories, such as the charging head and cigarette lighter adapter, will only charge Samsung-approved batteries.

Note: When using a non-supported battery, the phone can only be used for the duration of the life of the battery and cannot be recharged.

Turning Your Phone On and Off

Press and hold the End/Power Key to turn the phone on or off.



Set-up Wizard

Set preferences for four basic categories, to start using your phone quickly.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Set-up
 Wizard.
- 2. Follow the prompts to set preferences:
 - Font Style: Select your preferred font style. Use the Directional Key to select Dial Fonts and Menu Fonts.
 - Volume Key Control: When enabled, you can control the font size by pressing the Volume Key while viewing a menu. Choose On to enable this control.
 - Call Sounds: Choose how your phone alerts you to incoming calls.
 - **Display Themes**: Select a theme for your phone's displays.
 - Menu Layout: Choose a layout for the Main menu.
 - Clock Format: Select a format for the Home screen clock.

- **3.** While setting preferences:
 - Press the Center Select Key SET to make a selection and go to the next setting.
 - Press the Left Soft Key Preview or Play for an example of the highlighted selection.
 - Press the Right Soft Key Skip to move to the next setting without making a selection.

Easy Set-Up

Use Easy Set-up to quickly set common settings. Easy Set-up is available for Sound Settings and Display Settings.

Easy Set-up for Sounds

- From the Home screen, press the _____ Center Select Key to select MENU → ____ Settings & Tools → Sounds Settings → Easy Set-up.
- Follow the screen prompts to choose settings for Call Sounds, Keypad Volume, Text MSG Alert, Multimedia MSG Alert. and Voicemail MSG Alert.

Easy Set-up for Displays

- From the Home screen, press the ____ Center Select Key to select MENU → ___ Settings & Tools → Display Settings → Easy Set-up.
- Follow the screen prompts to choose settings for Personal Banner, Display Backlight, Keypad Backlight, Wallpaper, Display Themes, Menu Layout, Dial Fonts, Volume Key Control, and Clock Format.

Locking and Unlocking

Your phone offers two lock functions, locking the phone, or locking the keypad.

Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this User Manual start with the phone unlocked, at the Home screen.

Locking and unlocking the phone

Locking the phone prevents unauthorized access to information on the phone, but allows dialing with the Dialer. Locking and unlocking the phone requires the Lock Code.

When the phone is locked, you still have access to emergency calls by pressing the Left Soft Key ICE. For more information about emergency contacts, see "In Case of Emergency" on page 56.

Locking the phone

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone
 Settings → Security.
- At the "Enter lock code" prompt, enter the Lock Code. The default lock code is the last four digits of your phone number.
- 3. Select Lock Phone Now.

Tip: The default lock code is the last four digits of your phone number, or you can set a custom lock code at Phone Settings → Security → Edit Codes.

Unlocking the phone

 Press the Right Soft Key Unlock and enter the Lock Code.

Locking and unlocking the keypad

By default, the external keypad locks automatically when the backlight goes out, or you can lock it manually.

Note: Use Keyguard Settings to customize keypad locking. For more information, see "Keyguard Settings" on page 140.

Locking the keypad manually

Press and hold not until "Phone keypad is now locked" appears. "Keypad locked" displays on the lock screen until you unlock the keypad.

Unlocking the keypad

- Press any key to wake the display, then press the Right Soft Key Unlock, followed by the Center Select Key OK.
- Press and hold until the Home screen appears.

TTY Mode

Your phone is fully TTY-compatible, allowing you to connect a TTY device to the phone's headset jack. Before you can use your phone with a TTY device, you'll need to enable TTY Mode. For more information about TTY settings, see "TTY Mode" on page 164.

Roaming

When you travel outside your home network's coverage area, your phone can roam to acquire service on other compatible digital networks. when Roaming is active, the Roaming icon

appears in the Annunciator line of the display.

During roaming, some services may not be available. Depending on your coverage area and service plan, extra charges may apply when making or receiving call.

Note: Contact Verizon Wireless for more information about your coverage area and service plan.

Voicemail

All unanswered calls to your phone are sent to voicemail, even if your phone is turned off, so you'll want to set up your voicemail and personal greeting as soon as you activate your phone.

Setting up Voicemail

- 1. From the Home screen, press and hold ...
 - or -

From the Home screen, press \longrightarrow \rightarrow \longrightarrow \rightarrow \longrightarrow , then press the **Send Key**.

2. Follow the automated instructions to set up your new password and record a greeting.

Checking Voicemail

- 1. From the Home screen, press and hold .
 - or -

2. Follow the recorded prompts to listen to messages and manage your voicemail.

Tip: You can also access voicemail by dialing your phone number from any touch-tone phone.

Memory Card

Your phone supports optional, removable microSD $^{\intercal M}$ memory cards of up to 32GB capacity (not included). You can store music, pictures, and other files on a memory card.

Note: You can only store music files that you own on a memory card.

Installing a Memory Card

 Pull the memory card cover out and turn it to expose the card slot.



Slide the memory card into the slot, pushing gently until it locks into place.

Removing a Memory Card

- 1. Pull the memory card cover out and turn it to expose the memory card in the card slot.
- Press on the memory card to release the lock, then remove the card.

Formatting a Memory Card

Formatting erases all content from the memory card and prepares it for use with your phone.

Warning! No files can be recovered after formatting.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Memory
 → Card Memory → Format Card.
- 2. At the prompt, use the Directional Key to highlight Yes to confirm the formatting, then press the
 - Center Select Key OK.

Front View



- 1. Earpiece: Allows you to hear callers and prompts.
- 2. Display: Displays information to operate your phone.
- Directional Key: Press Up, Down, Left or Right to scroll through menus or lists. From the Home screen, each direction also acts as a shortcut to an application.

- Left Soft Key: Press to select a menu, item or command displayed at the bottom left of the display.
- **5. Send Key**: Press to place or receive a call. From the Home screen, press to access the All Calls log.
- Speakerphone Key: Press to enable/disable speakerphone.
- 7. Voicemail Key: Press and hold to access voicemail.
- **8. Microphone**: Allows callers to hear you clearly.
- **9.** Lock Key: Press and hold to lock or unlock the keys.
- **10. Vibrate Mode Key**: Press and hold to toggle Vibrate mode.
- **11. Clear Key**: Press to delete characters from the display. Press to return to the previous menu or screen.
- 12. End/Power Key: Press to end a call. Press and hold to power the phone On or Off. Press to send an incoming call directly to voicemail. When navigating, press to return to the Home screen.
- Right Soft Key: Press to select a menu, item or command displayed at the bottom right of the display.
- 14. Center Select Key: Press to select the command displayed at the center of the bottom line of the display.

Side Views



- 1. Strap attachment: Attach a strap (not included).
- Volume Key: From the Home screen, press to adjust
 Master Volume, or press and hold to activate Sounds
 Off/Normal mode. Press to adjust voice volume during
 calls, adjust audio volume, or mute an incoming call
 ringtone.
- USB Power/Accessory Port: Plug in a USB cable for charging or to sync music and files.
- 4. Camera Key: From the Home screen, press to launch Camera, or press and hold to launch Camcorder. While in Camera mode, press to take a picture. While in Camcorder mode, press to record video, or press and hold to toggle to Camera mode.
- Memory Card Slot: Insert an optional microSD memory card (not included) to add additional memory and storage capacity.
- Voice Commands Key: From the Home screen, press to activate Voice Commands.
- 3.5mm Headset Jack: Plug in an optional headset (not included) for conversations or music playback.

Open View



- Right Soft Key: Press to select a menu, item or command displayed at the bottom right of the display.
- Left Soft Key: Press to select a menu, item or command displayed at the left of the bottom line of the display.
- Favorites/Function Key: From the Home screen, press to access Favorites

- New Message Key: From the Home screen, or when highlighting a contact or Favorite, press to open a new Text message.
- Function Key: When entering text, press for access to the orange symbols on the QWERTY keys.
- Smiley Key: When combined with the Function Key, displays Smileys for insertion into text.
- Space/Social Networks Key: When entering text, press to insert a space. From the Home screen, press for quick access to social networking sites.
- Directional Keys: Press Up, Down, Left or Right to scroll through menus, or to move the insertion point.
- Center Select Key: Press to select an item, or the command at the center of the bottom line of the display.
- **10. Enter Key**: Press to move the insertion point to the next line in a message.
- Clear Key: When entering text, press to delete characters. Press to return to the previous menu or screen.
- **12. Search Key**: Find items on your phone.

Back View



- 1. Camera Lens: Used to take pictures.
- **2. Mirror**: Use to position the camera when taking self-portraits with the Camera.
- Speaker: Music, ringtones and sounds play through the speaker. Listen to callers when using Speakerphone.

Navigation Keys

Soft Keys

Soft key functions are defined by what appears above them, in the bottom line of the display. There are three soft keys: the **Left Soft Key**, the **Right Soft Key**, and the **Center Select Key**.

Your phone has two sets of soft keys, on the front of the phone for use when the phone is closed, or on the side and QWERTY keyboard for use when the phone is open.

Tip: When the phone is open, you can use any soft keys.



Left Soft Key

Some functions of the Left Soft Key or Left Soft Key are:

- From the Home screen, press the Left Soft Key Message to open the Messaging menu.
- When the Left Soft Key function is Edit, press to edit the item or field.

Right Soft Key

Some functions of the Right Soft Key or Right Soft Key are:

- From the Home screen, press the Right Soft Key Contacts to open your Contacts list.
- When the Right Soft Key function is Options, press to choose options for the current item.

Center Select Key

Some functions of the Center Select Key or Center Select Key are:

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select Key MENU to open the Menu.
- When the Center Select Key function is OK, press to select the highlighted option.


Directional Keys

Press the **Directional Key Up**, **Down**, **Left** or **Right** to browse menus and lists, or to launch applications from the Home screen.



Directional Key Shortcuts

From the Home screen, press a **Directional Key Up**, **Down**, **Left** or **Right** to launch its corresponding application.



Tip: Customize **Directional Key** shortcuts to launch your favorite applications. For more information, see "Set Shortcuts" on page 153.

Function Keys

End/Power Key

Use the **ending end/Power Key** to end calls, to turn the phone on or off, and to return to a previous menu.

For example:

- Press and hold the End/Power Key to turn your phone on or off.
- Press the End/Power Key to disconnect a call.
- Press the End/Power Key to return to the home screen from any menu, or to cancel the last input.
- Press the End/Power Key to send an incoming call to Voicemail.

Send Key

Use the **Send Key** to answer calls, dial calls, and to recall the last number(s) dialed, received, or missed.

For example:

- Press the Send Key to answer calls.
- Enter a number and press the Send Key to make a call.
- Press the Send Key from the Home screen to display a list of all calls to and from your phone.
- Press and hold the Send Key from the Home screen to call the most recently dialed, received, or missed number.
- While on a call, press the Send Key to answer a new incoming call. Press the Send Key again to switch back to the first call.

Camera Key

Use the **Camera Key** on the right side of the phone for Camera functions:

- From the Home screen, press the Camera Key to launch the Camera.
- While in Camera mode, press the **Camera Key** to take a photo.
- From the Home screen, press and hold the Camera Key to launch the Camcorder.
- While in Camcorder mode, press the Camera Key to record video, or press and hold to toggle to Camera mode.

Voice Commands Key

From the Home screen, press and hold the **Commands Key** to launch Voice Commands.

Clear Key

Press the Clear Key, or Clear Key on the QWERTY keyboard, to erase or clear characters when entering text, or to return to a previous menu or step.

Volume Key

Use the **Volume Key** to adjust volume:

- From the Home screen, press the Volume Key to adjust Master Volume.
- From the Home screen, press and hold the Volume Key down to activate Sounds Off/Normal mode.
- During calls, press the Volume Key to adjust voice volume.
- During music playback, press the Volume Key to adjust audio volume.
- Press the Volume Key to mute the ringtone of an incoming call.

Speakerphone Key

Press the **Speakerphone Key** to switch between the earpiece and the speakerphone, before or during a call.

Lock Key

From the Home screen, press and hold the Lock Key to lock or unlock the keypad.

Vibrate Mode Key

Use the **Vibrate Mode Key** to control Vibrate Only mode:

- From the Home screen, press and hold the Vibrate Mode Key to set your phone to Vibrate Only mode.
- Press and hold the Vibrate Mode Key to return to the previous sound profile.

Social Networks Key

From the Home screen, press the Social Networks Key on the QWERTY keyboard to quickly access your favorite social networks. For more information, see "Social Networks" on page 84.

Favorites Key

Use the **Favorites Key** on the QWERTY keyboard to quickly access up to 10 contacts or groups. For more information, see "Favorites" on page 54.

Search Key

New Message Key

Use the New Message Key on the QWERTY keyboard to quickly create a new message:

- From the Home screen, press the New Message Key to create a new Text Message.
- From Recent Calls, press the New Message Key to create a new Text Message addressed to the highlighted phone number.
- From Contacts, press the New Message Key to create a new Text Message addressed to the highlighted contact's default number.
- From My Pictures, press the New Message Key to create a new Picture Message with the highlighted picture as an attachment.
- From My Sounds, press the New Message Key to create a new Picture or Voice message with the highlighted sound as an attachment.

TDIIII Digital Signal Strength: The number of bars show signal strength. More bars indicate stronger signal.

TXIIII 1X CDMA Signal Strength: The number of bars show signal strength. More bars indicate stronger signal.

Airplane Mode: Disables all communication functions of your phone. You cannot send or receive calls or messages, but other features are available. For more information, see "Airplane Mode" on page 153.



Roaming Status: The phone is roaming outside the home service area. Consult Verizon Wireless for roaming plans and rates.



Network Extender: The phone is using signal from a Network Extender.



Voice Call: A voice call is in progress.



Data Call: A data connection is active, and data is being transmitted and received.



Data Dormant: A data connection is active, but no data is being transmitted or received.



No Service: No coverage is available. You cannot send or receive calls or messages.



Voice Listening: Voice Commands is active and listening for your command.



Voice Readout: The Voice Commands Prompts Mode is set to Readout, or Readout + Alerts. For more information, see "Voice Commands" on page 121. **E911 Only:** GPS location information is available to the network only while on Emergency calls. For more information, see "Location Detection" on page 156.

Location On: GPS location information is available to the network. For more information about this setting, see "Location Detection" on page 156.

SSL: Data is encrypted by Secure Socket Layer encryption, for increased privacy.

P Voice Privacy: The Voice Privacy setting is active, to increase privacy of voice calls. For more information, see "Voice Privacy" on page 165.

TTY: TTY Mode is active. For more information, see "TTY Mode" on page 164.

Keypad Lock: The external keypad is locked. Follow on-screen prompts to unlock the keypad. All Sounds Off: Master Volume is set to All Sounds Off. No sounds are played for calls, messages or alerts.



Alarm Only: Master Volume is set to Alarm Only. The only sounds to play will be for alarms.



Vibrate Only: Master Volume is set to Vibrate Only. The phone will vibrate for calls and alerts.



Unread Msg: You have a new, unread text message.



Voicemail: You have new voicemail.



Missed Calls: You have missed calls.



Calendar Event: You have an active calendar event.



Speakerphone: The phone is in speakerphone mode.



Alarm On: You have an alarm set.



Sound Alert Mode: The phone is in Sound Alert Mode.

Media Center: Launch the Media Center menu, to access the multimedia features of your phone. For more information, see "Media Center" on page 91.



Mobile Email: Send and receive Email from your phone. For more information, see "*Mobile Email*" on page 87.



VZ Navigator[®]: Launch VZ Navigator, for locationbased directions and searches. For more information, see "VZ Navigator" on page 132.



My Pictures: Browse and manage pictures saved on your phone. For more information, see "My Pictures" on page 111.



Settings & Tools: Configure your phone to your preferences, and access built-in productivity tools. For more information, see "Settings" on page 133.

Section 3: Call Functions

This section describes how to make, answer, or end a call. It also includes information about the Recent Calls log.

Making Calls

Your phone offers multiple ways to make calls:

- Enter the phone or speed dial number on the keypad, then press the **Send Key**.
- Enter the speed dial number, pressing the last digit until the number dials. For more information about setting and using speed dials, see "Making Calls using Speed Dials" on page 53.
- Call a contact from Contacts, or from Favorites. For more information, see "Making Calls using Contacts" on page 45.
- Return a call, or call a recent caller via Recent Calls. For more information, see "Recent Calls" on page 36.
- Voice dial using Voice Commands. For more information, see "Voice Commands" on page 121.

Answering Calls

Your phone offers multiple ways to answer incoming calls:

- With the phone open or closed, press the Send Key.
- Slide the phone open to answer the call automatically, with the Speakerphone enabled.
- With the slide open, press the Send Key.

Note: These are default behaviors. To choose other options for answering calls, see "Answer Options" on page 163.

Sending Calls to Voicemail

Use one of these methods to ignore an incoming call and send it directly to voicemail:

- Press the Right Soft Key Ignore to send the call to voicemail.
- To ignore the call and send a text message to the caller, press the
 Center Select Key TXT. Choose a Quick Text phrase for your response, then press the
 Center Select Key SEND.

Tip: To silence the ringer on an incoming call, press the Left Soft Key Quiet, or press the Volume Key Up or Down.

Answering Call-Waiting Calls

When you receive a call while on a call:

- Press the Send Key to place the first call on hold and answer the new call.
- Press the Send Key again to return to the first call.

Call In-Progress Options

You can access menus and features while in a call:

- Press the Right Soft Key Options for these options.
 - Messaging: Open the Messaging menu.
 - Contact List: Open Contacts to view your contacts.
 - Recent Calls: Display incoming, missed and outgoing calls.
 - Bluetooth Menu: Display the Bluetooth menu.
 - Main Menu: Display the Main menu.
 - Notepad: Open the Notepad.
 - Whisper Mode: Increase the microphone to maximum volume level, to improve the other caller's ability to hear your voice clearly, when you are speaking softly, or in a noisy environment.
 - Voice Privacy: Turn On or Off advanced voice encryption.
- To control whether the other caller can hear you, press the
 Left Soft Kev Mute/Unmute.

Recent Calls

When you place, miss, or receive a call, a record of the call is saved in Recent Calls.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Recent Calls.
 - or -

From the Home screen, press the Send Key.

- Highlight a call type, then press the Center Select Key OK to view call records:
 - **Missed**: Calls you did not answer.
 - Received: Answered calls.
 - Dialed: Outgoing calls.
 - All: All missed, received, and dialed calls.
 - View Timers: Statistics about calls.
- Calls display by date, time and contact or phone number. If the phone number is saved as a contact, the call record includes icons to indicate the type of number.

- **4.** Highlight a call, then choose from these options:
 - Press the Left Soft Key Message to send a reply message.
 - Press the Center Select Key OPEN to view details about the call.
 - Press the Right Soft Key Options for these options:
 - Save to Contacts: Save the caller's phone number as a new contact, or to update an existing contact.
 - Erase: Delete the highlighted call record.
 - Lock/Unlock: Protect the record to prevent erasure, or remove lock.
 - Erase All: Delete all call records of this type.
 - **View Timers**: Display statistic about calls of this type

Making Calls Using Recent Calls

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Recent Calls.
 - or -
 - From the Home screen, press the Send Key.
- Find a call from All Calls, Missed Calls, Received Calls, or Dialed Calls.
- 3. Highlight a call record, then press the Send Key.

Creating or Updating Contacts Using Recent Calls

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Recent Calls.
 - or -
 - From the Home screen, press the **Send Key**.
- Find a call from All Calls, Missed Calls, Received Calls, or Dialed Calls.
- Highlight a call record, then press the Right Soft Key Options → Save to Contacts.
- Use the Directional Key to highlight Add New Contact or Update Existing, then press the Center Select Key OK.
- **5.** Continue entering contact information. For more information, see "Editing Contacts" on page 46.

Deleting Recent Calls Records

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Recent Calls.
 - or -

From the Home screen, press the Send Key.

- Find a call from All Calls, Missed Calls, Received Calls, or Dialed Calls.
- Highlight a call record, then press the Right Soft Key Options → Erase.
- Follow the prompts to confirm the removal of the call record.

Deleting All Recent Calls Records

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Recent Calls.
 - or -

From the Home screen, press the Send Key.

- 2. Display All Calls, Missed Calls, Received Calls, or Dialed Calls
- Press the Right Soft Key Options → Erase All.
- 4. At the Erase All? prompt, highlight Yes, then press the Center Select Key OK.

Fake Call

Use Fake Call to have your phone ring with a fake call when you press the Voice Commands Key 4 times in a row with the phone open or closed.

Setting up Fake Calls

Enable, and choose options, for Fake Calls.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Call
 Settings → Fake Call.
- 2. Follow these steps to set up Fake Calls:
 - Enable Fake Calls by choosing On in the Fake Call On/Off setting.
 - Set the Fake Call Timer by choosing the length of time to elapse between the time you press the Voice Commands Key four times and the ringing of the Fake Call.
 - Choose a Fake Call Voice, if desired, to have sound play through the earpiece when you answer a fake call, or select No Voice to have no audio.
 - Enter Fake Contact Info, to have fake Caller ID display when a
 Fake Call is ringing, or choose Restricted to have the Fake Call
 appear to be from a Restricted number.

Initiating a Fake Call

From idle mode with the phone closed or open, press the Voice Commands Key 4 times.

After the Fake Call Timer period elapses, your phone rings to notify you of the fake call. If you entered Fake contact Info, it appears on the screen, or "Restricted" appears. When you answer the Fake Call, you'll hear the Fake Call Voice audio, if you selected it in Fake Call settings.

Sound Alert Mode

When Sound Alert Mode is enabled, your phone uses sounds to alert you to notifications, regardless of other phone or call settings.

Turning on Sound Alert Mode temporarily replaces your previous sound settings, so you can switch between Sound Alert Mode and your favorite default settings easily. For example, when you receive a call or message, your phone reads out the name (if stored in Contacts) or number of the caller or sender, and Call Alert sounds will play, even if you have set Master Volume to Sounds Off or Vibrate Only. You can also have Sound Alert Mode read the contents of a message along with the Caller ID information.

Enabling Sound Alert Mode

Using Settings to Enable Sound Alert Mode

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Sounds
 Settings → Sound Alert Mode.
- 2. Use the Directional Key to highlight a setting, then press the Center Select Key SET:
 - Caller ID Only: Volume is set to high, and call alerts play regardless of sound settings. When you receive a call or message, the caller or sender's information is read out.
 - ID & Message: Volume is set to high, call alerts play regardless of sound settings. When you receive a call or message, the caller or sender's information is read out, along with the message contents.
 - Off: All sounds revert to their previous settings.

Using the Sound Alert Mode Voice Commands

When you enable Sound Alert Mode using Voice Commands, Sound Alert Mode is automatically started in Caller ID Only mode.

- From the Home screen, press and hold the
 Voice Commands Key.
- 2. At the audio prompt "Please say a command", say "Sound Alert Mode On" to activate Sound Alert Mode, or "Sound Alert Mode Off" to return to your previous sound settings.

Section 4: Understanding Your Contacts

This section allows you to manage your daily contacts by saving information in Contacts.

Contacts provides access to powerful features such as Groups, creating and sending vCards, and viewing the phone number assigned to your phone by Verizon Wireless.

Using the QWERTY Keyboard

For fast and easy entry of contact information, use the QWERTY keyboard:

- Open the phone to access the QWERTY keyboard in landscape mode. For more information, see "Accessing the QWERTY Keyboard" on page 61.
- Enter contact information using the QWERTY keyboard. For more information, see "Using the QWERTY Keyboard" on page 61.

Note: Instructions for creating, editing and managing Contacts use the QWERTY keyboard, unless otherwise stated in the procedure.

Accessing Contacts

To access Contacts List for quick access to most functions:

- From the Home screen, using the external keypad, press the Right Soft Key Contacts
 - or -

From the Home screen, using the QWERTY keyboard, press the Right Soft Key Contacts.

To access Contacts for all contacts-related functions:

■ From the Home screen, press the Center Select

Key to select MENU → Contacts.

Adding Contacts

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and soft keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

- From the Home screen, press the Right Soft Key Contacts.
- 2. Press the Right Soft Key Options → New Contact.
- Use the QWERTY keyboard to enter the contact's name in the Name: field.
- Use the Directional Keys to highlight Mobile 1, Mobile 2, Home, Business or Fax and enter a telephone number.
- 5. Continue using the Directional Keys to move to fields to add additional information, if desired.
- 6. When you're finished entering information, press the Center Select Key SAVE to save the contact.

Contacts Fields

These icons represent all available fields for Contacts.



Mobile 1: Enter the contact's Primary mobile number.



Home: Enter the contact's Home number.



Business: Enter the contact's Work number.



Mobile 2: Enter the Secondary mobile number.



Fax: Enter the contact's Fax telephone number.

Business Email: Enter a Work Email address.



Picture: Choose a Picture ID for the contact.



Ringtone: Choose a Ringtone for the contact.



Message Tone: Choose a Ringtone for alerts to new messages from the contact.



Group: Enter the contact's Group assignment. Press the
Left Soft Key Set to choose a Group from the
Groups list.

Home Address Street: Enter the Home street address.

Home Address City: Enter the Home city.

Home Address State: Enter the Home state.

Home Address Zip Code: Enter the Home Zip Code.

Home Address Country: Enter the Home country.

Work Address Street: Enter the Work street address.

Work Address City: Enter the Work city.

Work Address State: Enter the Work state.

Work Address Zip Code: Enter the Work Zip Code.

Work Address Country: Enter the Work country.

Company: Enter the contact's place of employment.

Title: Enter the contact's job title.

Birthday: Enter the contact's date of birth.

Notes: Enter text Notes about the contact.

Adding Contacts from the Keypad

Enter a telephone number with the external keypad, then save it.

Note: This procedure uses the external phone keypad and command keys.

- From the Home screen, use the external keypad to enter the number.
- 2. Press the Left Soft Key Save → Add New Contact.
- 3. Use the Directional Key to highlight Mobile 1, Mobile 2, Home, Business or Fax, then press the Center Select Key OK.
- 4. Enter a name for the contact in the Name: field.
- 5. Continue adding information to fields, or press the
 - Center Select Key SAVE to save the contact.

Adding Contacts from Recent Calls

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and command keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

Save a telephone number from a recent call record as a contact.

- 1. From the Home screen, press the Send Key.
- 2. Use the Directional Keys to highlight a call record.
- Press the Right Soft Key Options → Save to Contacts → Add New Contact.
- Use the Directional Keys to highlight Mobile 1, Mobile 2, Home, Business or Fax, then press the Center Select Key OK.
- 5. Enter a name for the contact in the Name: field.
- Continue adding information to fields, or press theCenter Select Key SAVE to save the contact.

Making Calls using Contacts

You can make calls directly from the Contact List.

Note: This procedure uses the external phone keypad and command keys.

- From the Home screen, press the Right Soft Key Contacts.
- Find a contact, by pressing the Directional Key to highlight a contact, or see "Finding Contacts" on page 50.
- 3. Press the Send Key to call the contact.

Erasing Contacts

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and command keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

- From the Home screen, press the Right Soft Key Contacts.
- 2. Press the Right Soft Key Options → Manage Contacts → Erase.
- 3. Use the Directional Keys to highlight a contact, then press the Center Select Key MARK to mark it for erasure, or press the Right Soft Key Options

 → Mark All to mark all contacts.
- Press the Left Soft Key Done. At the prompt, highlight Yes to confirm the erasure, then press the
 Center Select Key OK to erase the contact(s).

Editing Contacts

Make changes to an existing contact.

- From the Home screen, press the Right Soft Key Contacts.
- 2. Use the Directional Keys to highlight an existing contact, then press the Left Soft Key Edit.
- Use the Directional Keys to move to fields to modify or add information for the contact. For a list of available fields, see "Contacts Fields" on page 43.
- When you're finished, press the Center Select Key SAVE to save the contact.

Editing Contacts from the External Keypad

Enter a telephone number with the external keypad, then save it to an existing contact.

Note: This procedure uses the external phone keypad and command keys.

- From the Home screen, use the external keypad to enter the telephone number.
- 2. Press the Left Soft Key Save → Update Existing.
- Use the Directional Key to highlight a contact, then press the Center Select Key OK.
- Use the Directional Key to highlight Mobile 1, Mobile 2, Home, Business or Fax, then press the
 Center Select Key OK.
- Continue editing fields, or press the Center Select Key SAVE to save the contact.

Editing Contacts from Recent Calls

Save a telephone number from a call record to a contact.

- From the Home screen, press the ☐ Center Select Key to select MENU → Recent Calls.
- 2. Use the Directional Keys to highlight a call record. For more information about using Recent Calls logs, see "Recent Calls" on page 36.
- Press the Right Soft Key Options → Save to Contacts → Update Existing.
- 4. Use the **Directional Keys** to highlight a contact, then press the **Center Select Key OK**.
- Use the Directional Keys to highlight Mobile 1, Mobile 2, Home, Business or Fax, then press the Center Select Key OK.
- Continue editing fields, or press the Center Select Key SAVE to save the contact.

Managing Contacts

Use Manage Contacts to perform actions, such as erasing, locking, or unlocking, on multiple contacts at one time.

- From the Home screen, press the Right Soft Key Contacts.
- Press the Right Soft Key Options → Manage Contacts.
- 3. Choose an option:
 - Erase: Mark multiple contact(s) for deletion.
 - Lock: Mark multiple contact(s) to lock. Locked contacts cannot be deleted.
 - Unlock: Mark multiple contact(s) to unlock.
 - Copy to Card: (When an optional memory card is installed)
 Mark contact(s) to copy to an optional installed memory card.

- 4. Use the Directional Keys to highlight contacts, then press the Center Select Key to MARK each contact, or press the Right Soft Key → Mark All to mark all contacts.
- **5.** Press the Left Soft Key Done to perform the selected option on all marked contacts.

Adding Pauses or Waits

Calls to automated systems can require you to press keys to navigate menus, or to enter a password or account number. You can store these phone numbers, with special pause or wait characters, in a contact record to make dialing easier.

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and command keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

- From the Home screen, press the Right Soft Key Contacts.
- Create a new contact entry, or edit an existing contact. For more information, see "Adding Contacts" on page 43, or "Editing Contacts" on page 46.
- Enter the phone number up to the pause or wait, then press the Right Soft Key Options:
 - Add 2-Sec Pause: Stops the dialing sequence for two seconds, then automatically dials the remaining digits. A "p" appears in the field to indicate the pause.
 - Add Wait: Stops the dialing sequence, waiting for further input from you. A "w" appears in the field to indicate the wait.

4. When you're finished, press the Center Select Key SAVE.

Note: Multiple pauses extend the length of a pause, and each pause counts as a digit toward the 48-digit maximum. For example, 2 consecutive Add Pauses create a total pause of four seconds, and count as 2 digits.

Finding Contacts

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and command keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

- From the Home screen, press the Right Soft Key Contacts. The Contacts List displays, with the cursor in the Go To field.
- In the Go To field, enter the first few characters of the Contact name to see matching entries.



3. Use the Directional Keys to

highlight a contact, then proceed with one of these options:

- Press the Send Key to call the contact.
- Press the Center Select Key VIEW to open the contact.
- Press the Left Soft Key Edit to edit the contact.
- Press the **Right Soft Key Options** for options.

Groups

You can assign Contact entries to categories, called Groups, to make searching your contacts faster, or to quickly send messages to group members. By default, new Contacts have the No Group assignment.

Viewing Groups

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select Key to select MENU → Contacts → Groups.
- **2.** Available groups appear in the display, including the default groups.
- 3. Use the Directional Keys to highlight a group, then press the Center Select Key VIEW to display a list of group members.

Changing a Contact's Group Assignment

Edit a contact's Group field to change the group assignment.

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and command keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

- From the Home screen, Right Soft Key Contacts to display the Contact List.
- 2. Use the Directional Keys to highlight a contact, then press the Left Soft Key Edit.
- Use the Directional Keys to highlight the Group field, then press the Left Soft Key Set.
- Use the Directional Keys to highlight groups, then press the Center Select Key MARK to mark or un-mark groups for assignment.
- When you finish marking groups, press theLeft Soft Key Done to save the changes.

Creating a New Group

In addition to the default groups, you can create additional groups.

- 2. Press the Left Soft Key New.
- At the NEW GROUP screen, enter a name for the new group in the "Enter Name:" field. For more information, see "Entering Text" on page 61.
- When finished, press the Center Select Key SAVE.

Sending a Message to Group Members

Use Send Message in the Group feature to send a message to as many as 20 members of a group at once.

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and command keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select Key to select MENU → Contacts → Groups.
- 2. Use the Directional Keys to highlight a group.
- Press the Right Soft Key Options → New Message.
- 4. Mark contact(s) for sending. Use the Directional Keys to highlight contacts, then press the Center Select Key Mark to mark them for sending. When finished, press the Left Soft Key Done.
- The new message opens, with the cursor positioned in the Text field. Continue creating the message, as desired. For more information, see "Messaging" on page 70.

Speed Dials

Speed Dials are 1-, 2- or 3-digit shortcuts you assign to contacts, to allow you to quickly call the contact.

Note: Some Speed Dials are reserved by default, and cannot be assigned: Speed Dial 1 is reserved for Voicemail.

Speed Dial 211 is reserved for information about health and human services, 311 for non-emergency municipal services; 411 for directory assistance; 611 for customer service access; and 911 for emergencies.

Assigning a Speed Dial

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and command keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select Key to select MENU → Contacts → Speed Dials.
- Use the Directional Keys to highlight a speed dial, or enter the speed dial digits into the Go To field, then press the Center Select Key SET.
- At the SET SPEED DIAL screen, use the Directional Keys
 to highlight a contact, or enter the first few characters
 into the Go To field and press the Center Select Key
 OK.
- At the Set speed dial to Contact? prompt, highlight Yes, then press the Contact Select Key OK.

Removing a Speed Dial

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and command keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select Key to select MENU → Contacts → Speed Dials.
- 2. Use the Directional Keys to highlight a speed dial, or enter the speed dial digits into the Go To field and press the Center Select Key OK.
- Press the Right Soft Key Remove.
- 4. At the Remove speed dial? prompt, highlight Yes, then press the Center Select Key OK.

Making Calls using Speed Dials

Note: This procedure uses the external phone keypad and command keys.

 From the Home screen, press the digits of the speed dial on the external keypad, holding the last digit until the call dials.

Favorites

Favorites are up to 10 contacts or groups that you assign. You can use Favorites to view messages sent to and from favorite contacts, and quickly call or send a message to favorites.

To access Favorites:

- From the Home screen, press the Favorites Key on the QWERTY keyboard.
 - or -

From the Home screen, press the Right Soft Key to select Favorites from the Contacts List.

Assigning Favorites

- From the Home screen, press the Favorites Key on the QWERTY keyboard
- 2. Press the Center Select Key ADD.
 - Directional Keys to highlight an option, then press the
 Center Select Key OK:
 - From Contacts: To assign individual contacts as Favorites.
 - From Groups: To assign Groups as Favorites.
- Use the Directional Keys to highlight up to 10 contacts or groups, then press the Center Select Key MARK to mark them as Favorites.
- Press the Left Soft Key Done to assign the Favorites.

Removing Favorites

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and command keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

- From the Home screen, press the Favorites Key on the QWERTY keyboard
- 2. Follow these steps to remove favorites:
 - To remove a single Favorite, use the Directional Keys to highlight the Favorite, then press the Right Soft Key Options and select Remove. At the prompt, select Yes to confirm the removal.
 - To remove all Favorites, press the Right Soft Key
 Options and select Remove All. At the prompt, select Yes to
 confirm the removals.

Using Favorites

- From the Home screen, press the Favorites Key on the QWERTY keyboard.
- 2. Use the Directional Keys to highlight a Favorite, then use one of these options:
 - To send a Text Message, press the New Message Key.
 - To view messages to and from the Favorite press the
 Left Soft Key Messages.
 - To call a Favorite, press the Send Key.
 - To view a Favorite's contact information, press the
 Center
 Select Key, or just press the number of the Favorite.

In Case of Emergency

Use In Case of Emergency to assign up to 3 emergency contacts, plus enter personal information that may be helpful to others using your phone in an emergency.

Tip: Emergency contacts display in red in the Contacts List.

Assigning Emergency Contacts

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and command keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select Key to select MENU → Contacts → In Case of Emergency.
- Use the Directional Keys to highlight Contact 1, Contact 2, or Contact 3, then press the Center Select Key ADD.
- In the ADD CONTACT screen, use the Directional Keys to highlight an option and press the Center Select Key OK:

- From Contacts: Choose an existing contact from Contacts List, then press the Contacts Center Select Key OK.
- New Contact: Enter a new contact, then press the
 Center Select Key SAVE to save the new contact and set it as an Emergency Contact.

Re-assigning or Unassigning Emergency Contacts

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select Key to select MENU → Contacts → In Case of Emergency.
- 2. Use the Directional Keys to highlight a contact.
 - Press the Right Soft Key Options, then choose an option:
 - Re-assign: Choose another contact from Contacts List, or create a new contact for this assignment.
 - Unassign: Remove the contact from this emergency contact.

Entering Personal Information

Use Personal Information to enter up to 3 informational notes, such as known illnesses or allergies, that might be helpful to others using your phone in an emergency.

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and command keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

- From the Home screen, press the ☐ Center Select Key
 to select MENU → ☐ Contacts → In Case of
 Emergency.
- Use the Directional Keys to highlight Personal Info, then press the Center Select Key VIEW.
- Use the Directional Keys to highlight Note 1, Note 2, or Note 3, then press the Center Select Key ADD.
- 4. Enter your personal information into the note, then press the Center Select Key SAVE to save the note.

My Name Card

My Name Card is your personal contact entry in Contacts, which you can send to recipients as a virtual business card (vCard) attached to a message, or via Bluetooth.

Note: Navigation for this procedure may differ when an optional memory card is installed.

Creating My Name Card

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and command keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

Backup Assistant Plus

Backup AssistantSM Plus is a free service that protects your contacts by saving to a secure web site. If your phone is lost, stolen or damaged, or if you change phones, Backup Assistant can restore your saved contacts to a new phone, wirelessly. Schedule backups to save your information manually or automatically. Log in to your web account for full access to your contacts for viewing, printing, adding, deleting, and editing.

Section 5: Entering Text

Your phone provides convenient ways to enter words, letters, punctuation, and numbers when you need to enter text.

This section describes text input modes and entering characters or symbols, using the built-in QWERTY keyboard or the keypad.

Using the QWERTY Keyboard

The built-in QWERTY keyboard provides quick and easy text input, similar to a computer keyboard.

Accessing the QWERTY Keyboard

To access the keyboard, rotate the phone and slide it open, as shown.



Choosing a Text Entry Mode

While entering text, you can choose a text entry mode.

Tip: You can set a default Text Entry Mode. For more information, see "Messaging Settings" on page 88.

- While entering text, press the Left Soft Key Entry Mode.
- Select a text entry mode. Available modes depend on the type of text field.

Entering Text in Abc/ABC/abc Mode

Enter text by pressing the keys on the QWERTY keyboard. Use these keys to enter special characters:



Clear: Press to delete the previous character. Press and hold to delete the previous word.



Enter: Press to move the insertion point to the next line, or to the next field.



Shift: Press to switch between Abc (initial case), ABC (upper case), and abc (lower case) modes. Press twice quickly to lock ABC mode, then press again to unlock.



Space: Press to insert a space.

From the Home screen, you can press this key to access Social Networks.

Using XT9

XT9 is a predictive text entry mode that recognizes common English words matching the sequence of your key presses and inserts the most common word into your text.

Tip: XT9 is available for English, Spanish, and Vietnamese.

- While entering text, press the Left Soft Key Entry Mode → XT9 Word.
- Press the key for each letter. As you press keys, XT9 displays matching words. If the correct word displays after entering a few characters, press any Directional Key to accept it and start entering the next word.
 - Enter all the letters of a word before editing or deleting characters. Press the CLB Clear Key to backspace and clear one character, or press and hold to clear an entire word.
 - Press the shift Key to toggle between XT9 Word (initial case), XT9 word (lower case) and XT9 WORD (upper case).

Entering Numbers

Enter numbers by pressing the number keys on the top row of the QWERTY keyboard.



Entering Symbols

Enter symbols by pressing the Function key to access the orange symbols at the top of the keys.

- While entering text, press the function Key, then press the key showing the desired orange symbol.
 - or -

While entering text, press the Left Soft Key Entry Mode → Symbols, then press the key showing the desired orange symbol.

Using Quick Text

Quick Text are pre-loaded phrases that you can insert into your messages, or create your own phrases.

- While entering text, press the Left Soft Key Entry Mode → Quick Text.
- 2. Use the Directional Keys to highlight a phrase, then press the Center Select Key OK to insert it.

Managing Quick Text

Edit or delete Quick Text phrases, create your own phrases, and set the order phrases appear in the Quick Text list.

- While entering text, press the Left Soft Key Entry Mode → Quick Text.
- 2. To erase a phrase, highlight the phrase, then press the Left Soft Key Erase.
- For other options, press the Right Soft Key Options:
 - To enter a new phrases, select New, then enter the phrases and press the CC Center Select Key SAVE.
 - To edit a phrase, highlight a phrase and select Edit, then make changes and press the Center Select Key SAVE.
 - To change the order phrases appear in the Quick Text list, highlight a phrase and select **Move**, then use the **Directional** Keys to move the phrase to a new position in the list. Press the
 - **Center Select Key SAVE** to set the new list order.

Entering Smileys

Enter Smileys by pressing the Function key, then the Smileys key, or by switching to Smileys text entry mode.

Using the Smileys key

- While entering text, press the Function Key →
 Smileys Key to display Smileys.
- Use the Directional Keys to highlight a smiley, then press the Center Select Key OK.

Press the number beside a smiley.

Using Smileys text entry mode

- While entering text, press the Left Soft Key Entry Mode → Smileys.
- 2. Use the Directional Keys to highlight a smiley, then press the Center Select Key OK.

- or -

Press the number beside a smiley.

Entering Text Using the External Keypad

The external keypad provides quick and easy text input, using standard text entry modes for phone keypads.

Choosing a Text Entry Mode

While entering text, you can choose a text entry mode.

- While entering text, press the Left Soft Key Entry Mode.
- 2. Select a text entry mode. Available modes depend on the type of field.

Entering Text using XT9

XT9 is a predictive text entry mode that recognizes common words matching the sequence of your key presses and inserts the most common word into your text. XT9 Word requires only one key press per letter of the word, and is much faster than traditional text entry.

Tip: XT9 is available for English, Spanish, and Vietnamese.

- To switch to T9 Word mode, press the Left Soft Key Entry Mode → XT9 Word.
- Press the key for each letter only once. As you press keys, XT9 displays matching words. If the correct word displays, press the **Directional Key** to accept it and start entering the next word.

- 3. While entering text, use these special keys:
 - Enter all the letters of a word before editing or deleting characters. Press the Clear Key to backspace and clear one character, or press and hold to clear an entire word.
 - Press to switch between XT9 Word (initial case), XT9 word (lower case) and XT9 WORD (upper case).
 - Press to enter a space.
 - Press noce to enter a period.

Entering Text using Abc/ABC/abc Mode

Abc mode is standard text entry mode for mobile telephones, and is the default text entry mode when using the external keypad.

- To switch to Abc mode, press the Left Soft Key Entry Mode → Abc.
- Press the appropriate key once for the first letter on the key, twice for the second letter, three times for the third letter, and four times for the fourth letter. When the correct letter displays, pause briefly to advance to the next letter, or press another key.
- 3. While entering text, use these special keys:
 - Press the Clear Key to backspace to clear one character.
 Press and hold to clear an entire word.
 - Press to switch between Abc (initial case), abc (lower case) and ABC (upper case).
 - Press to enter a space.
 - Press noce to enter a period, twice for "@", three times for a question mark "?", and four times for an exclamation mark "!".

Entering Symbols

Use Symbols mode to enter common symbols into a text field.

- To switch to 123 mode, press the Left Soft Key Entry Mode → Symbols.
- The first of 3 SYMBOLS pages displays. Press the Left Soft Key Prev to move to the previous page. Press the Right Soft Key Next to move to the next page.
- 3. Use the Directional Key to scroll through the symbols on a SYMBOLS page to highlight a symbol, then press the Center Select Key OK to insert it.

Press the key for the number corresponding to a symbol.

Entering Smileys

Use Smileys mode to enter smiley symbols into a text field.

- To switch to 123 mode, press the Left Soft Key Entry Mode → Smileys.
- 2. The Smileys page displays.
- Use the Directional Key to scroll through a Smileys page to highlight a Smiley, then press the Center Select Key OK to insert it into your text.
 - or -

Press the key for the number corresponding to a Smiley.

Entering Numbers

Use 123 mode to enter numbers into a text field.

- To switch to 123 mode, press the Left Soft Key Entry Mode → 123.
- Press the appropriate key for each number. Press theClear Key to backspace to clear one number.Press and hold to clear multiple numbers in a string.

Using Quick Text

Quick Text are pre-loaded phrases that you can insert into your messages, or create your own phrases.

- While entering text, press the Left Soft Key Entry Mode → Quick Text.
- 2. Use the Directional Key to highlight a phrase, then press the Center Select Key OK to insert it.

Managing Quick Text

Edit or delete Quick Text phrases, create your own phrases, and set the order phrases appear in the Quick Text list.

- While entering text, press the Left Soft Key Entry Mode → Quick Text.
- To erase a phrase, highlight the phrase, then press the Left Soft Key Erase.
- 3. For other options, press the **Right Soft Key Options**:
 - To enter a new phrases, select New, then enter the phrases and press the Center Select Key SAVE.
 - To edit a phrase, highlight a phrase and select Edit, then make changes and press the Center Select Key SAVE.

Section 6: Messaging

This section explains how to send and receive messages, and other features and functionality associated with messaging.

Types of Messages

Your phone supports these types of messages:

- Text Messages: Send and receive simple messages containing text to other mobile phones or Email addresses (also known as SMS).
- Multimedia Messages: Send and receive text messages with attached pictures, video, and/or sound to other mobile phones or email addresses (also known as MMS).
- Voicemail: Retrieve voice messages from callers.
- Mobile Email: Send and receive email from your email accounts.

Using the QWERTY Keyboard

For fast and easy messaging, use the QWERTY keyboard:

- Open the phone to access the QWERTY keyboard in landscape mode. For more information, see "Accessing the QWERTY Keyboard" on page 61.
- Use the QWERTY keyboard to create and send messages. For more information, see "Using the QWERTY Keyboard" on page 61.

Note: Instructions for creating and sending messages are described using the QWERTY keyboard, unless otherwise stated in the procedure.

Special Messaging Features

Your phone includes special features to make messaging easy.

New Message Key

Use the New Message Key on the QWERTY keyboard to quickly open a new message, right from the Home screen, or from other applications like Contacts, My Pictures or My Sounds. For more information, see "New Message Key" on page 27.

Quick Reply

While viewing a message, you can just begin entering text to create a quick TXT message.

QWERTY Action

You can set the QWERTY Action setting to automatically open a new Text Message when you open the phone and begin entering characters. For more information, see "QWERTY Action" on page 156.

Group Messaging

When you address a message to multiple recipients, you can use the Group Messaging option to choose how replies to your message are handled.

For more information about configuring Group Messaging, see "Messaging Settings" on page 88.

- Individual Messages: Replies are treated as "Blind Copy", where recipients can't see others on the To: list, and replies come only to you.
- Group Conversation: Replies are treated as "Reply All", where all the recipients can see the entire To: list, and recipient's replies go to all recipients with compatible devices in the original To: list.

Creating and Sending Text Messages

Your phone supports Text Messages, simple messages containing text, which can be sent to other mobile phones, or to an Email address (also known as SMS).

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and command keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

- From the Home screen, press the Left Soft Key Message → New Message.
 - or -

From the Home screen, press the New Message Key.

- At the NEW TEXT MSG screen, enter up to 20 recipients in the To: fields:
 - Press the Right Soft Key Add to select recipients
 From Contacts, Recent Calls, Favorites, or Groups.

- Use the QWERTY keyboard to enter a recipient's phone number, contact name, or Email address. As you enter text, matching contacts display in a list. Use the **Directional Keys** to highlight a contact, then press the **Center Select Key OK**.
 While entering recipients into the **To:** field, press the **Left Soft Key** to switch between **Abc**, **ABC** and **Symbols** text entry modes, or choose **Domain Extensions**.
- 3. Use the Directional Keys to move to the Text: field to compose your message. For more information about entering text, see "Entering Text" on page 61.
- 4. While entering text, press the Right Soft Key Options for options (available options depend on the recipient list and text already entered):
 - Attach: Add media or content to the message to convert it to Multimedia (MMS). For more information about creating and sending Multimedia messages, see "Creating and Sending Multimedia Messages" on page 73.
 - Group Conversation/Individual Message: If you have multiple recipients in the To: field, choose whether recipients can reply with Individual Messages (only to you), or Group Conversation (to entire recipient list).
 - Save As Draft: Save a copy of the message in Drafts.

- Insert Quick Text: Choose pre-entered phrases to add to your message. Press the Left Soft Key Erase to delete a highlighted Quick Text, or press the Right Soft Key Options to create New Quick Text, or to Edit or Move (change list order) the highlighted Quick Text.
- Copy: Copy text. Use the Directional Keys to highlight text for copying, then press the Center Select Key DONE.
- Paste: Insert previously-copied text into the message.
- Add Subject: Add a subject field, which also converts the message to Multimedia (MMS). For more information about creating and sending Multimedia messages, see "Creating and Sending Multimedia Messages" on page 73.
- Priority Level: Set the urgency, to High or Normal.
- Callback #: Include a callback number with the message. By default, this is your mobile telephone number, or you can enter a different number. In Message Settings, you can set a default callback number to be included in all messages.
- Cancel Message: Cancel the message, with the option to save it in Drafts.
- 5. To send the message, press the Center Select Key SEND, or press the Send Key.

Creating and Sending Multimedia Messages

Note: Available in the Verizon Wireless Enhanced Services
Area.

Your phone supports Multimedia Messages (MMS), text messages with attached pictures or video, which can be sent to other mobile devices, Email addresses, or to your Online Album or Blogs.

All messages start as Text Messages, and you convert them to Multimedia by adding a subject, or by attaching media or content. After adding content or media to convert the message to multimedia, you can go back to the To: fields to address the message **To Online Album** or **To Blogs**.

- From the Home screen, press the Left Soft Key Message → New Message.
 - or -

From the Home screen, press the New Message Key.

- At the NEW TEXT MSG screen, enter up to 20 recipients in the To: fields:
 - Press the Right Soft Key Add to select recipients
 From Contacts, Recent Calls, Favorites, or Groups. If you added content or media to convert the message to multimedia (see step 4), you can also choose To Online Album, or To Blogs.
 - Use the QWERTY keyboard to enter a recipient's phone number, contact name, or Email address. As you enter text, matching contacts display in a list. Use the **Directional Keys** to highlight a contact, then press the **Center Select Key OK**.
 While entering recipients into the **To:** field, press the **Left Soft Key** to switch between **Abc**, **ABC** and **Symbols** text entry modes, or choose **Domain Extensions**.

- Use the Directional Keys to move to the Text: field to compose your message. For more information about entering text, see "Entering Text" on page 61.
- 4. To convert the message to Multimedia, press the Right Soft Key Options, then select Attach:
 - Picture: Select a picture from My Pictures.
 - Take Picture: Launch Camera to take a new picture.
 - Video: Select a video from My Videos.
 - Record Video: Capture a new video to attach.
 - Location: Share your current location, an address, a Favorite saved location, or place of interest.
 - **Sound**: Select sound, from pre-loaded sounds, sounds you recorded previously, or record a new sound to attach.
 - Record Sound: Record a new sound to attach.
 - Name Card: Attach your Name Card, or Contact Record(s).
 - Calendar Event: Attach an event from Calendar.

Tip: After adding content or media to convert the message to multimedia, you can move back to the To: fields to address the message To Online Album or To Blogs.

- **5.** Choose other options for the message:
 - **Preview**: View the message before sending.
 - Save As Draft: Save a copy of the message in Drafts.
 - Add Slide: Insert a new slide for a new picture.
 - **Priority Level**: Set the urgency, High or Normal.
 - **Remove Picture**: Delete the picture from the current slide.
 - Remove Slide: (if more than one slide is attached) Delete the current slide from the message.
 - Cancel Message: Cancel the message, with the option to save it in Drafts.
- Use the Directional Keys to move to the Sound: field to add a sound, if desired.
- Use the Directional Keys to move to the Name Card: field to add a name card, if desired.
- Use the Directional Keys to move to the Subject: field to enter a subject for the message, if desired.
- Use the Directional Keys to move to the Calendar Event: field to attach a Calendar Event to the message, if desired.
- To send the message, press the Center Select Key SEND, or press the Send Key.

Receiving Messages

When you receive a message, you can choose to:

- View Now: Open the message for viewing.
- View Later: Dismiss the alert, and save the message in the Messages folders. For more information, see "Message Folders" on page 78.
- Reject: If you have disabled the Multimedia Auto Receive setting, reject the message. The message is not saved to Messages. For more information, see "Messaging Settings" on page 88.

Tip: If you want to control when you download multimedia content, you can disable Multimedia Auto Receive.

Viewing Text Messages

When you receive a text message, the alert sounds (unless turned off), and a notification displays.

- At the New Message prompt, press the Center Select Key OK to View Now.
- 2. While viewing the message, you have these options:
 - Start entering text for a Quick Reply message.
 - Press the Center Select Key REPLY to respond to the message with a new message.
 - Press the Left Soft Key Erase to delete the message.
 - Press the **Right Soft Key Options** for options:
 - **Forward**: Send the message to another recipient.
 - Reply w. Copy: Reply to the sender, plus other recipients if desired, and include a copy of the original message (up to 100 characters).

- Save As Quick Text: Save the message text to the Quick Text list.
- Lock/Unlock: Lock or unlock the message to prevent deletion.
- Add To Contacts: Save the sender's number to Contacts as a new entry or update an existing entry.
- Messaging Font Size: Select the font size, Normal or Large.
- Extract Addresses: Display all Contact Numbers, Email
 Addresses, and URLs extracted from the message, to call, send
 an email, or open the web page.
- Message Info: Display details about the message.

Viewing Multimedia Messages

When you receive a multimedia message, the alert sounds (unless turned off), and a notification displays.

- At the New Message prompt, press the Center Select Key OK to View Now.
- After loading, the attachment (and text, if any), displays. Use the Directional Keys to scroll to see the entire message, if necessary.
- **3.** While viewing the message, you have these options:
 - Press the Center Select Key REPLY to respond to the message with a new Text, Picture, or Voice message.
 - Press the Left Soft Key Erase to delete the message. While playing an attachment, use the Left Soft Key Mute/Unmute to control the audio playback.
 - Press the Right Soft Key Options for options (available options depend on the type of attachments):

- Play again: (Messages with attached video or sound) Play the attached file again.
- Reply: Reply to the sender.
- Reply w. Copy: Reply to the sender, plus other recipients if desired, and include a copy of the original message (up to 100 characters).
- Forward: Send the message to another recipient.
- Erase: (Messages with attached sound) Delete the message.
- Set As: Assign the attached picture as Wallpaper or Picture ID.
- Save Sound: (Messages with attached sound) Save the attached sound to My Sounds.
- Save Picture: (Messages with attached picture) Save the attached picture to My Pictures.
- Save Video: (Messages with attached video) Save the attached picture to My Videos.
- Save As Quick Text: Save the message text to the Quick Text list.
- Save as Ringtone: (Messages with attached sound) Save the attached sound as a ringtone.
- View Name Card: (If Name Card is attached) Display the attached name card.

- Save Name Card: (If Name card is attached) Save the attached name card to Contacts.
- View Calendar Invite: (If Calendar event is attached) Open the calendar event attachment.
- Lock/Unlock: Lock or unlock the message to prevent deletion.
- Add To Contacts: Save the sender's information to Contacts as a new entry or additional to an existing entry.
- Extract Addresses: Display all Contact Numbers, Email
 Addresses, and URLs extracted from the message, to call, send an email, or open the web page.
- Messaging Font Size: Select the font size, Normal or Large.
- Message Info: Display details about the message.

Message Folders

Messages are stored in the message folders, depending on your selections for Inbox View in Message Settings.

Tip: To scroll through all messages in the Messages, Sent, or Drafts folder, open one message and use the Directional Keys to scroll Left or Right.

Note: The Messaging menu depends on the Inbox View setting. For more information, see "Messaging Settings" on page 88.

Viewing Messages by Contact

When the Inbox View setting is set to Contact, all incoming and sent messages are stored in the Messages folder, grouped by contact (if the sender/recipient of the message is stored as a contact) or phone number, to provide a threaded view of the message exchange.

For more information about the Inbox View setting, see "Messaging Settings" on page 88.

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and command keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

- From the Home screen, press the Left Soft Key Message.
- The most recent message from each contact displays. Numbers to the right of the thread indicate the number of messages from this contact/number.
- To view a message thread, use the Directional Keys to highlight a contact/number, then press the Center Select Key OPEN.

- To send a reply message, use the Directional Keys to highlight a thread, then press the Left Soft Key Reply, or Reply All for group messages.
 - or -

Start entering characters, to send a Quick Reply.

- 5. While viewing the list of threads, use the Directional Keys to highlight a thread, then press the Right Soft Key Options for options (available options depend on the type of message):
 - **View Recipients**: (For Group Messages) Display the group message recipients.
 - Erase: Delete all highlighted message(s) from this contact/ number.
 - Add to Contacts: (If the number is not already saved) Save the phone number to Contacts.
 - New Message: Create a new Message.
 - Manage Messages: Perform an action on multiple message(s). Choose from Erase, Lock, Unlock, Copy To Card (fran optional memory card is installed), Mark as Read, or Mark as Unread.

- **Sort Alphabetically**: List the message threads by contact name/number, rather than time.
- Messaging Menu: Launch the Messaging Menu, for access to all messaging features.
- Social Networks: Access Facebook or Twitter.

Viewing Messages by Time

When the Inbox View setting is set to Time, incoming messages are stored in the Inbox, and sent messages are stored in the Sent folder, sorted by time.

Note: For more information about the Inbox View setting, see "Messaging Settings" on page 88.

Inbox

When the Inbox View setting is set to Time, incoming messages are stored in the Inbox message folder by date and time.

The **Inbox** folder is only present when the **Inbox View** setting is set to **Time**. For more information, see "*Messaging Settings*" on page 88.

- From the Home screen, press the Left Soft Key Message, then select Inbox.
- Use the Directional Keys to scroll the list of messages. While viewing the list of messages, you have these options:
 - Press the Left Soft Key Erase to delete a highlighted message.
 - Press the Center Select Key OPEN to read a message.
 - Press the Right Soft Key Options for options.
 Available options depend on the type of message highlighted:
 - Reply: Reply to the sender with a new message.
 - Reply All: (Group messages) Reply to all the recipients of a group message.
 - Reply to Sender Only: (Group messages) Reply to the sender of the group message, not to other recipients.

- Reply w. Copy: Reply to the sender, plus other recipients if desired, and include up to 100 characters of the original message.
- View Recipients: (For Group Messages) Display the group message recipients.
- Forward: Send the message to another recipient.
- Add To Contacts: Save the number of the sender to Contacts as a new entry or additional to an existing entry.
- Extract Addresses: Display all Contact Numbers, Email
 Addresses, and URLs extracted from the message, to call, send
 an email, or open the web page.
- **Message Info**: Display details about the message.
- Manage Inbox: Manage messages in the Inbox with the Erase, Lock or Unlock, Copy To Card (if an optional memory card is installed), Mark as Read or Mark as Unread commands.
- Sort by Time/Sender: List all messages in the Inbox by Sender or by Time.
- Sort by Size: List all messages in the Inbox by Sender or by Time.

Sent

When the Inbox View setting is set to Time, outgoing messages are stored in the Sent message folder by date and time.

The **Sent** folder is only present when the **Inbox View** setting is set to **Time**. For more information, see "*Messaging Settings*" on page 88.

- From the Home screen, press the Left Soft Key Message, then select Sent.
- 2. Use the Directional Keys to scroll the list of messages. While viewing the list of messages, you have these options:
 - Press the Left Soft Key Erase to delete the highlighted message.
 - Press the Center Select Key OPEN to read a message.

- Press the Right Soft Key Options for options.
 Available options depend on the type of message:
 - Forward: Send the message to another recipient.
 - View Recipients: (Group Messages) Display the group message recipients.
 - Resend: Send the message again, to the original recipient(s), plus new recipients if desired.
 - Add To Contacts: Save the number of the sender to Contacts as a new entry or additional to an existing entry.
 - **Message Info**: Display details about the message.
 - Manage Sent: Manage messages with the Erase, Lock or Unlock, or Copy To Card (if an optional memory card is installed) commands.
 - Sort by Recipient/Time: List messages by the first addressee, or by time.
 - Sort by Time/Type: List messages by type (Text, Picture or Voice) or by time received.

Drafts

Drafts are messages that you've created, but have not yet sent. You can return to Drafts at any time to review, edit or send a draft message.

- From the Home screen, press the Left Soft Key Message, then select Drafts.
- 2. Use the Directional Keys to scroll the list of messages. While viewing the list of messages, you have these options:
 - Press the Left Soft Key Erase to delete the highlighted message.
 - Press the Center Select Key EDIT to open the highlighted message to modify it and send it, if desired.
 - Press the **Right Soft Key** Options for options:
 - **Send**: Send the message, as-is, to the listed recipients.
 - Send All: (Group messages) Send the message, as-is, to the listed recipients.

- Add To Contacts: Save the number of the recipient(s) to Contacts as a new entry or additional to an existing entry.
- Manage Drafts: Manage messages with the Erase, Lock, or Unlock commands.
- Sort by Recipient/Time: List messages by the first addressee, or by time.
- Sort by Time/Type: List messages by type (Text, Picture or Voice) or by time created.

Voicemail

From the Messaging menu, you can view the total of your new voicemail messages, clear the voicemail counter, and call voicemail to check messages.

- From the Home screen, press the ☐ Center Select Key to select MENU → Messaging → Voicemail.
 - or -

From the Home screen, press the Left Soft Key Message, then select Voicemail.

 On the VOICE MAIL screen, view the number of new messages and the time. Press the Center Select Key CALL to dial voicemail to check messages, or press the Left Soft Key Clear to clear the voicemail counter.

Note: For more information about setting up and checking voicemail, see "Voicemail" on page 16.

Social Networks

Use the Social Networks feature to update Facebook or Twitter, or access the mobile Facebook or Twitter sites.

Setting up Your Phone with Facebook or Twitter

Set up your phone to access Facebook and Twitter to share posts, photos and links.

You can activate your phone with your Facebook or Twitter account's mobile account settings. Activating allows the sites to send and accept text messages with your phone, so you can receive notifications and status updates, and allows you to update your status from your phone.

From your account settings, follow the instructions in the Mobile area to complete your phone registration. You can also initiate registration from your phone, to receive a confirmation code you can enter in the Mobile settings.

Initiating registration from your phone

- From the Home screen, press the space Social Networks Key on the QWERTY keyboard, then select Update Status.
- 2. Enter text, then press the Center Select Key SEND.
- 3. Select sites to update. Use the Directional Keys to highlight sites, then press the Center Select Key MARK, or press the Right Soft Key Mark All to select Facebook and Twitter. Once you make selections, these site(s) will be updated automatically each time you use Update Status. If you choose Always ask before update, your phone will prompt you to choose site(s) each time you use Update Status.
- The site(s) will send a text message to your phone with information about registration. Follow the instructions to complete registration.

Updating your Status

After you register your phone with Facebook or Twitter, updating your status is easy and quick.

- From the Home screen, press the Social Networks Key on the QWERTY keyboard, then select Update Status.
- 2. Enter text, then press the <a> Center Select Key SEND.
- 3. Select sites to update. Use the Directional Keys to highlight sites, then press the Center Select Key MARK, or press the Right Soft Key Mark All to select Facebook and Twitter. Once you make selections, these site(s) will be updated automatically each time you use Update Status. If you choose Always ask before update, your phone will prompt you to choose site(s) each time you use Update Status.

Emergency Alerts

This device is designed to receive Wireless Emergency Alerts from the Commercial Mobile Alert Service (CMAS).

Emergency Alerts are geographically-targeted, and alert customers to imminent threats to their safety within their area. There is no charge for receiving an Emergency Alert.

There are three types of Emergency Alerts:

- Presidential
- Imminent (Severe or Extreme)
- AMBER Alerts (missing persons)

Customers may choose not to receive Imminent Alerts and AMBER Alerts. Presidential Alerts cannot be disabled. To disable Imminent Threat Alerts (Extreme and Severe) and AMBER Alerts, follow these instructions:

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select Key to select MENU → Messaging.
- 2. Press the Left Soft Key Settings → Emergency
 Alerts → Receive Alerts.
- All alerts are enabled by default (check mark showing).
 To disable alerts, highlight an alert and press the Center Select Key UNMARK, then press the Left Soft Key Done.

Mobile Email

Send and receive Email using Mobile Email.

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and command keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

- Multimedia Auto Receive: Choose On to automatically accept new multimedia messages. Choose Off to have the phone prompt you to download new multimedia messages.
- Group Messaging: Choose a default behavior for replies to your group messages from recipients. Choose Individual Messages to have replies treated as "Blind Copy", where recipients can't see others on the To: list, and replies come only to you, or Group Conversation to have replies treated as "Reply All", where all the recipients can see the entire To: list, and replies go to all recipients with compatible devices in the original To: list. Group Conversation messages are treated as multimedia messages.

- Domain Extensions: Create and manage a list of standard web and Email extensions. Press the Left Soft Key Erase to delete extensions. Press the Right Soft Key New to create new extensions. To modify an extension, highlight the extension, then press the Center Select Key EDIT.
- Quick Text: Create and manage phrases you can insert into messages. Press the Left Soft Key Erase to delete phrases.
 Press the Right Soft Key Options → New to create new phrases. To modify a phrase, highlight the phrase, then press Center Select Key EDIT.
- Emergency Alerts: This device is designed to receive Wireless
 Emergency Alerts from the Commercial Mobile Alert Service
 (CMAS), including Presidential Alerts, Imminent Alerts (Severe
 or Extreme), and AMBER Alerts (missing persons). You may
 choose not to receive Imminent and AMBER alerts, but
 Presidential Alerts cannot be disabled. All alerts are enabled by
 default (check mark showing). For more information about
 Emergency Alerts, see "Emergency Alerts" on page 86.
 - Receive alerts: All alerts are enabled by default (check mark showing). To disable alerts, highlight an alert and press the Center Select Key MARK, then press the Left Soft Key Done to save the configuration.

- Alert Reminder: Highlight an interval for reminders that you have a CMAS message, then press the Center Select Key SET to save the setting.

- Callback #: Choose On to add a callback phone number to your messages, and set the phone number. Choose Off to omit a callback number (you can manually add a callback number to individual messages).
- Signature: Choose Custom to add a signature to all
 messages, then use the Directional Key to move to the
 signature field to create the signature. Choose None to disable
 signatures.
- Delivery Receipt: Choose whether you are notified when a message you send is delivered. Choose On to be notified for every message, or Off to disable notification (you can set an optional delivery receipt for individual messages).



Mobile Web Command Key Functions



While browsing with the phone open, you can use the Directional Key on the front of the phone, or the Directional Keys on the QWERTY keyboard.

Center Select Key: Press to select a highlighted item, or to accept a prompt.

End/Power Key: Press to exit Mobile Web and return to the Home screen.

Send Key: Press to dial a highlighted number.

CLR Key: Press once to back up one page. Press and hold to go back to Mobile Web home page.

CLR

When entering text, press to clear the last character. Press and hold to clear the text field.



Numbers 1 - 0: Use the number keys to select numbered list items, or enter numbers.

Left Soft Key: The Left Soft Key function depends on the type of content that's highlighted. For example:

 Select: Press to open a list of items, then use Directional Keys to highlight an item. Press the Left Soft Key again, or press the Center Select Key.

• Go: Press to go to the highlighted URL or link.

• Edit: Press to insert the cursor in a text field.

OK: Press to accept the text in a text field.

Right Soft Key: The Right Soft Key function depends on the type of content that's highlighted. For example:

• Menu: Press to display a list of web options.

• Back: Press to go back to the previous page.





Entering a URL

Enter a URL, or web address, to go to a web page or create a Favorite bookmark.

My Music

Play music files that you transfer from your PC, or from an optional installed memory card. You can play music with the slide open or closed.

Each time you launch My Music, it checks your phone memory, and optional installed memory card, for music files.

Playing Music

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Media Center → Music &
 Tones → My Music.
- Browse music, using the Directional Key to highlight items, then press the Center Select Key VIEW to display lists of songs or playlists.
- 3. Select songs to play:
 - Select Play All Songs, then press the Center Select Key OK to play all songs in memory.

Voice Commands

Voice Commands is advanced speech recognition software that recognizes your spoken commands to dial phone numbers, create messages, and launch phone features such as Contacts, Calendar and My Music.

To use Voice Commands, speak naturally into your phone, at a distance of 3-12 inches. There is no need to "train" Voice Commands, it is designed to recognize natural speech.

- From the Home screen, press and hold the Voice Commands Key.

From the Home screen, press the **Center Select**Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Tools →

Voice Commands

- Voice Commands displays a list of available commands, and prompts you for a command. If Voice Commands does not recognize your command, it will prompt you to confirm. Commands include:
 - Call <Name or #>: Place a call to a saved contact, to a telephone number, or to voicemail.
 - Send Message <Name or #>: Create a text, picture, or voice message to a saved contact, or to a telephone number.
 - **Go To <Menu>:** Open any application installed on your device.
 - Check < Item>: View details about your phone's status.
 - Contacts <Name>: Open a contact record from Contacts.
 - **Redial**: Call the last number you dialed.

- Play <Playlist>: Open My Music, to play a play list, or all songs.
- Sound Alert Mode On/Sound Alert Mode Off: Activate or deactivate Sound Alert Mode. For more information, see "Sound Alert Mode" on page 40.
- My Version: Open the My Verizon application.
- Help: Launch a helpful tutorial about using Voice Commands.

Calculator

Normal

Perform simple mathematical calculations.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select

- Use the Directional Key to enter a calculation symbol:
 - Up Key: [+] Addition
 - Down Key: [] Subtraction
 - Right Key: [x] Multiplication

- Continue entering numbers and symbols, then press the Center Select Key OK to perform the calculation.

- **5.** While entering equations, you can use these options:
 - Press the Left Soft Key Clear or the C Clear Key to delete entries.
 - Press the Right Soft Key Operator to enter Left [()] and Right [)] Parentheses or raise a number by a Power.
 - Press after a number to change the sign.

Eco

Calculate fuel mileage, efficiency, and estimated number of pounds of carbon dioxide emitted.

 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Tools →
 Calculator → Eco.
- 2. Use the Directional Key to highlight fields, then enter the value in the field:
 - Distance (mile): Number of miles traveled.
 - Fuel (\$): Cost of fuel purchased.
 - Fuel (gallon): Number of gallons purchased.

Note: Press to enter a decimal point.

- Press the Center Select Key OK to calculate these statistics:
 - Price (\$/gallon): Cost of fuel per mile.
 - Efficiency (\$/mile): Efficiency of the vehicle.
 - Efficiency (mile/gallon): Number of miles per gallon.
 - Efficiency (Ib / Trip): Number of pounds of carbon dioxide emitted per trip, based on a gas-powered medium-sized vehicle.

Converter

Convert values you enter into selected units.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Tools →
 Calculator → Converter.
- Use the Directional Keys to highlight a conversion type, then press the Center Select Key OK:
 - Temperature
 - Length
 - Weight
 - Area
 - Volume
 - Currency
- Use the Directional Key to highlight the From units field, then press the Directional Key Left or Right to choose the units for conversion.
- Use the **Directional Key** to highlight the **From** quantity field, then enter the quantity.

Note: Press ****** to enter a decimal point. Press ****** after a number to change the sign to negative.

Use the Directional Key to highlight the To units field, then press the Directional Key Left or Right to choose the units for conversion.

Calendar

Schedule up to eight events, with reminders, so that you can track Set alarms for events to be alerted of an upcoming event.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Tools →
 Calendar.
- On the Calendar screen, use the Directional Key to highlight a date on the calendar, then press the Center Select Key VIEW to display the day's events.
- **3.** Press the **Right Soft Key Options** to choose:

 - Go To Date: Specify a date to view.
 - Erase All: Delete all events from your calendar.
 - Erase All Old: Delete all past events.

Viewing an Event

World Clock

View the local time, and the time in cities around the world.

 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Tools →
 World Clock.
- 2. Choose a time to view with one of these methods:
 - Use the **Directional Key** to scroll through the time zones around the world.
 - Press the Left Soft Key Cities to select from a list of 45 supported cities. Select a city and press the Center Select Key OK to view your entry.
- To set the displayed time as your local time, press the Center Select Key OK.
- To enable or disable Daylight Savings Time for the displayed times, press the Right Soft Key to toggle between DST On and DST Off.

Notepad

Create, store and edit notes in Notepad.

- When you're finished entering the note, press the Center Select Key SAVE.

Managing Notes

This procedure describes default USB connection behavior. You can configure USB Mode settings. For more information, see "USB Mode" on page 171.

 USB Mass Storage.
- 2. Connect your phone to a computer with a USB cable.
- At the prompt, select a USB Mode. Use the Directional Key to highlight USB Mass Storage, then press the Center Select Key OK.
- At the prompt on your computer, select a method for transferring files, then transfer files.
- When finished, press the Center Select Key Disconnect, then follow the prompts.

Phone Search

Enter keywords to search for items on your phone.

Note: This procedure uses the QWERTY keyboard and command keys. Rotate the phone and slide it open to access the QWERTY keyboard.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Tools → Phone Search.
 - or -

With the phone open, press the Q Search Key on the QWERTY keyboard.

- Enter keyword(s) in the search field using the QWERTY keyboard.
- Select categories to search. Use the Directional Keys to highlight categories, then press the Center Select Key MARK, or press the Right Soft Key Mark All to search all categories. Press the Left Soft Key Done to save your selections.
- Press the Center Select Key SEARCH to find items matching your keyword(s).

VZ Navigator

VZ Navigator[®] uses GPS positioning to tell you where you are, what's nearby, and to give you directions - quickly and easily. With audible turn-by-turn directions, you can locate points of interest in the U.S., including landmarks, restaurants, and even ATMs.

The first time you launch VZ Navigator, you'll be prompted to download and install the application, and to agree to the terms of service. Contact Verizon Wireless for more information.

 - Low: All sounds play at medium volume
 - Vibrate Only: No sounds play, but the phone vibrates for incoming calls and messages, alarms and other alerts.
 - Alarm Only: Sounds play for alarms, but not for calls or alerts.
 - All Sounds Off: No sounds play.

Tip: Press the Left Soft Key Play to hear a sample.

Tools

The Tools menu provides personal productivity and information applications.

Voice Commands

Use Voice Commands to operate your phone by speaking commands. For more information, see "Voice Commands" on page 121.

From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Tools → Voice Commands

Tip: You can also launch Voice Commands by pressing and holding the Voice Commands Key on the side of the phone.

Calculator

The Calculator provides a Normal mathematical calculator, a Tip Calculator, an Eco Calculator, and a Converter. For more information, refer to "Calculator" on page 123.

From the Home screen, press the Center Select Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Tools → Calculator.

Calendar

Use the Calendar to view a calendar and schedule events. For more information, refer to "Calendar" on page 126.

From the Home screen, press the Center Select Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Tools → Calendar.

Alarm Clock

Set up to three alarms using the Alarm Clock. For more information, refer to "Alarm Clock" on page 128.

From the Home screen, press the Center Select Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Tools → Alarm Clock.

Stopwatch

Measure and record lap times with the Stopwatch. For more information, refer to "Stopwatch" on page 129.

Phone Search

Use Phone Search to find items in your phone's memory, or stored on an installed memory card. For more information, see "Phone Search" on page 132.

From the Home screen, press the Center Select Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Tools → Phone Search.

Bluetooth Menu

About Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology for exchanging information over a distance of about 30 feet without requiring a physical connection.

You don't need to line up the devices to send information with Bluetooth. If the devices are in range, you can exchange information between them, even if they are in different rooms.

Note: When using many Bluetooth headsets, you can press the multi-function key on the headset to launch the Voice Commands tool.

Bluetooth Service Profiles

Bluetooth profiles are specifications for services supported by individual devices. Profiles improve the ability of different devices to work together.

Tip: You can find a list of supported profiles on your phone.

Select MENU → Settings & Tools → Bluetooth Menu →

Options → Supported Profiles.

Your phone supports these Bluetooth profiles:

Headset: HSP profile supports the use of a compatible Bluetooth headset for mono voice.

Handsfree: HFP profile supports Bluetooth headsets, and may also support other compatible Bluetooth devices with speakerphone capabilities, such as car kits or conference room devices.

Stereo: A2DP, AVRCP, GAVDP, AVDTP and AVCTP profiles support delivery of stereo audio to a compatible Bluetooth device, such as a headset or speakers.

Phonebook Access: PBAP profile allows sharing of your name card and contact entries as vCards with a compatible Bluetooth device.

Basic Printing: BPP profile allows printing of JPEG files to a Bluetooth-enabled printer.

Basic Imaging: BIP profile allows sending of non-protected images for storing and printing.

Object Push: OPP profile allows sending and receiving of contact name cards (vCard 3.0), calendar events (vCalendar 2.0), and other non-protected data between devices.

Serial Port: SPP profile allows a remote Bluetooth device to act as a virtual serial port.

Note: This phone does not support all Bluetooth profiles. For more information about compatible Bluetooth devices, visit the Verizon Wireless website at:

www.verizonwireless.com.

Turning Bluetooth On or Off

Turn Bluetooth on to exchange information with a Bluetooth device. To save battery life, or in situations where use of wireless devices is prohibited, such as airline travel, you can turn Bluetooth off.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools →
 Bluetooth Menu.
- 2. Press the Left Soft Key Turn On or Turn Off.

Note: When Bluetooth is turned on, the **Bluetooth On** icon appears in the annunciator line of the display.

Bluetooth Options

Bluetooth options allow you to view and change your phone's name, display supported profiles, and set visibility and pairing.

From the Home screen, press the Center Select
Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools →
Bluetooth Menu.

- 2. Press the **Right Soft Key Options** for these options:
 - My Phone Info: Enter a custom name for your phone, visible to other Bluetooth devices during searches, and view other information about your phone's Bluetooth status.
 - **Discovery Mode**: Select **On** for other Bluetooth devices to detect your device, or **Off** for no visibility.

Note: After selecting On, your phone will be discoverable for one minute, then Discover Mode will automatically reset to Off.

- Supported Profiles: View a list of supported Bluetooth profiles and their descriptions. Highlight a profile and press View to see a description.
- Search Setting: Choose types of devices to search during pairings, from All, Audio Device, PC, Phone, or Printer.
- Auto Pairing: Choose On to allow your phone to pair with other Bluetooth devices without entering a passkey, or Off to prevent automatic pairing.

Adding a New Device

Search for a Bluetooth device and pair with it, to exchange information between your phone and the device.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools →
 Bluetooth Menu.
- 2. Use the Directional Key to highlight Add New Device and press the Center Select Key OK.
- At the prompt "PLACE DEVICE YOU ARE CONNECTING TO IN DISCOVERABLE MODE," activate the target device's discoverable or visible mode and press the Center Select Key OK.
- 4. Your phone searches for discoverable Bluetooth devices and displays them. Use the Directional Key to highlight the target device and press the Center Select Key PAIR. Follow the prompts pair the devices:
 - Auto Pairing: If Auto Pairing is On in Bluetooth Options, and the selected device supports it, your phone sends a code to the device. Confirm that the same code appears on both devices, and follow the prompts on both devices to complete the pairing.

- Pairing with Passkey: At the prompt, enter a passkey. Your
 phone converts this to a device code and sends it to the target
 device. Verify that the code is the same on both devices, and
 follow the prompts on both devices to complete the pairing.
- After pairing, you can continue to send a name card, a calendar event, or a picture to the newly-paired device.
- 6. You can configure options for the pairing. Use the Directional Key to highlight the device in the paired list, then press the Right Soft Key Options:
 - Remove Device: Remove the highlighted device from the paired list.
 - Rename Device: Change the name of the device in the list.
 - Incoming Security: Set the behavior when your device receives a request from the paired device. Choose Always Ask to have your phone prompt you to accept connections from this device. Choose Always Connect to automatically accept future connections from this device.
 - Service Discovery: View a list of Bluetooth profiles supported by this device. Press the Center Select Key VIEW for more information.
 - Device Info: View information about the paired device.

Keyguard Settings

Use Keyguard Setting to control how your phone locks the keypad, and set preferences.

Auto Lock

The Auto Lock setting controls whether the external keypad locks automatically when phone is closed and the backlight goes off.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools →
 Keyguard Settings → Auto Lock.
- 2. Use the Directional Key to highlight a setting, then press the Center Select Key SET:
 - On: Enables Auto Lock. The keypad will lock when the backlight goes out.
 - Off: Disables keyguard. The keypad never locks automatically.

Tip: You can lock or unlock the keypad manually from any screen when the phone is closed by pressing and holding .

Unlock Options

You can customize the keypress sequence to unlock your phone's keypad.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools →
 Keyguard Settings → Unlock Options.
- 2. Use the Directional Key to highlight a setting, then press the Center Select Key SET:
 - Press Once: Unlock the keypad by pressing the Center Select Key once.
 - Press Twice: Unlock the keypad by pressing the Right Soft Key, then the Center Select Key OK.

Sounds Settings

Use Sounds Settings to customize your phone's sounds for incoming calls and messages, alerts and other features.

Easy Set-up

Quickly set basic Sounds settings.

- From the Home screen, press the _____ Center Select Key to select MENU → ____ Settings & Tools → Sounds Settings → Easy Set-up.
- Follow the screen prompts and use the Left Soft Key Play, Right Soft Key Skip, and Center Select Key SET to configure settings for Call Sounds, Keypad Volume, Text Message Alert, Multimedia Message Alert, and Voicemail Message Alert.

Call Sounds

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Sounds
 Settings → Call Sounds.
- 2. Make selections for the following settings:
 - Call Ringtone: Select from a list of pre-loaded ringtones.
 - Call Vibrate: Select On to have your phone vibrate along with playing the Call Ringtone to alert you to incoming calls, or select Off.
 - Caller ID Readout: Set preferences for incoming calls for
 which Caller ID information is available. Select Ring Only to
 have the phone play the Call Ringtone for incoming calls. Select
 Caller ID + Ring to have the phone announce the caller ID,
 plus play the Call Ringtone for incoming calls. Select Name
 Repeat to have the phone repeat the caller's information for
 incoming calls.

Alert Sounds

Choose sounds for new message alerts, emergency tones, missed calls, and device connection and battery charge alerts.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Sounds
 Settings → Alert Sounds.
- Use the Left Soft Key, Right Soft Key, and Center Select Key to make selections for these settings:
 - TXT Message:
 - Alert Tone: Select a tone to play when you receive a new text message.
 - Alert Vibrate: Select On to have your phone will vibrate when you receive a new text message, or Off for no vibration. Vibrate is independent of the Alert Tone.
 - Reminder: Select Once, Every 2 Minutes, or Every 15
 Minutes to have your phone remind you of new text messages,
 or select Off for no reminders.

Multimedia Message:

- Alert Tone: Select a tone to play when you receive a new multimedia message.
- Alert Vibrate: Select On to have your phone will vibrate when you receive a new multimedia message, or Off for no vibration.
 Vibrate is independent of the Alert Tone.
- Reminder: Select Once, Every 2 Minutes, or Every 15
 Minutes to have your phone remind you of new multimedia
 messages, or select Off for no reminders.

Voicemail:

- Alert Tone: Select a tone to play when you receive a new voicemail message.
- Alert Vibrate: Select On to have your phone vibrate when you
 receive a new voicemail message, or Off for no vibration.
 Vibrate is independent of the Alert Tone.

Emergency Tone:

- Alert: When On, the phone will play a tone during emergency calls (such as to 911), except when the master volume setting is Vibrate or All Sounds Off.
- Vibrate: When enabled, the phone will vibrate during emergency calls (such as to 911).
- Off: The phone will not play any tone, or vibrate, during emergency calls.

Missed Call:

- Alert Tone: Select a tone to play when you miss a call.
- Alert Vibrate: Select On to have your phone vibrate when you
 miss a call, or Off for no vibration. Vibrate is independent of the
 Alert Tone.
- Reminder: Select Once, Every 2 Minutes, or Every 15
 Minutes to have your phone remind you of a missed call, or
 select Off for no reminders.
- Device Connect: Select On to have your phone play a tone
 when you connect the phone to another device with a USB
 cable, or Off for no sound on connection.
- Battery Charge Alert: Choose Alert or Vibrate to have the phone notify you when charging is complete, or choose Off.

Keypad Sounds

Choose a tone for keypad presses.

Note: The Master Volume setting overrides Keypad Sounds setting. If you choose Vibrate Only or All Sounds Off as the Master Volume setting, Keypad Sounds will not play.

Note: The Master Volume setting overrides Keypad Volume setting. If you choose Vibrate Only or All Sounds Off as the Master Volume setting, Keypad Sounds will not play at the Keypad Volume setting.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Sounds
 Settings → Keypad Volume.
- 2. Press the Directional Key or Volume
 Key to highlight a volume level, then press the
 Center Select Key SET.

Digit Dial Readout

Enable or disable the readout of numbers as you dial.

Note: The Master Volume setting overrides Digit Dial Readout setting. If you choose Vibrate Only or All Sounds Off as the Master Volume setting, you will not hear Digit Dial Readout.

 Settings → Digit Dial Readout.
- Select On to have the phone read the numbers as you dial them, or Off to disable readout.

Service Alerts

Enable or disable sounds your phone plays to notify you of changes in system or service status.

 Settings → Service Alerts.
- 2. Choose On or Off for these Service Alerts:
 - ERI: When On, your phone plays a tone when you enter and exit network coverage areas.
 - Minute Beep: When On, your phone beeps once per minute while you are on a call.
 - Call Connect: When On, your phone plays a tone when a call connects and ends.
 - **Software Update**: When **On**, your phone plays an alert when a software update is complete.

Power On/Off

Control the sounds your phone plays when you power the phone on or off.

Note: The Master Volume setting overrides Digit Dial Readout setting. If you choose Vibrate Only or All Sounds Off as the Master Volume setting, you will not hear Power On/Off sounds.

 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Sounds
 Settings → Power On/Off.
- 2. Choose options:
 - Power On: Highlight On or Off, then press SET.
 - Power Off: Highlight On or Off, then press SET.

Sound Alert Mode

Sound Alert Mode overrides Master Volume and Call Sounds setting, and converts all visual alerts to sounds. Volume is set to High, Call Alert sounds will ring regardless of the vibrate setting, and you can choose whether a caller's contact name and number and/or message are read out when you receive a call or message. For more information, see "Sound Alert Mode" on page 40.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Display
 Settings → Sound Alert Mode.
- 2. Use the Directional Key to highlight a setting, then press the Center Select Key SET:
 - Caller ID Only: Volume is set to high, and call alerts play regardless of sound settings. When you receive a call or message, the caller or sender's information is read out.
 - ID & Message: Volume is set to high, call alerts play regardless
 of sound settings. When you receive a call or message, the
 caller or sender's information is read out, along with the
 message contents.
 - Off: All sounds revert to their previous settings.

Display Settings

Use Display Settings to customize the appearance of your phone's screens.

Easy Set-Up

Quickly set Display settings.

 Settings → Easy Set-up.
- Follow the screen prompts and use the Left Soft
 Key Preview, Right Soft Key Skip, and Center
 Select Key SET to configure settings for Personal
 Banner, Display Backlight, Keypad Backlight, Wallpaper,
 Display Themes, Menu Layout, Dial Fonts, Volume Key
 Control. and Clock Format.

Banner

Create a personal greeting, or network status banner to appear on the Home screen.

Personal Banner

Create a personal greeting to appear on the Home screen.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Display
 Settings → Banner → Personal Banner.
- Enter up to 18 characters. For more information about entering text, see "Entering Text" on page 61.
- Use the Directional Key to move to Select Text Color, then scroll right or left to highlight a color for the banner.
- Press the Center Select Key SET to save your settings and display your Personal Banner on the Home screen.

Tip: Press the Left Soft Key Preview to see the banner on the Home screen.

ERI banner

Enable or disable an ERI banner to indicate network status.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Display
 Settings → Banner → ERI Banner.
- 2. Use the Directional Key to highlight On or Off.
- Use the Directional Key to move to ERI Banner Color, then scroll right or left to highlight a color for the banner.

Backlight

- Use the Directional Key to highlight, and the Left Soft Key, Right Soft Key, and Center Select Key to make selections:
 - My Pictures: Select a pre-loaded picture, or one you downloaded or captured with the Camera.
 - My Videos: Select a video you downloaded, or recorded with the Camera.

Tip: Press the Left Soft Key to View or Play the highlighted wallpaper.

Lock Screen

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Display
 Settings → Wallpaper → Lock Screen.
- Use the Directional Key to highlight, and the Left Soft Key, Right Soft Key, and Cente Select Key to make selections:
 - ECO Wallpaper: Displays random nature images.
 - None: Displays the Home screen wallpaper.

Tip: Press the Left Soft Key Preview to see the highlighted wallpaper.

Display Themes

Customize the appearance of your phone's menus and screens.

Customize the features and applications available on the Main Menu.

Menu Layout

Choose from preset main menu layouts for the Menu display.

Note: The default menu layout is Grid. Examples in this user manual use the Grid layout.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Display
 Settings → Main Menu Settings → Menu Layout.
- Use the Directional Key to highlight a layout, then press the Center Select Key OK to select it. Choose from:
 - **Tab**: Displays menu icons on tabs, so you can use the **Directional Keys** to scroll right and left through the menus.
 - List: Displays menu items in a list, so you can use the
 Directional Keys to scroll up and down through the menus.
 - Grid: (Default) Displays menu items in a grid, so you can use the Directional Keys to scroll up, down, right or left through the menus.

Replace Menu Items (List Menu Layout only)

When the Menu Layout is set to List, you can customize the Menu by replacing some icons with your favorite applications or tools.

Note: Some Menu items, such as Settings & Tools and Contacts, cannot be replaced.

 - Style: Use the Directional Key to highlight a font for Dial Font Style and Menu Font Style, then press the Center Select Key SET.
 - Size: Use the Directional Key to highlight a font for Dial Font Size, Menu Font Size, and Messaging Font Size, then press the Center Select Key SET.
 - Volume Key Control: When On, you can press the Volume Key to adjust the font size while using your phone.

Tip: Press the Left Soft Key Preview to scroll through examples of the font attributes, then make your selection by pressing the Center Select Key SET.

Clock Format

Select the format for the clock displayed on the Home screen.

When Airplane Mode is On, all wireless functions of your phone are disabled, and you cannot send or receive calls or messages. While in Airplane Mode, you can use other features of your phone, such as Calendar or Games.

 Settings → Airplane Mode.
- Use the Directional Key to highlight On to activate Airplane Mode, or Off to deactivate Airplane Mode, then press the Center Select Key SET.

Set Shortcuts

Customize My Shortcuts and Directional Key shortcuts, for easy access to your favorite applications or menus.

Set My Shortcuts

From the Home screen, press the Directional Key Right to access My Shortcuts. For more information, see "Directional Keys" on page 24.

Tip: You can set shortcuts right from My Shortcuts by pressing the Left Soft Key Settings.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone
 Settings → Set Shortcuts → Set My Shortcuts.
- Use the Directional Key to highlight Shortcut 1, Shortcut 2, Shortcut 3 or Shortcut 4 then press the Center Select Key EDIT.
- 3. Use the **Directional Key** to highlight an item, then press the **Center Select Key SET** to update the shortcut.
- 4. To reset shortcut(s), highlight the shortcut, then press the Right Soft Key Options:
 - **Reset Shortcut <x>**: Resets the highlighted shortcut.
 - Reset My Shortcuts: Resets all shortcuts.

Voice Commands Settings

Configure the Voice Commands tool. You can also access Voice Commands settings from Voice Commands. For more information, see "Voice Commands" on page 121.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone
 Settings → Voice Commands Settings.
- Use the Directional Key to highlight, and the Left Soft Key, Right Soft Key, and Center Select Key to make selections:
 - TXT Msg Readout: Choose On to have the phone read the text in a TXT message when you open the message, or Off for no readout.
 - Confirm Choices: Choose whether the phone prompts you with a list of potential matches to your voice command. Select Automatic, Always Confirm, or Never Confirm.
 - Sensitivity: Control how Voice Commands filters your speech for matches.
 - Choose More Sensitive to filter out more potential matches, such as in cases where the phone frequently recognizes a command even if you said nothing.

- Choose Automatic for the default sensitivity level.
- Choose Less Sensitive to filter fewer potential matches, such as in cases where the phone frequently does not recognize names, numbers, or commands.
- Adapt Voice: Train Voice Commands to recognize your voice.
- **Prompts**: Select settings for the prompts Voice Commands provides.
 - Mode: Select the type of audio guidance you prefer, from Prompts, Readout + Alerts, Readout, or Tones Only.
 - Audio Playback: Control whether audio, including prompts and readouts, is played through the speakerphone or earpiece.
 - Timeout: Control how long the Voice Commands system listens for a command from you. Choose 5 seconds or 10 seconds.
- Key Setting: Select the method for launching Voice Commands.
 - Choose Voice Key Only to launch with the Voice Commands key.
- Choose Voice Key/Headset to launch with the Voice Commands key, OR with headset controls when you attach an optional headset.
- About: View information about Voice Commands.

Language

Choose the language for the phone's operation and displays. Your phone supports English, Spanish, Chinese, Korean, and Vietnamese.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone
 Settings → Language.
- 2. Use the Directional Key to highlight a language, then press the Center Select Key SET.

QWERTY Action

Choose how the phone reacts when you open the QWERTY keyboard and begin entering text at the Home screen.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone
 Settings → QWERTY Action.
- Use the Directional Key to highlight a launch action, then press the Center Select Key OK.
 Options include:
 - Dialer Screen: Open the Dialer to enter a number to call or send a message.
 - Contacts: Open Contacts to find a contact.
 - New Message: Create a new message.
 - Phone Search: Launch Phone Search to find items on your phone.
 - Notepad: Launch Notepad to create a new note.
 - Let Me Choose: Display icons for Contacts, New Message,
 Phone Search, and Notepad, so you can choose.

Location Detection

Choose whether your phone's GPS (Global Positioning System) location is available to the network at all times, or only when you've dialed an Emergency Number, such as 911.

Note: Location service is required by some applications on your phone, and is only available on the Verizon Wireless network. It is not available when roaming.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone
 Settings → Location Detection.
- 2. Use the Directional Key to highlight a setting, then press the Center Select Key SET:
 - On: GPS location is on wherever the feature is available.
 - **E911 Only**: GPS location setting turns on only when you dial 911.

Current Country

To ensure your phone works properly when you travel, set the country, so the correct Country code is applied when dialing.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone
 Settings → Current Country.
- 2. Use the Directional Key to highlight a country, then press the Center Select Key SET.

Security

Lock your phone, set restrictions, and other security options.

Important! Access to all Security settings requires the phone lock code. By default the Lock Code is the last four digits of your phone number.

For security reasons, your phone does not display lock codes. If you change the lock code, be sure to record the new code for future reference.

Edit Codes

Set a new Phone Only Lock Code (for locking and unlocking the phone) or Calls & Services Lock Code (for restricting access to calls and services).

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone
 Settings → Security.
- Enter the Phone Only Lock Code at the prompt. The default lock code is the last four digits of your phone number.
- Choose Edit Codes, then use the Directional Key to highlight a code, then press the Center Select Key OK:
 - Phone Only: Enter a new lock code at the prompt, then enter the new code again to confirm the change.
 - Calls & Services: Enter a new lock code at the prompt, then enter the new code again to confirm the change.

Restrictions

Set restrictions for receiving calls or messages. When you

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone
 Settings → Security.
- Enter the Phone Only Lock Code at the prompt. The default lock code is the last four digits of your phone number, or you can set a custom lock code under Phone Settings → Security → Edit Codes.
- 3. Use the Directional Key to highlight Restrictions, then press the Center Select Key OK.
- 4. Enter the Calls and Services Code at the prompt. The default code is the last four digits of your phone number, or you can set a custom lock code at Phone Settings → Security → Edit Codes.
- Use the Directional Key to highlight Location Setting to control the Location Detection setting, then press the Center Select Key OK:
 - Unlock Setting: Changes are permitted to the Location Detection setting with no restrictions.

- Lock Setting: You must enter the Calls and Service Code to make changes to the Location Detection setting.
- Use the Directional Key to highlight Calls to set restrictions on calls, then press the Center Select Key OK:
 - Incoming Calls: Choose Allow All to permit all incoming calls.
 Choose Contacts Only to permit only calls from numbers saved in Contacts. Choose Block All to prevent all incoming calls.
 - Outgoing Calls: Choose Allow All to allow dialing of any phone number. Choose Contacts Only to permit dialing calls to numbers saved in Contacts. Choose Block All to prevent all dialing.
- Use the Directional Key to highlight Messages to set restrictions for messages, then press the Center Select Key OK:
 - Incoming Messages: Choose Allow All to permit all incoming messages. Choose Block All to prevent all incoming messages.
 - Outgoing Messages: Choose Allow All to permit sending of all messages. Choose Block All to prevent sending of all messages.

Phone Lock Setting

Set the locking behavior of your phone. When the phone is locked, you must enter a lock code to use it, except when dialing emergency numbers or accessing ICE information. For more information about see "In Case of Emergency" on page 56.

Note: Phone Lock is different from the Keypad Lock. For more information about keypad locking, see "Keyguard Settings" on page 140.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone
 Settings → Security.
- Enter the Phone Only Lock Code at the prompt. The default lock code is the last four digits of your phone number, or you can set a custom lock code under Phone Settings → Security → Edit Codes.

- 3. Choose Phone Lock Setting, then use the
 - press the Center Select Key 0K:
 - Unlocked: The phone is unlocked at all times.
 - On Power Up: The phone locks when you power it on. You can make emergency calls, but must enter a lock code for other features.

Lock Phone Now

You can manually lock your phone, to prevent access until you unlock it with the Phone Only Lock Code. This is a one-time lock; your phone returns to the setting you selected at Phone Lock Setting after you unlock it.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone
 Settings → Security.
- Enter the Phone Only Lock Code at the prompt. The default lock code is the last four digits of your phone number, or you can set a custom lock code under Phone Settings → Security → Edit Codes.
- Select Lock Phone Now. The phone locks and returns to the Home screen. To unlock the phone, press Unlock and enter the Lock Code.

Restore Phone

Return all phone settings to the defaults and permanently erase your information, including pictures, videos, music, messages, contacts and downloaded applications.

Warning! Restore Phone is irreversible. Data cannot be recovered after the Restore Phone operation.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone
 Settings → Security.
- Enter the Phone Only Lock Code at the prompt. The default lock code is the last four digits of your phone number, or you can set a custom lock code under Phone Settings → Security → Edit Codes.
- 3. Use the Directional Key to highlight Restore Phone, then press the Center Select Key OK.
- At the prompt, highlight Yes to restore default settings, then press the Center Select Key OK. The phone powers off, then back on.

Note: After restoring defaults, dial *228 to connect to the network and program your phone with default settings.

Reset Settings

Return all settings to factory defaults. This setting does not erase user data such as pictures, videos, music, messages, contacts or downloaded applications stored on the phone.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone
 Settings → Security.
- Enter the Phone Only Lock Code at the prompt. The default lock code is the last four digits of your phone number, or you can set a custom lock code under Phone Settings → Security → Edit Codes.
- Use the Directional Key to highlight Reset Settings, then press the Center Select Key OK.
- At the prompt, highlight Yes to restore default settings, then press the Center Select Key OK. The phone powers off, then back on.

Global Data Roaming Access

Set preferences for data access when your phone is outside the home network area.

Important! Accessing data services while roaming may result in significant charges. Consult Verizon Wireless for more information.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone
 Settings → Global Data Roaming Access.
- 2. Use the Directional Key to highlight, then press the Center Select Key SET:
 - Allow Access for All Trips: Enable access to data networks at anytime, by any application.
 - Allow Access Only for This Trip: Enable access to data network currently available.
 - Deny Data Roaming Access: Block data usage while roaming.

System Select

Set system selections for roaming. For more information, refer to "Roaming" on page 15.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone
 Settings → System Select.
- 2. Use the Directional Key to highlight a setting, then press the Center Select Key SET:
 - Home Only: Your phone is only active in your home network's coverage area. When outside the coverage area, your phone will not roam, and call functions and other features will not be available.
 - Automatic: Your phone automatically acquires service based on default settings, using the Verizon Wireless network and the networks of roaming partners.

NAM Select

Set the primary NAM (Number Assignment Module).

Note: For more information about NAM selection, contact Verizon Wireless.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Phone
 Settings → NAM Select.
- 2. Use the Directional Key to highlight a selection, then press the Center Select Key OK:
 - NAM Select: Choose NAM1 or NAM2.

Customize settings related to placing and receiving calls.

Answer Options

Select a method for answering incoming calls.

- Use the Directional Key to highlight option(s), then press the Center Select Key MARK to mark them for selection, or press the Right Soft Key Mark All:
 - Slide Open: Answer incoming calls by sliding the phone open.
 This also triggers Speakerphone mode.
 - Any Key: When the phone is open, answer calls by pressing any key on the QWERTY keyboard.
 - Auto with Handsfree: When paired with a handsfree device, calls are answered automatically after a short delay.
- 3. Press Done to save your selections.

Auto Retry

Select settings for automatic redialing of unanswered calls after a set period of time.

 - TTY + Hear (HCO)
 - TTY Off

One Touch Dial

Enable or disable the speed dialing feature. For more information about using speed dials, see "Speed Dials" on page 52.

- From the Home screen, press the Center Select
 Key to select MENU → Settings & Tools → Call
 Settings → One Touch Dial.

Section 13: Health and Safety Information

This section outlines the safety precautions associated with using your phone. The terms "mobile device" or "cell phone" are used in this section to refer to your phone. Read this information before using your mobile device.

Exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) Signals

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has published information for consumers relating to Radio Frequency (RF) exposure from wireless phones. The FDA publication includes the following information:

Do cell phones pose a health hazard?

Many people are concerned that cell phone radiation will cause cancer or other serious health hazards. The weight of scientific evidence has not linked cell phones with any health problems.

Cell phones emit low levels of Radio Frequency (RF) energy. Over the past 15 years, scientists have conducted hundreds of studies looking at the biological effects of the radio frequency energy emitted by cell phones. While some researchers have reported biological changes associated with RF energy, these studies have failed to be replicated. The majority of studies published have failed to show an association between exposure to radio frequency from a cell phone and health problems.

The low levels of RF cell phones emit while in use are in the microwave frequency range. They also emit RF at substantially reduced time intervals when in the stand-by mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects.

The biological effects of radio frequency energy should not be confused with the effects from other types of electromagnetic energy.

Very high levels of electromagnetic energy, such as is found in X-rays and gamma rays, can ionize biological tissues. Ionization is a process where electrons are stripped away from their normal locations in atoms and molecules. It can permanently damage biological tissues including DNA, the genetic material.

The energy levels associated with radio frequency energy, including both radio waves and microwaves, are not great enough to cause ionization of atoms and molecules. Therefore, RF energy is a type of non-ionizing radiation. Other types of non-ionizing radiation include visible light, infrared radiation (heat), and other forms of electromagnetic radiation with relatively low frequencies.

While RF energy does not ionize particles, large amounts can increase body temperatures and cause tissue damage. Two areas of the body, the eyes and the testes, are particularly vulnerable to RF heating because there is relatively little blood flow in them to carry away excess heat.

Research Results to Date: Is there a connection between RF and certain health problems?

The results of most studies conducted to date say no. In addition, attempts to replicate and confirm the few studies that have shown a connection have failed.

The scientific community at large therefore believes that the weight of scientific evidence does not show an association between exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) from cell phones and adverse health outcomes. Still the scientific community has supported additional research to address gaps in knowledge. Some of these studies are described below.

Interphone Study

Interphone is a large international study designed to determine whether cell phones increase the risk of head and neck cancer. A report published in the International Journal of Epidemiology (June, 2010) compared cell phone usage for more than 5,000 people with brain tumors (glioma and meningioma) and a similar number of healthy controls.

Results of this study did NOT show that cell phones caused brain cancer. In this study, most people had no increased risk of brain cancer from using cell phones. For people with the heaviest use of cell phones (an average of more than $\frac{1}{2}$ hour per day, every day, for over 10 years) the study suggested a slight increase in brain cancer. However, the authors determined that biases and errors prevented any conclusions being drawn from this data. Additional information about Interphone can be found at

Interphone is the largest cell phone study to date, but it did not answer all questions about cell phone safety. Additional research is being conducted around the world, and the FDA continues to monitor developments in this field.

International Cohort Study on Mobile Phone Users (COSMOS)

The COSMOS study aims to conduct long-term health monitoring of a large group of people to determine if there are any health issues linked to long-term exposure to radio frequency energy from cell phone use. The COSMOS study will follow approximately 300,000 adult cell phone users in Europe for 20 to 30 years. Additional information about the COSMOS study can be found at

Risk of Brain Cancer from Exposure to Radio Frequency Fields in Childhood and Adolescence (MOBI-KIDS)

MOBI-KIDS is an international study investigating the relationship between exposure to radio frequency energy from communication technologies including cell phones and brain cancer in young people. This is an international multi-center study involving 14 European and non-European countries. Additional information about MOBI-KIDS can be found at

Surveillance, Epidemiology, and End Results (SEER) Program of the National Cancer Institute

The National Cancer Institute (NCI) actively follows cancer statistics in the United States to detect any change in rates of new cases for brain cancer. If cell phones play a role in risk for brain cancer, rates should go up, because heavy cell phone use has been common for quite some time in the U.S. Between 1987 and 2005, the overall age-adjusted incidence of brain cancer did not increase. Cell Phone Industry Actions

Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, the FDA has urged the cell phone industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- Support-needed research on possible biological effects of RF for the type of signal emitted by cell phones;
- Design cell phones in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user: and
- Cooperate in providing users of cell phones with the current information on cell phone use and human health concerns.

The FDA also is working with voluntary standard-setting bodies such as the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE), the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP), and others to assure that safety standards continue to adequately protect the public.

Reducing Exposure: Hands-Free Kits and Other Accessories

Steps to Reduce Exposure to Radio Frequency Energy

If there is a risk from being exposed to radio frequency energy (RF) from cell phones - and at this point we do not know that there is - it is probably very small. But, if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your RF exposure.

- Reduce the amount of time spent using your cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between your head and the cell phone.

Hands-Free Kits

Hands-free kits may include audio or Bluetooth[®] headsets and various types of body-worn accessories such as belt-clips and holsters. Combinations of these can be used to reduce RF energy absorption from cell phones.

Headsets can substantially reduce exposure because the phone is held away from the head in the user's hand or in approved body-worn accessories. Cell phones marketed in the U.S. are required to meet RF exposure compliance requirements when used against the head and against the body.

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that hands-free kits reduce risks. Hands-free kits can be used for convenience and comfort. They are also required by law in many states if you want to use your phone while driving.

Cell Phone Accessories that Claim to Shield the Head from RF Radiation

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that accessories which claim to shield the head from those emissions reduce risks. Some products that claim to shield the user from RF absorption use special phone cases, while others involve nothing more than a metallic accessory attached to the phone.

Studies have shown that these products generally do not work as advertised. Unlike "hands-free" kits, these so-called "shields" may interfere with proper operation of the phone. The phone may be forced to boost its power to compensate, leading to an increase in RF absorption.

Children and Cell Phones

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to any users of cell phones from RF exposure, including children and teenagers. The steps adults can take to reduce RF exposure apply to children and teenagers as well.

- · Reduce the amount of time spent on the cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between the head and the cell phone.

Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using cell phones at all. For example, The Stewart Report from the United Kingdom made such a recommendation in December 2000. In this report, a group of independent experts noted that no evidence exists that using a cell phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit cell phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) Certification Information

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the exposure limits for Radio Frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government.

These FCC RF exposure limits are derived from the recommendations of two expert organizations: the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement (NCRP) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE). In both cases, the recommendations were developed by scientific and engineering experts drawn from industry, government, and academia after extensive reviews of the scientific literature related to the biological effects of RF energy.

The RF exposure limit set by the FCC for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR is a measure of the rate of absorption of RF energy by the human body

expressed in units of watts per kilogram (W/kg). The FCC requires wireless phones to comply with a safety limit of 1.6 watts per kilogram (1.6 W/kg).

The FCC SAR limit incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection to the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

SAR tests are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum reported value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the phone. Before a new model phone is available for sale to the public. it must be tested and certified to the ECC that it does not exceed the SAR limit established by the FCC. Tests for each model phone are performed in positions and locations (e.g. at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC. For body-worn operation, this phone has been tested and meets

FCC RF exposure guidelines when used with an accessory that contains no metal and that positions the mobile device a minimum of 1.5 cm from the body.

Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines. The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this mobile phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. The maximum SAR values for this model phone as reported to the FCC are:

Head: 0.66 W/kg.

Body-worn: 0.80 W/kg.

To find information that pertains to a particular model phone, this site uses the phone FCC ID number which is usually printed somewhere on the case of the phone. Sometimes it may be necessary to remove the battery pack to find the number. Once you have the FCC ID number for a particular phone, follow the instructions on the website and it should provide values for typical or maximum SAR for a particular phone. Additional

Smart Practices While Driving On the Road - Off the Phone

The primary responsibility of every driver is the safe operation of his or her vehicle.

Responsible drivers understand that no secondary task should be performed while driving whether it be eating, drinking, talking to passengers, or talking on a mobile phone - unless the driver has assessed the driving conditions and is confident that the secondary task will not interfere with their primary responsibility. Do not engage in any activity while driving a moving vehicle which may cause you to take your eyes off the road or become so absorbed in the activity that your ability to concentrate on the act of driving becomes impaired. Samsung is committed to promoting responsible driving and giving drivers the tools they need to understand and address distractions.

Check the laws and regulations on the use of mobile devices and their accessories in the areas where you drive. Always obey them. The use of these devices may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas. For example, only hands-free use may be permitted in certain areas.

Before answering calls, consider your circumstances. Let the call go to voicemail when driving conditions require.

Remember, driving comes first, not the call!

If you consider a call necessary and appropriate, follow these tips:

Use a hands-free device;

- Secure your phone within easy reach;
- Place calls when you are not moving;
- Plan calls when your car will be stationary;
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations;
- Let the person with whom you are speaking know that you are driving and will suspend the call if necessary;
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving;

Notice regarding legal restrictions on mounting this device in an automobile:

Laws in some states may prohibit mounting this device on or near the windshield of an automobile. In other states, the law may permit mounting this device only in specific locations in the automobile. Be sure to consult the state and local laws or ordinances where you drive before mounting this device in an automobile. Battery Use and Safety

Important! Handle and store batteries properly to avoid injury or damage. Most battery issues arise from improper handling of batteries and, particularly, from the continued use of damaged batteries.

- Do not disassemble, crush, puncture, shred, or otherwise attempt to change the form of your battery. Do not put a high degree of pressure on the battery. This can cause leakage or an internal short-circuit, resulting in overheating.

WARRANTY DISCLAIMER: PROPER USE OF A TOUCH-SCREEN MOBILE DEVICE

If your mobile device has a touch-screen display, please note that a touch-screen responds best to a light touch from the pad of your finger or a non-metallic stylus. Using excessive force or a metallic object when pressing on the touch-screen may damage the tempered glass surface and void the warranty. For more information, please refer to the "Standard Limited Warranty".

GPS & AGPS

Certain Samsung mobile devices can use a Global Positioning System (GPS) signal for location-based applications. A GPS uses satellites controlled by the U.S. Government that are subject to changes implemented in accordance with the Department of Defense policy and the 2008 Federal Radio navigation Plan (FRP). Changes may affect the performance of location-based technology on your mobile device.

Certain Samsung mobile devices can also use an Assisted Global Positioning System (AGPS), which obtains information from the cellular network to improve GPS performance. AGPS uses your wireless service provider's network and therefore airtime, data charges, and/or additional charges may apply in accordance with your service plan. Contact your wireless service provider for details.

Your Location

Location-based information includes information that can be used to determine the approximate location of a mobile device. Mobile devices which are connected to a wireless network transmit location-based information. Additionally, if you use applications that require location-based information (e.g. driving directions), such applications transmit location-based information. The location-based information

may be shared with third-parties, including your wireless service provider, applications providers, Samsung, and other third-parties providing services.

Use of AGPS in Emergency Calls

When you make an emergency call, the cellular network may activate AGPS technology in your mobile device to tell the emergency responders your approximate location.

AGPS has limitations and **might not work in your area**. Therefore:

- Always tell the emergency responder your location to the best of your ability; and
- Remain on the mobile device for as long as the emergency responder instructs you.

Navigation

Maps, directions, and other navigation-data, including data relating to your current location, may contain inaccurate or incomplete data, and circumstances can and do change over time. In some areas, complete information may not be available. Therefore, you should always visually confirm that the navigational instructions are consistent with what you see before following them. All users should pay attention to road conditions, closures, traffic, and all other factors that may impact safe driving or walking. Always obey posted road signs.

Emergency Calls

This mobile device, like any wireless mobile device, operates using radio signals, wireless and landline networks, as well as user-programmed functions, which cannot guarantee connection in all conditions, areas, or circumstances.

Therefore, you should never rely solely on any wireless mobile device for essential communications (medical emergencies, for example). Before traveling in remote or underdeveloped areas, plan an alternate method of contacting emergency services personnel. Remember, to make or receive any calls, the mobile device must be switched on and in a service area with adequate signal strength.

Emergency calls may not be possible on all wireless mobile device networks or when certain network services and/or mobile device features are in use. Check with local service providers.

To make an emergency call:

- 1. If the mobile device is not on, switch it on.
- Key in the emergency number for your present location (for example, 911 or other official emergency number). Emergency numbers vary by location.
- 3. Press the Send Key.

If certain features are in use (call blocking, for example), you may first need to deactivate those features before you can make an emergency call. Consult your User Manual and your local cellular service provider. When making an emergency call, remember to give all the necessary information as accurately as possible. Remember that your mobile device may be the only means of communication at the scene of an accident; do not cut off the call until given permission to do so.

Care and Maintenance

Your mobile device is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you fulfill any warranty obligations and allow you to enjoy this product for many years:

Keep your Samsung Mobile Device away from:

Liquids of any kind

Keep the mobile device dry. Precipitation, humidity, and liquids contain minerals that will corrode electronic circuits. If the mobile device does get wet, do not accelerate drying with the use of an oven, microwave, or dryer, because this may damage the mobile device and could cause a fire or explosion.

Do not use the mobile device with a wet hand. Doing so may cause an electric shock to you or damage to the mobile device.

Extreme heat or cold

Avoid temperatures below 0°C / 32°F or above 45°C / 113°F .

Microwaves

Do not try to dry your mobile device in a microwave oven. Doing so may cause a fire or explosion.

Dust and dirt

Do not expose your mobile device to dust, dirt, or sand.

Cleaning solutions

Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or strong detergents to clean the mobile device. Wipe it with a soft

cloth slightly dampened in a mild soap-and-water solution.

Shock or vibration

Do not drop, knock, or shake the mobile device. Rough handling can break internal circuit boards.

Paint

Do not paint the mobile device. Paint can clog the device's moving parts or ventilation openings and prevent proper operation.

Responsible Listening

Caution! Avoid potential hearing loss.

Damage to hearing occurs when a person is exposed to loud sounds over time. The risk of hearing loss increases as sound is played louder and for longer durations. Prolonged exposure to loud sounds (including music) is the most common cause of preventable hearing loss. Some scientific research suggests that using portable audio devices, such as portable music players and cell phones, at high volume settings for long durations may lead to permanent noise-induced hearing loss.

This includes the use of headphones (including headsets, earbuds, and Bluetooth® or other wireless devices). Exposure to very loud sound has also been associated in some studies with tinnitus (a ringing in the ear), hypersensitivity to sound, and distorted hearing. Individual susceptibility to noise-induced hearing loss and potential hearing problem varies. Additionally, the amount of sound produced by a portable audio device varies depending on the nature of the sound, the device settings, and the headphones that are used. As a result, there is no single volume setting that is appropriate for everyone or for every combination of sound, settings, and equipment.

You should follow some common sense recommendations when using any portable audio device:

- Always turn the volume down before plugging the earphones into an audio source.
- Set the volume in a quiet environment and select the lowest volume at which you can hear adequately.
- Be aware that you can adapt to higher volume settings over time, not realizing that the higher volume may be harmful to your hearing.

- When using headphones, turn the volume down if you cannot hear the people speaking near you or if the person sitting next to you can hear what you are listening to.
- Do not turn the volume up to block out noisy surroundings. If you
 choose to listen to your portable device in a noisy environment,
 use noise-cancelling headphones to block out background
 environmental noise. By blocking background environment noise,
 noise cancelling headphones should allow you to hear the music
 at lower volumes than when using earbuds.
- Limit the amount of time you listen. As the volume increases, less time is required before you hearing could be affected.
- Avoid using headphones after exposure to extremely loud noises, such as rock concerts, that might cause temporary hearing loss.
 Temporary hearing loss might cause unsafe volumes to sound normal.
- Do not listen at any volume that causes you discomfort. If you
 experience ringing in your ears, hear muffled speech, or
 experience any temporary hearing difficulty after listening to your
 portable audio device, discontinue use and consult your doctor.

Operating Environment

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area, and always switch your mobile device off whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger. When connecting the mobile device or any accessory to another device, read its user's guide for detailed safety instructions. Do not connect incompatible products.

Using Your Mobile Device Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from Radio Frequency (RF) signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless mobile device. Consult the manufacturer to discuss alternatives

Implantable Medical Devices

A minimum separation of six (6) inches should be maintained between a handheld wireless mobile device and an implantable medical device, such as a pacemaker or implantable cardioverter defibrillator, to avoid potential interference with the device.

Persons who have such devices:

- Should ALWAYS keep the mobile device more than six (6) inches from their implantable medical device when the mobile device is turned ON:
- Should not carry the mobile device in a breast pocket;
- Should use the ear opposite the implantable medical device to minimize the potential for interference;
- Should turn the mobile device OFF immediately if there is any reason to suspect that interference is taking place;

 Should read and follow the directions from the manufacturer of your implantable medical device. If you have any questions about using your wireless mobile device with an implantable medical device, consult your health care provider.

Other Medical Devices

If you use any other personal medical devices, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy. Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information. Switch your mobile device off in health care facilities when any regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so. Hospitals or health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

Vehicles

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or its representative regarding your vehicle before using your mobile device in a motor vehicle. You should also consult the manufacturer of any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Posted Facilities

Switch your mobile device off in any facility where posted notices require you to do so.

Potentially Explosive Environments

Switch your mobile device off when in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere and obey all signs and instructions. Sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death. Users are advised to switch the mobile device off while at a refueling point (service station).

Users are reminded of the need to observe restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots (fuel storage and distribution areas), chemical plants, or where blasting operations are in progress. Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include below deck on boats, chemical transfer or storage facilities, vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane), areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders, and any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine.

When your Device is Wet

Do not turn on your device if it is wet. If your device is already on, turn it off and remove the battery immediately (if the device will not turn off or you cannot remove the battery, leave it as-is). Then, dry the device with a towel and take it to a service center.

FCC Hearing Aid Compatibility (HAC) Regulations for Wireless Devices

The U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has established requirements for digital wireless mobile devices to be compatible with hearing aids and other assistive hearing devices.

When individuals employing some assistive hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implants) use wireless mobile devices, they may detect a buzzing, humming, or whining noise. Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise, and mobile devices also vary in the amount of interference they generate.

The wireless telephone industry has developed a rating system for wireless mobile devices to assist hearing device users find mobile devices that may be compatible with their

hearing devices. Not all mobile devices have been rated.

Mobile devices that are rated have the rating on their box or a label located on the box.

The ratings are not guarantees. Results will vary depending on the user's hearing device and hearing loss. If your hearing device happens to be vulnerable to interference, you may not be able to use a rated mobile device successfully. Trying out the mobile device with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

M-Ratings: Wireless mobile devices rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than mobile devices that are not labeled. M4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. M-ratings refer to enabling acoustic coupling with hearing aids that do not operate in telecoil mode.

T-Ratings: Mobile devices rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than mobile devices that are not labeled. T4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. T-ratings refer to enabling inductive coupling with hearing aids operating in telecoil mode.

Hearing devices may also be rated. Your hearing aid manufacturer or hearing health professional may help you find this rating. Higher ratings mean that the hearing device is relatively immune to interference noise.

Under the current industry standard, American National Standards Institute (ANSI) C63.19, the hearing aid and wireless mobile device rating values are added together to indicate how usable they are together. For example, if a hearing aid meets the M2 level rating and the wireless mobile device meets the M3 level rating, the sum of the two values equals M5.

Under the standard, this should provide the hearing aid user with normal use while using the hearing aid with the particular wireless mobile device. A sum of 6 or more would indicate excellent performance.

However, these are not guarantees that all users will be satisfied. T ratings work similarly.



The HAC rating and measurement procedure are described in the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) C63.19 standard.

Restricting Children's Access to Your Mobile Device

Your mobile device is not a toy. Do not allow children to play with it because they could hurt themselves and others, damage the mobile device, or make calls that increase your mobile device bill.

Keep the mobile device and all its parts and accessories out of the reach of small children.

FCC Notice and Cautions

The mobile device may cause TV or radio interference if used in close proximity to receiving equipment. The FCC can require you to stop using the mobile device if such interference cannot be eliminated. Vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane) must comply with the National Fire Protection Standard (NFPA-58). For a copy of this standard, contact the National Fire Protection

Cautions

Any changes or modifications to your mobile device not expressly approved in this document could void your warranty for this equipment and void your authority to operate this equipment. Only use approved batteries, antennas, and chargers. The use of any unauthorized accessories may be dangerous and void the mobile device warranty if said accessories cause damage or a defect to the mobile device.

Although your mobile device is quite sturdy, it is a complex piece of equipment and can be broken. Avoid dropping, hitting, bending, or sitting on it.

Other Important Safety Information

- Only qualified personnel should service the mobile device or install the mobile device in a vehicle. Faulty installation or service may be dangerous and may invalidate any warranty applicable to the device.
- Ensure that any mobile devices or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted.
- Check regularly that all wireless mobile device equipment in your vehicle is mounted and operating properly.
- When using a headset in dry environments, static electricity can build up in the headset and cause a small quick static electrical shock. To minimize the risk of electrostatic discharge from the headset avoid using the headset in extremely dry environments or touch a grounded unpainted metal object to discharge static electricity before inserting the headset.
- Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the mobile device, its parts, or accessories.

- For vehicles equipped with an air bag, remember that an air bag inflates with great force. Do not place objects, including installed or portable wireless equipment near or in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If wireless equipment is improperly installed and the air bag inflates, serious injury could result.
- Switch your mobile device off before boarding an aircraft. The use
 of wireless mobile devices in aircraft is illegal and may be
 dangerous to the aircraft's operation. Check with appropriate
 authorities before using any function of a mobile device while on
 an aircraft.
- Failure to observe these instructions may lead to the suspension or denial of cell phone services to the offender, or legal action, or both.
- While using your device, leave some lights on in the room and do not hold the screen too close to your eyes.
- Seizures or blackouts can occur when you are exposed to flashing lights while watching videos or playing games for extended periods. If you feel any discomfort, stop using the device immediately.

- Reduce risk of repetitive motion injuries. When you repetitively perform actions, such as pressing keys, drawing characters on a touch screen with your fingers, or playing games, you may experience occasional discomfort in your hands, neck, shoulders, or other parts of your body. When using your device for extended periods, hold the device with a relaxed grip, press the keys lightly, and take frequent breaks. If you continue to have discomfort during or after such use, stop use and see a physician.
- If your device has a camera flash or light, do not use the flash or light close to the eyes of people or pets. [122011]

Standard Limited Warranty

What is covered and for how long?

SAMSUNG TELECOMMUNICATIONS AMERICA, LLC ("SAMSUNG") warrants that SAMSUNG's handsets and accessories ("Products") are free from defects in material and workmanship under normal use and service for the period commencing upon the date of purchase by the first consumer purchaser and continuing for the following specified period of time after that date:

Batteries 1 Year

Case/Pouch/Holster 90 Days

Other Phone Accessories 1 Year

What is not covered?

This Limited Warranty is conditioned upon proper use of the Product.

This Limited Warranty does not cover: (a) defects or damage resulting from accident, misuse, abnormal use, abnormal conditions, improper storage, exposure to liquid, moisture, dampness, sand or dirt, neglect, or unusual physical. electrical or electromechanical stress; (b) scratches, dents and cosmetic damage, unless caused by SAMSUNG; (c) defects or damage resulting from excessive force or use of a metallic object when pressing on a touch screen; (d) equipment that has the serial number or the enhancement data code removed, defaced, damaged, altered or made illegible; (e) ordinary wear and tear; (f) defects or damage resulting from the use of Product in conjunction or connection with accessories, products, or ancillary/peripheral equipment not furnished or approved by SAMSUNG; (g) defects or damage resulting from improper testing, operation, maintenance, installation, service, or adjustment not furnished or approved by SAMSUNG; (h) defects or damage resulting from external causes such as collision with an object, fire, flooding, dirt, windstorm. lightning, earthquake, exposure to weather conditions, theft, blown fuse, or improper use of any electrical source; (i) defects or damage resulting from cellular signal reception

or transmission, or viruses or other software problems introduced into the Product; or (j) Product used or purchased outside the United States. This Limited Warranty covers batteries only if battery capacity falls below 80% of rated capacity or the battery leaks, and this Limited Warranty does not cover any battery if (i) the battery has been charged by a battery charger not specified or approved by SAMSUNG for charging the battery; (ii) any of the seals on the battery are broken or show evidence of tampering; or (iii) the battery has been used in equipment other than the SAMSUNG phone for which it is specified.

What are SAMSUNG's obligations?

During the applicable warranty period, provided the Product is returned in accordance with the terms of this Limited Warranty, SAMSUNG will repair or replace the Product, at SAMSUNG's sole option, without charge. SAMSUNG may, at SAMSUNG's sole option, use rebuilt, reconditioned, or new parts or components when repairing any Product, or may replace the Product with a rebuilt, reconditioned or new Product.

Repaired/replaced cases, pouches and holsters will be warranted for a period of ninety (90) days. All other repaired/replaced Products will be warranted for a period equal to the

remainder of the original Limited Warranty on the original Product or for ninety (90) days, whichever is longer. All replaced Products, parts, components, boards and equipment shall become the property of SAMSUNG. Except to any extent expressly allowed by applicable law, transfer or assignment of this Limited Warranty is prohibited.

What must you do to obtain warranty service?

To obtain service under this Limited Warranty, you must return the Product to an authorized phone service facility in an adequate container for shipping, accompanied by the sales receipt or comparable proof of sale showing the original date of purchase, the serial number of the Product and the seller's name and address.

To obtain assistance on where to deliver the Product, please call SAMSUNG Customer Care at 1-888-987-4357. If SAMSUNG determines that any Product is not covered by this Limited Warranty, you must pay all parts, shipping, and labor charges for the repair or return of such Product.

You should keep a separate backup copy of any contents of the Product before delivering the Product to SAMSUNG for warranty service, as some or all of the contents may be deleted or reformatted during the course of warranty service.

What are the limits on SAMSUNG's liability?

THIS LIMITED WARRANTY SETS OUT THE FULL EXTENT OF SAMSUNG'S RESPONSIBILITIES, AND THE EXCLUSIVE REMEDY REGARDING THE PRODUCTS.

ALL IMPLIED WARRANTIES, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION. IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, ARE LIMITED TO THE DURATION OF THIS LIMITED WARRANTY. IN NO EVENT SHALL SAMSUNG BE LIABLE FOR DAMAGES IN EXCESS OF THE PURCHASE PRICE OF THE PRODUCT OR FOR. WITHOUT LIMITATION, COMMERCIAL LOSS OF ANY SORT; LOSS OF USE, TIME, DATA, REPUTATION, OPPORTUNITY, GOODWILL. PROFITS OR SAVINGS: INCONVENIENCE: INCIDENTAL. SPECIAL, CONSEQUENTIAL OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES; OR DAMAGES ARISING FROM THE USE OR INABILITY TO USE THE PRODUCT, SOME STATES AND JURISDICTIONS DO NOT ALLOW LIMITATIONS ON HOW LONG AN IMPLIED WARRANTY LASTS. 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What is the procedure for resolving disputes?

ALL DISPUTES WITH SAMSUNG ARISING IN ANY WAY FROM THIS LIMITED WARRANTY OR THE SALE, CONDITION OR PERFORMANCE OF THE PRODUCTS SHALL BE RESOLVED EXCLUSIVELY THROUGH FINAL AND BINDING ARBITRATION, AND NOT BY A COURT OR JURY.

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For any arbitration in which your total damage claims, exclusive of attorney fees and expert witness fees, are \$5,000.00 or less ("Small Claim"), the arbitrator may, if you prevail, award your reasonable attorney fees, expert witness fees and costs as part of any award, but may not grant SAMSUNG its attorney fees, expert witness fees or costs unless it is determined that the claim was brought in bad faith. In a Small Claim case, you shall be required to pay no more than half of the total administrative, facility and arbitrator fees, or \$50.00 of such fees, whichever is less, and SAMSUNG shall pay the remainder of such fees. Administrative, facility and arbitrator fees for arbitrations in which your total damage claims, exclusive of attorney fees and expert witness fees, exceed \$5,000.00 ("Large Claim") shall be determined according to AAA rules. In a Large Claim case, the arbitrator may grant to the prevailing party, or apportion among the parties, reasonable attorney fees, expert witness fees and costs. Judgment may be entered on the arbitrator's award in any court of competent jurisdiction.

This arbitration provision also applies to claims against SAMSUNG's employees, representatives and affiliates if any such claim arises from the Product's sale, condition or performance. You may opt out of this dispute resolution procedure by providing notice to SAMSUNG no later than 30 calendar days from the date of the first consumer purchaser's purchase of the Product. Alternatively, you may opt out by calling 1-888-987-4357 no later than 30 calendar days from the date of the first consumer purchaser's purchase of the Product and providing the same information. These are the only two forms of notice that will be effective to opt out of this dispute resolution procedure. Opting out of this dispute resolution procedure will not affect the coverage of the Limited Warranty in any way, and you will continue to enjoy the benefits of the Limited Warranty.

Severability

If any portion of this Limited Warranty is held to be illegal or unenforceable, such partial illegality or unenforceability shall not affect the enforceability of the remainder of the Limited Warranty.

Precautions for Transfer and Disposal

If data stored on this device is deleted or reformatted using the standard methods, the data only appears to be removed on a superficial level, and it may be possible for someone to retrieve and reuse the data by means of special software.
