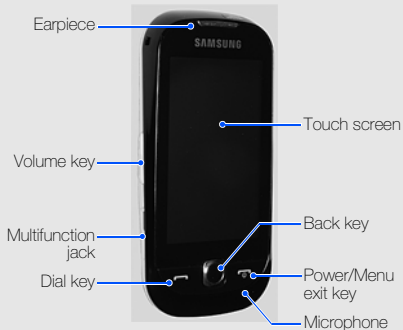

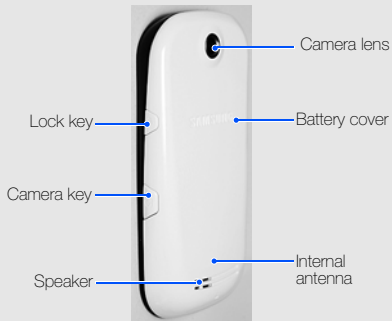

Phone layout

The front of your phone includes the following keys and features:



The rear of your phone includes the following keys and features:





You can lock the touch screen and keys to prevent unwanted phone operations. To lock, press the lock key. To unlock, press and hold the lock key, or touch and hold the lock icon on the screen. You can also unlock the phone and open a specific function by drawing characters (see the Smart unlock guide on the screen).

Keys

Dial	Make or answer a call; In Idle mode, retrieve recently dialed, missed, or received numbers
Back	In Menu mode, return to the previous level
Power/ Menu exit	Turn the phone on and off (press and hold); End a call; In Menu mode, cancel input and return to Idle mode










assembling and preparing your phone

Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

Install the SIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

To install the SIM card and battery,

1. Remove the battery cover.



If the phone is on, press and hold [⏻] to turn it off.

2. Insert the SIM card.



- Place the SIM card in the phone with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.
- Without inserting a SIM card, you can use your phone's non-network services and some menus.

3. Insert the battery.



4. Replace the battery cover.




Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

1. Open the cover to the multifunction jack.
2. Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.



Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.

3. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
4. When the battery is fully charged (the  icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
5. Unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
6. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.



About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

Insert a memory card (optional)

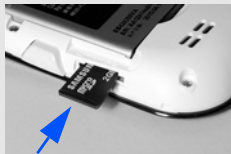
To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards up to 16 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).



Formatting the memory card on a PC may cause incompatibility with your phone. Format the memory card only on the phone.

1. Remove the battery cover.

2. Insert a memory card with the label side facing up.



3. Push the memory card in the memory card slot until it locks in place.
4. Replace the battery cover.

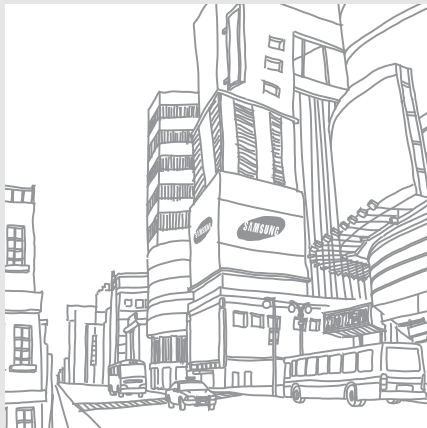
To remove the memory card, push it gently until it disengages from the phone, and then pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.

Attach a hand strap (optional)

1. Remove the battery cover.
2. Slide a hand strap through the slot and hook it over the small projection.



3. Replace the battery cover.



using basic functions

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

1. Press and hold [].
2. Enter your PIN and select **Confirm** (if necessary).

To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

Switch to airplane mode

By switching to airplane mode, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as airplanes and hospitals.

To switch to the airplane mode, in Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Phone settings**. Under Airplane mode, select **On**.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

Use the touch screen

Your phone's touch screen lets you easily select items or perform functions. Learn basic actions to use the touch screen.

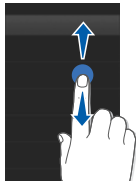


For the optimal use of the touch screen, remove the screen protection film before using your phone.

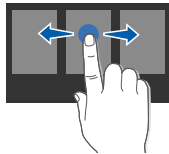
- Touch an icon to open a menu or launch an application.



- Drag your finger up or down to scroll through vertical lists.




- Drag your finger left or right to scroll through horizontal lists.



Access menus

To access your phone's menus



1. In Idle mode, select **Menu** to access Menu mode.
2. Scroll left or right through the menu screens.
3. Select a menu or option.
4. Press the Back key to move up one level; Press [] to return to Idle mode.

Customize Menu mode

You can organize applications in the Menu mode screen or set titles for each screen to match your preferences and needs.



This feature may be unavailable depending on the phone software.

1. In Menu mode, scroll left or right to a Menu mode screen.
2. Select  to switch to Edit mode.
3. Customize the screens as desired.
 - To rename the menu screen, enter a title in the text input field at the top of the screen.
 - To rearrange applications, select and drag application icons to the locations you want.
4. Select **Save**.
 Select **Reset** to restore the default order of applications.

Use widgets

Learn to use widgets on the toolbar.



- Some of your widgets connect to web services. Selecting a web-based widget may incur additional charges.
- Available widgets may vary depending on your region or service provider.

Open the widget toolbar

In Idle mode, select the arrow at the upper left of the screen to open the widget toolbar. You can rearrange widgets on the widget toolbar or move them to the idle screen.

Scroll through the widget toolbar

The widget toolbar contains more widgets than can be displayed on screen at one time.

- Use your finger to scroll the toolbar up and down.

- Flick the screen in an upward or downward motion to quickly scroll through the list.

Move the widgets to the idle screen

1. In Idle mode, scroll left or right to one of the idle screens.
2. Open the widget toolbar.
3. Drag a widget from the widget toolbar to the idle screen. You can position the widget anywhere on the screen.



To move a widget from the idle screen back to the widget toolbar, select the widget and drag it to the widget toolbar.

Activate a widget

Locate the widget you want to use (in the toolbar or on the main screen). Touch the icon to activate the mini-application.



Some widgets only operate when moved to the idle screen.

Change the widgets

1. Open the widget toolbar.
2. Select  from the widget toolbar.
3. Select the widgets you want to include in the widget toolbar and select **Save**.

Customize your phone

Get more from your phone by customizing it to match your preferences.

Adjust the vibration intensity on the touch screen

You can adjust the intensity of the vibration when you tap the phone screen.

1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Phone settings** → **Vibration feedback**.
2. Drag the slider left or right to adjust the intensity of the vibration.
3. Select **Save**.

Switch to or from the vibration profile

In Idle mode, select **Keypad** and touch and hold **#** to silence or un silence your phone.

Calibrate the screen

You can calibrate the screen to maximize touch accuracy.

1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Phone settings** → **Calibration**.
2. Touch each target on the screen.
3. Select **Yes**.

Change your ringtone

1. In Menu mode, select **Media** → **Audio** → **Ringtones**.
2. Select a ringtone from the list and select **Set as** → **Ringtone**.



If you are using the silent profile, you cannot change the ringtone.

Activate Etiquette pause

You can temporarily mute the ringtone of an incoming call by placing the phone face down when **Etiquette Pause** is activated.

1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Motion settings** → **Etiquette pause** → **On**.
2. Select **Save**.

Select a wallpaper

1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Display settings** → **Wallpaper**.
2. Touch the current wallpaper image to view a list of available images.
3. Select an image.
4. Select **Set**.

Select a text font

1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Display settings** → **Font type**.
2. Select a font.
3. Select **Save**.

Lock your phone

1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Phone settings** → **Security**.
2. Under **Lock Phone**, Select **On**.
3. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and select **Confirm**.
4. Enter the new password again and select **Confirm**.



- The first time you access a menu that requires a password, you will be prompted to create and confirm a password.
- Samsung is not responsible for any loss of private information or other damages caused by loss of passwords.

Unlock the touch screen with smart unlock

By drawing a specified character on the locked touch screen, you can unlock the screen only, or unlock and immediately access Contacts, Messaging, Browser, Voice mail, or other functions. To set a smart unlock character,

1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Smart unlock**.
2. Select a character.
3. Select an application to launch.
4. Select **Save** → **Save**.

Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer calls and use basic call functions.



During a call, your phone automatically locks the touch screen to prevent accidental inputs. To unlock, press and hold [Hold].

Make a call

1. In Idle mode, select **Keypad** and enter an area code and a phone number.
2. Press [] to dial the number.
3. To end the call, press [].

Answer a call

1. When a call comes in, press [].
2. To end the call, press [].

Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume key up or down.

Use the speakerphone feature

1. During a call, select **Speaker** to activate the speaker.
2. To switch back to the earpiece, select **Speaker** again.



In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing the calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better performance, use the normal phone mode.

Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the multifunction jack, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press and hold the headset button, and then press again and hold.
- To answer a call, press the headset button.
- To end a call, press and hold the headset button.

Send and view messages

Learn to send or view text (SMS), multimedia (MMS), or email messages.

Send a text or multimedia message

1. In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **Create New Message**.
2. Select **Tap to add text**.
3. Enter your message text and select **Done**.

4. To attach multimedia, select **Image**, **Sound**, **Video** or **Other Icon** and add an item.
5. Select **Send To**, enter or select a recipient number and select **Send** to send the message.

Send an email

1. In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **MobileMail**.
2. Select an email service and follow the onscreen instructions to create and send email.

Enter text

When entering text, you can change the input mode:

- To change case or switch to T9, Number or Symbol mode, select **Abc** at the bottom centre of the screen. Depending on your region, you may be able to access an input mode for your specific language.
- To switch to Symbol mode, select **SYM**.

Enter text in one of the following modes:

Mode	Function
ABC	Select an appropriate virtual key until the character you want appears on the display.
T9	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Select the appropriate virtual keys to enter an entire word. 2. When the word displays correctly, select Space to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, select ▼ and an alternate word from the list that appears.
Numeric	Select an appropriate virtual key to enter a number.
Symbols	Select an appropriate virtual key to enter a symbol.
Emoticons	Select an appropriate virtual key to enter an emoticon.



To display QWERTY keypad, rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.

View text or multimedia messages

1. In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **Inbox**.
2. Select a text or multimedia message.

View an email

1. In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **MobileMail**.
2. Select an email service and follow the onscreen instructions to view email.


Add and find contacts

Learn the basics of using the contacts feature.



The memory location to save new contacts may be preset depending on your service provider. To change the memory location, in Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Application Settings** → **Contacts** → **View and Save to** → **Save new contacts to** and select a memory location.

Add a new contact



1. In Idle mode, select **Keypad** and enter a phone number.
2. Select  → **New**.
3. Select type of phone number (if necessary).
4. Enter contact information.
5. Select **Save** to add the contact to memory.

Find a contact

1. In Menu mode, select **Contacts**.
2. Scroll through the contact list or select **Tap to Search** and begin entering the name you want to find.
3. When the contact's name appears, select it from the search list.






Once you have found a contact, you can:

- call the contact by selecting .
- send a message by selecting .
- edit the contact information by selecting the contact name and then **Edit**

Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos.

Capture photos

1. In Idle mode, press [] to turn on the camera.
2. Rotate the phone counter-clockwise to landscape view.
3. If the phone is in camcorder mode, touch the Camera icon to switch to camera mode.
4. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
 - To select a time delay, select .
 - To set the brightness, select .
 - To zoom in or out, press the Volume key.



If the camera icons do not appear on the screen, touch the screen to make them reappear.


5. Press [] to take a photo.

The photo is saved automatically.




After capturing photos, select  to view photos.

View photos

In Menu mode, select **Pictures** (or **Media** → **Pictures**) → a photo file.

- To zoom in or out, touch and hold the screen. When  appears, scroll up or down. To exit the zoom screen, press the Back key.
- Select **More** → **Slide Show** to view photos as a sideshow.

Capture videos

1. In Idle mode, press [.
- To set the exposure value, select .
- To zoom in or out, press the Volume key.
5. Press [ or press the Camera key to stop recording.
The video is saved automatically.

After capturing videos, select  to view videos.

View videos

In Menu mode, select **Media** → **Videos** → a video file.

- Select  to change the view mode.

Listen to music













Start by transferring files to your phone or memory card:

- Download from the wireless web. ► p. 28
- Download from a PC using the optional Samsung PC Studio. ► p. 40
- Receive via Bluetooth. ► p. 42
- Copy to your memory card. ► p. 40

After transferring music files to your phone or memory card,

1. In Menu mode, select **Music player**.
2. Select a music category → a music file.

3. Control playback using the following icons:

	Pause playback
	Play or resume playback
	Skip backward; Scan backward in a file (touch and hold)
	Skip forward; Scan forward in a file (touch and hold)
	Activate the Shuffle mode ( : on,  : off)
NORM ¹	Change the sound effect
	Access to Music Library
	Change the repeat mode ( : off,  : repeat one,  : repeat all)

1. These icons are shown when you tap the player screen.

Browse the web




Browse web pages

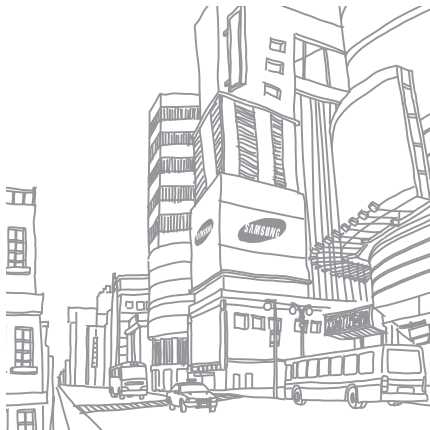
- In Menu mode, select **Internet** to launch the browser and open your service provider's homepage.
- Navigate web pages using the following icons:

Icon	Function
	Zoom in or out. Touch and hold until the icon appears, then drag upward or downward on the screen.
	Move to previous page
	Stop loading the web page
	Refresh the current web page

Icon	Function
	Change the view mode
	Open a list of saved bookmarks
	Access a list of browser options

Bookmark your favourite web pages

1. In Menu mode, select **Internet** →  → **Add**.
2. Enter a web address (URL) and a page title.
3. Select **Save**.



using advanced functions

Learn how to perform advanced operations and use additional features of your mobile phone.

Use advanced call functions

Learn about your phone's additional calling capabilities.




View and dial missed calls

Your phone will display calls you have missed on the display.

When you have one missed call, select **Call** from the event alert widget to call the number.

When you have two missed calls or more, select **View** from the event alert widget and select the call.

Call a recently dialed number




1. In Idle mode, press [] to display a list of recent numbers (or in Menu mode, select **Recent Logs**).
2. Select the number you want and select  or press [] to dial.

Hold a call or retrieve a held call

Select **Hold** to place a call on hold, **Retrieve** to retrieve a held call.


Dial a second call

If your network supports this function, you can dial another number during a call:


1. Select **Hold** to place the first call on hold.
2. Select **New Call**, enter the second number to dial and press [].
3. Select **Swap** to switch between the two calls.
4. To end the call on hold, select **On hold** and press [].
5. To end the current call, press [].

Answer a second call


If your network supports this function, you can answer a second incoming call:

1. Press [] to answer the second call.
The first call is automatically placed on hold.
2. Select **Swap** to switch between the calls.

Make a multiparty call (conference call)


1. Call the first party you want to add to the multiparty call.
2. While connected to the first party, call the second party.
The first party is automatically placed on hold.
3. When connected to the second party, select **Join**.
4. Repeat steps 2 and 3 to add more parties (if necessary).
5. To end the multiparty call, press [].

Call an international number

1. In Idle mode, select **Keypad** and touch and hold **0** to insert the **+** character.
2. Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code, and phone number), and then press [] to dial.

Call a contact from the contact list

You can call numbers directly from the contact list using stored contacts. ► p. 25

1. In Menu mode, select **Contacts**.
2. Select the contact you want.
3. Touch  next to the number you want to dial or select the contact to see additional contact information, such as alternate phone numbers.

Use advanced contact functions

Learn to create your namecard, set favourite numbers, and create groups of contacts.

Set speed dial numbers

You can call numbers assigned to speed dial by touching and holding the assigned number in the dialing screen. To set speed dial numbers

1. In Menu mode, select **Contacts**.
2. Select the **Contacts** drop-down menu and select **Speed dial**.
3. Select the number location.
4. Select a contact.
The contact is saved to the speed dial number.

Create a group of contacts

By creating groups of contacts, you can assign group names, ringtones, caller ID photos, and vibration type to each group or send messages or emails to an entire group. To create a group:

1. In Menu mode, select **Contacts**.
2. Select the drop-down menu and select **Groups**.
3. Select **Create group**.
4. Set a group name, picture, and ringtone.
5. Select **Save**.

You can now add contacts to the group.

Use advanced messaging functions

Learn to create and use templates to create new messages, and create message folders.

Create a text template

1. In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **Templates** → **Text templates**.
2. Select **Create** to open a new template window.
3. Select **Tap to add text**.
4. Enter your text and select **Done**.
5. Select **Save**.


Create a picture message template

1. In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **Templates** → **Picture Message templates**.
2. Select **Create** to open a new template window.
3. Create a multimedia message, with a subject and desired attachments, to use as your template. ► p. 23
4. Select **Save**.

Insert text templates in new messages

1. To start a new message, in Menu mode, select **Messages** → **Create New Message**.
2. Touch **etc** icon → **Text template** → a template.

Create a message from a template

1. In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **Templates** → **Text Templates** or **Picture Message Templates**.
2. Select  next to the template you want. Your template opens as a new message.

Create a folder to manage messages

1. In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **Folders**.
2. Select **Create folder**.
3. Enter a new folder name and select **Done**.

Move messages from a message folder to your folders to manage them as your preferences.

Voice Recognition

Nuance Voice Recognition software can be used to voice activate a wide variety of functions on your phone, including dialing and searching. No pre-recording or training is required. Speak a contact name to dial, and use your voice to look up contacts, launch applications and navigate phone menus.

1. In Menu mode, select **Voice Recognition**.
2. After the audio prompt (beep or voice command "Say a Command"), speak a command. A list of possible voice commands is briefly displayed.

Voice Commands

The following voice commands are available:

1. **Call <Name or #>**: Dials the spoken number or the number associated with the spoken name in your contact list. If multiple numbers exist (i.e., home, work, mobile), say the name and the number type.
2. **Send Text <Name or #>**: displays the Create Text Message screen and enters the recipient's phone number.
3. **Lookup <Name>**: Locates and displays contact information for the name stored in the Contacts list.
4. **Go To <Menu>**: Opens a phone application. For a complete list of applications, select **Go To** from the Voice Command menu. Application must be activated.
5. **Check <Item>**: Reports the status of various phone items. For a complete list of applications, select **Check** from the Voice Command menu.

Voice Recognition Tips

- Speak clearly when giving a command. There is no need to speak slowly or with added emphasis.
- You must end your current Voice Commands call before you can make another call using Voice Commands. To make a three-way call, only the first call can be made using Voice Commands.
- In very noise environments, it may be helpful to use a headset or a Bluetooth headset.

Settings

Select **<Settings>** to see a list of settings and information for voice command software.


- **Confirmation**: sets whether the system asks for confirmation of what is said
- **Adaptation**: trains the software to respond to your voice


- **Audio Modes:** sets the level of audio guidance to Expert Mode (beep only) or Prompt Mode (voice prompts for required information).
- **Speakerphone:** sets speakerphone to Automatic, Always On, or Always Off.
- **About:** displays the software version.

Use advanced camera functions




Learn how to capture photos in various modes and customise camera settings.

Capture photos in Single mode




1. In Idle mode, press [] to turn on the camera.
2. Rotate the phone counter-clockwise to landscape view.
3. If the phone is in camcorder mode, touch the Camera icon to switch to camera mode.

4. Select [] → **Single**.
5. Make any necessary adjustments.
6. Press the Camera key to take a photo.


Capture photos in Smile shot mode




1. In Idle mode, press [] to turn on the camera.
2. Rotate the phone counter-clockwise to landscape view.
3. If the phone is in camcorder mode, touch the Camera icon to switch to camera mode.
4. Select [] → **Smile shot**.
5. Make any necessary adjustments.
6. Press [].
7. Aim the camera lens at your subject.
Your phone recognizes people in an image and detects their smiles. When the subject smiles, the phone automatically takes a photo.

Capture a series of photos


1. In Idle mode, press [] to turn on the camera.
2. Rotate the phone counter-clockwise to landscape view.
3. If the phone is in camcorder mode, touch the Camera icon to switch to camera mode.
4. Select [] → **Continuous**.
5. Make any necessary adjustments.
6. Press and hold [] until the number of photos you want have been taken.
The photos are saved automatically.



Capture panoramic photos

1. In Idle mode, press [] to turn on the camera.
2. Rotate the phone counter-clockwise to landscape view.

3. If the phone is in camcorder mode, touch the Camera icon to switch to camera mode.
4. Select [] → **Panorama**.
5. Make any necessary adjustments.
6. Press [] to take the first photo.
7. Slowly move the phone to the direction you want. When you align the small white frame with , the phone captures the next photo automatically.
8. Repeat step 6 to complete the panoramic photo.

Capture a photo mosaic


1. In Idle mode, press [] to turn on the camera.
2. Rotate the phone counter-clockwise to landscape view.
3. If the phone is in camcorder mode, touch the Camera icon to switch to camera mode.

4. Select  → **Mosaic**.
5. Select an image layout.
6. Make any necessary adjustments.
7. Press [] to take a photo for each segment.

Capture photos with decorative frames

1. In Idle mode, press [] to turn on the camera.
2. Rotate the phone counter-clockwise to landscape view.
3. If the phone is in camcorder mode, touch the Camera icon to switch to camera mode.
4. Select  → **Frame**.
5. Select a frame.
6. Make any necessary adjustments.
7. Press [] to take a photo with the frame.

Use camera options



This Limited Warranty does not cover: (a) defects or damage resulting from accident, misuse, abuse, neglect, unusual physical, electrical or electromechanical stress, or modification of any part of Product, including antenna, or cosmetic damage; (b) equipment that has the serial number removed or made illegible; (c) any plastic surfaces or other externally exposed parts that are scratched or damaged due to normal use; (d) malfunctions resulting from the use of Product in conjunction with accessories, products, or ancillary/peripheral equipment not furnished or approved by SAMSUNG; (e) defects or damage from improper testing, operation, maintenance, installation, or adjustment; (f) installation, maintenance, and service of Product, or (g) Product used or purchased outside the United States or Canada.
